

Focused on agriculture and food and healthcare, underpinned by bioscience and medical research and enabled by engineering and physical sciences



Infrastructure Systems

Optimising transport and energy systems and integrating them with other systems such as health and digital



Manufacturing and Materials

Advancing manufacturing readiness so R&D and technology developments increase productivity and capture value in the UK






The Knowledge Transfer Network Stimulating dialogue/accelerating innovation

- 25% conduct R&D








Integrated Public / Private Funding Strategy – Health Focus


Most accessible Schemes are SME Instrument and EUROSTARS

- TRL important look to EUROSTARS first
- Product in market + 3 years max
- Aimed at research intensive SME needs one other EU SME



- SME Instrument: above TRL 6
- Single SME can apply
- 2 –stages (more relevant for future funding pipe-line than now)
- EEN key support role
