## HSC Minimum Standard

From 2020, students in NSW need to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the Higher School Certificate.

## About the HSC minimum standard

To demonstrate the HSC minimum standard students, need to achieve level 3 or 4 in short online reading, writing and numeracy tests of skills for everyday life.

Students will have a number of opportunities to meet the HSC minimum standard. This includes four opportunities each year from Year 10 up to five years after starting their first HSC course. At least 30 calendar days is required before re-attempting a test in the same domain. Students have to meet the HSC minimum standard in reading, writing and numeracy only once.

- an adaptive, multiple choice reading test
- an adaptive, multiple choice numeracy test
- a test for writing based on a written or visual prompt
$\bullet$
The online tests will be administered by schools under supervision, using a lockdown browser. The tests can be taken on any school day during 17 February to 30 November in 2020.

Students do not need to meet the HSC minimum standard to:

- study HSC courses
- sit HSC exams
- receive HSC assessment and exam results
- receive an ATAR
- receive a Record of School Achievement

Only students who meet the HSC minimum standard will receive a Higher School Certificate testamur.

HSC minimum standard reports are available in Scout. The reports can be accessed from the HSC App. The HSC minimum standard reports support schools in monitoring the progress of their students in meeting the HSC minimum standard and complement the results available to schools via NESA Schools Online.

Students will continue to receive their results via NESA Students Online.

## Who needs to sit the HSC minimum standard tests?

- $\quad$ Students completing the HSC in $\mathbf{2 0 2 0}$ will need to achieve level 3 or $\mathbf{4}$ in the minimum standard online test for any domain they did not score a Band 8 or higher in NAPLAN 2017.
- $\quad$ Students completing the HSC from 2021 will need to sit each of the HSC minimum standard online tests.
