the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park yesterday, Empire Maker (Unbridled) swept past Trust N Luck (Montbrook) and powered away to a 9 3/4-length triumph. "He broke right there and he could have gone after [Trust N Luck] any time,"

trainer Bobby Frankel said. "He ran off the chart today. If he runs like this in the [Kentucky] Derby, he could win it." Frankel, who has yet to win a Triple Crown race, was second with Aptitude in the 2000 Kentucky Derby and fourth last year with Medaglia d'Oro. for the GII San Felipe S. at Santa
Anita, the GIII Tampa Bay Derby and
the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. The
San Felipe has drawn a strong field
headed by GII Santa Catalina S. winner
Domestic Dispute (Unbridled's Song)
and \$900,000 FTFFEB juvenile
Atswhatimtalknabout (A.P. Indy), but
the competition is not the only concern. After heavy rains yesterday,
there is the strong possibly of a wet
track. Atswhatimtalknabout makes his
stakes debut off a Santa Anita allow-

ance win Feb. 20. What does he have to do to continue down the Kentucky Derby trail? "He doesn't have to win," trainer Ron Ellis said. "And now we have to throw into the equation that we have mud, so we'll just have to see how that goes." Indeed, if the track is not to his liking, Ellis may scratch. "If the track is a hard, sealed race track, we would probably just train up to the Santa Anita Derby," he said. But Man Among Men (Gentlemen {Arg}) will run no matter the state of the surface. "The weather won't affect his participation because if he skips this, then where do you run?" trainer Gary Mandella said, adding, "I think he'd run well over [an off] track, but I'm guessing." The chestnut, a stakes winner on turf at two, made his 2003

debut in the Feb. 7 Sham S. and came away with a one-length win over Empire Maker. Gimmeawink (Elusive Quality), who took the Feb. 8 Miracle Wood S. at Laurel in his two-turn debut, and Cherokee's Boy (Citidancer), who romped in the Mar. 1 Deputed Testamony S. last time, loom boldly in the Gotham, while two new to the

stakes game, the promising duo of **Aristocat** (Tale of the Cat) and **Region of Merit** (Touch Gold), will be ones to watch in Tampa. Both captured allowance routes at Gulfstream in their latest outings. (More, p5-6)

Florida Derby cont. Blinkers On...

Third in the GII Remsen S. in his final start at two, Empire Maker (Unbridled) was 2-5 in his sophomore debut, the Feb. 7 Sham S. at Santa Anita. He showed little interest in the proceedings early, closing late to be second. Adding blinkers yesterday, the dark bay shadowed a solid pace, took command under his own steam and drew clear. "[Trust N Luck] didn't seem guite as sharp as he had been today, but I was sitting on high octane myself," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "In his earlier races without blinkers, [Empire Maker] was a little hesitant. Bobby [Frankel] had a feeling blinkers would help and they did." How will the colt handle, say, an extra eighth of a mile? "As far as I can tell, he can go as far as he wants," Bailey said. As for what's next, Frankel said, "I have to think about it. I was thinking the [Apr. 12 GI Wood Memorial], but now I'm going to have to analyze it. I might train him up to the Derby."

Looking For Excuses...

Even-money **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook) set a quick pace and just held off **Indy Dancer** (A.P. Indy) to be second. "We were in a bad spot, down inside," jockey Cornelio Velasquez said. "We had pressure on us the whole way. But this is a good horse and I know he'll be back." Indy Dancer, 16 lengths behind the next-to-last horse after the opening half, just missed the place. "What we need is a hot pace and a mile and a quarter," trainer Todd Pletcher said. **Formal Attire** (Formal Gold), who finished sixth, apparently had a breathing problem during the race. "I suspect that he displaced his palate," trainer Phil Serpe said. "We are going to get the vet to take a look and see how we can help him."

Race Marred by Spill...

The Florida Derby was not without incident, as **Midway Cat** (Sir Cat) broke down at the top of stretch and fell. The colt, third in the GI Fountain Of Youth S. last time out, suffered a "catastrophic" injury to his right front leg and had to be euthanized. Jockey Jorge Chavez complained of back pain and was taken to Hollywood Regional Hospital for X-rays.

In a big day for owner/breeder Woodlands Stud, Lonhro added a fourth Group 1 victory to his record in dominating the biggest race run at his home track on Sydney's western outskirts. He returned to a roar from a crowd that has embraced him with the same fervor that was once reserved for his sire. Sent out the heavy favorite, the distinctive black runner settled midfield early, then outfinished evergreen Shogun Lodge for the victory. Earlier in the day, his bay full brother Niello (Aus) swept into Golden Slipper contention with a win in the G3 Kindergarten S. Owner Jack Ingham said he and brother Bob, who bred the pair, last celebrated a Chipping Norton win in 1997 when Octagonal collected the trophy. Crown Lodge foreman Peter Snowden said only Niello's color distinguished him from his older brother. "The neck, the shoulders, the hindquarters, the way he walks, the mannerisms, the temperament," he said. "[Niello] has got a lot in common with [Lonhro]." Options for Lonhro include a clash with Northerly (Aus) in the G1 Ranvet S. at Rosehill in a fortnight or the G1 Doncaster at Randwick Apr. 19.

A solid handicap horse in England, Champion Lodge made his American debut in an optional claimer at Santa Anita Jan. 15 and came away with a gallant neck victory at a mile. The bay stepped into U.S. stakes company last time and launched a mild late bid to finish fifth in the 10-furlong San Marino H. Feb. 20. Stretching out an additional quarter mile this time, he settled midpack as Special Matter cut out the running the first time around, drove between horses as they raced past the three-eighths pole and galloped away to an impressive score. "Last time I told [trainer Sandy Shulman] that I thought I rode a bad race and that I could have kept him a little closer to the pace," jockey Alex Solis said. "He got a little quiet back there and didn't have anything left at the finish for me. I learned from that race, so this time I kept him in the race and he was very game to the wire." Added Shulman, "Alex rode him perfect this time. If everything is OK, we'll come back in the [GI San Juan Capistrano H., Apr. 20 at Santa Anita]." GII Del Mar H. winner Delta Form (Marscay {Aus}), the 2-1 favorite in his first start since December, stalked the pace early and faded late to be sixth. Jockey Mike Smith blamed the weather that turned the course soft for the lackluster effort. "He was good going into the race, but then came the rain and that added to the fitness thing a little bit," Smith said. "He got pretty tired...but he'll come back and run big next time." Bien Nicole, who raced exclusively on the turf last year, streaked through five consecutive victories, starting with an optional-claiming score at Lone Star Park July 5 and ending with a three-length tally in the Estrapade H. at Arlington Park Oct. 25. The chestnut ended her 2002 campaign with a third-place finish in the Nov. 23 GIII Cardinal H. at Churchill Downs. Looking to start her 2003 season on a winning note, the five-year-old switched to the main track and was sent off an 8-1 outsider. She pressed the pace while racing wide, came with her bid on the final bend and outfinished the forward Red n'Gold. "We were curious to try her again on the dirt, because we had switched to the grass early in her career," trainer Donnie Von Hemel said. "We knew she was certainly capable of running with these fillies, so today we asked her the question and she answered it." Odds-on Mandy's Gold, a Gulfstream allowance winner last time out, set the pace, but took a funny step as they hit the far turn and weakened late to be third. "She wasn't herself mentally today," jockey Rene Douglas said. "She propped a couple of times in the post parade and seemed to shy away from some shadows. Physically she did everything within herself, but she reacted to another shadow going into the final turn and it kind of slowed down her speed. It was like she was mad about something." Midas Eyes had not been out since posting a frontrunning eight-length maiden victory at Calder Aug. 17, but showed no signs of rustiness after the seven-month layoff. Purchased privately after that performance, the bay was making his first start for trainer Bobby Frankel. He sat second through the opening quarter, grabbed the lead after a half in :44.33 and roared away to an eye-catching victory, giving Frankel the Gulfstream graded-stakes double. "I knew he was fit enough because he trained so well at Hollywood," the Hall of Fame horseman said. "I worked him with Empire Maker and he did fine. I thought he would run well first time out and I didn't want to waste it in an allowance race, so I brought him to Gulfstream." The result was never in doubt for the crowd, but jockey Jerry Bailey had an anxious moment or two. "I was telling Bobby that I felt a little silly at the wire," Bailey said. "I kept thinking I was hearing someone right behind me so I kept driving and then I looked around at the wire and I was 10 lengths in front." Posse, a 6 3/4-length allowance winner at Fair Grounds Feb. 10, was tucked behind horses as Midas Eyes sprinted away from the field at the top of the lane. He finished well to be easily second best once clear, but the winner had the jump on him. GISW Whywhywhy, the 7-5 favorite after running fifth in the Feb. 15 GI Fountain Of Youth S. in his first start of the year, chased the pace and weakened late to be third. Like fine wine, Affirmed Success continues to improve with age and added to his legacy with a successful defense of his championship in the GIII Toboggan H. The nine-year-old followed his victory in the 2002 renewal with a one-length score in the GI Carter H. last April, but was fourth in the GI Met Mile and a distant second to Left Bank in the GII Tom Fool H. before being put away for the year. The bay made a successful seasonal bow with a one-length allowance score over the inner Jan. 10 and was being pointed for the GII General George H. Feb. 17 until Old Man Winter unleashed a furious winter score, forcing a change in plans. The gelding instead showed up in a Feb. 26 allowance, a race in which he finished a controversial third after being shut off in deep stretch by Captain Red, who eventually won the race. The clear favorite in the wagering here, Affirmed Success showed good speed to stalk fast early fractions of :21.92 and :44.22. Set down for the drive, he dug in gamely, struck the front inside the final furlong and inched clear. "We've had great horses in the past, but this is a special animal," said winning trainer Richard Schosberg. "I told [jockey] Richie [Migliore] to take back, stalk the pace and if you can run them down, fine. If not, well do it at seven-eighths." The winner will get that opportunity when he attempts to win the Carter for a second consecutive year on the Wood Memorial undercard Apr. 12. The dark bay cruised to a 5 1/4-length score in a Gulfstream allowance test at this distance Jan. 31 and gets meet leader Pat Valenzuela in the irons for his first West Coast appearance.

JEAN-LUC LAGARDERE DIES Tributes have flowed following the announcement that Jean-Luc Lagardere, president of France-Galop, passed away on Friday evening at Hopital Lariboisiere in Paris. He was 75. Lagardere contracted a viral infection that caused septicaemia after a routine hip operation. "I am completely devastated, it is a great personal sadness," said Louis Romanet, general manager of France-Galop. "I talked to Mr. Lagardere only last week after he returned home from his hip operation. He said he was feeling well and we talked about the work ahead for the next four years. Jean-Luc Lagardere was a man of heart, passion and action. He was always the first person to lift your spirits up--when I lost my brother a few years ago, his compassion was a tremendous help. He was a man of great strength and he was a great sportsman. What he has accomplished for French racing is unbelievable. Mr. Lagardere was a visionary." Former champion jockey Freddy Head added, "I am very moved, I knew him for over 30 years and really appreciated the person he was. I wore his silks so many times and I was the partner of his champion Linamix. This is a great loss for the French racing community. He had enormous power, even though racing and breeding were just a small part of his many activities." Lagardere's racing manager, Roland de Longevialle, remarked, "I'm completely devastated. He was a great man, an exceptional friend and someone you will never replace." Such was the power and influence held by Monsieur Lagardere that his family have received condolences and tributes from all over France, with even French President Jacques Chirac saluting the exceptional, enterprising man.
