

Hawke's Bay Trails was born out of the vision to create a seaside pathway for Napier. Over 10 years later, it boasts 200km of cycle trails.

eandering around and between the twin cities of Napier and Hastings, Hawke's Bay Trails is mostly flat, a river and coastal network of pathways stretching over the Heretaunga Plains.

There are three distinct cycling experiences: the Landscapes Ride, the Water Ride and the Wineries Ride. The Landscapes Ride explores the picturesque coastal communities of

Haumoana, Te Awanga and Clifton, which border the coastline of the iconic Cape Kidnappers. The Cape is home to the world's largest mainland gannet colony and one of the world's top 50 golf courses. Riders will also enjoy views of the impressive Te Mata Peak and the expansive ocean.

The Water Ride is flat, easy and perfect for families. It provides panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean and includes the Ahuriri Estuary, a sanctuary for endangered wetland wildlife.

Trails

The Wineries Ride is a relaxed ride that covers the wine-growing areas of Bridge Pa, Gimblett Gravels and the Ngatarawa Triangle. The trail is dotted with numerous award-winning wineries that afford plenty of places to stop and rest along the way.

The Hawke's Bay Trails are mostly flat Grade 1-3 (Easiest - Intermediate) trails.

Art Deco Architecture

Landscapes Ride, 56km

The Landscapes Ride explores the picturesque coastal communities of Haumoana, Te Awanga and Clifton, which border the coastline of the iconic Cape Kidnappers. The Cape is home to the

world's largest mainland gannet colony and one of the world's top 50 golf courses.

There is a coastal ride that starts from behind the Napier i-SITE as part of the Water Ride and heads south towards Cape Kidnappers connecting to the coastal section of the Landscape Ride.



RIDING THE TRAIL

It begins as a wide concrete path, and later becomes a smooth limesand path with some sections of public road. The path ends at Clifton, 24km from Napier.

The other popular section of the Landscapes Ride does a loop of the Tukituki Valley from Black Bridge to Red Bridge and back. Black Bridge is on the coastal section described above, which crosses the Tukituki River. This flat offroad trail overlooks vineyards on one side and the Tukituki River on the other. Enjoy changing scenery and views of the impressive Te Mata Peak.

This trail provides year-round cycling and will suit most cycling skill levels. Don't miss the expansive ocean views, world-class wineries and beautiful countryside.

Water Ride, 96km

The Water Ride is flat, easy and perfect for families. Napier's Bay View and Westshore are great places to start riding, continuing on to the seaside village of Ahuriri with its bustling cafés, shops and bars before cycling

along picturesque Marine Parade with panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean.

Extend the ride to include the Taradale loop to experience the renowned Church Road and Mission Estate wineries. Alternatively, head to the Ahuriri Estuary, a sanctuary for endangered wetland wildlife, or to the quaint Puketapu settlement with its charming hotel, restaurant, general store and church.

Don't miss learning about local history, endangered wildlife, world-class wineries and the bustling seaside precinct of Ahuriri.

Wineries Ride, 48km

The Wineries Ride is a relaxed ride that covers the wine-growing areas of Bridge Pa, Gimblett Gravels and the Ngatarawa Triangle. The terrain is flat and dotted with numerous awardwinning wineries that afford plenty of places to stop and rest along the way. This mostly off-road ride also goes through the historic tree-lined Oak Ave in Hastings and along the banks of the Ngaruroro River.

ALONGSIDE THE TRAIL

There's plenty to explore from fine cuisine and captivating architecture to an accessible gannet colony.

Napier's art deco influence will shatter any perception that this is just another destination; after all, this is the largest concentration of art deco architecture in the southern hemisphere. You will be captivated by magnificent buildings from every direction and a drive up to the charming Marine Parade, where art deco meets the turquoise-coloured sea, is a particular feast for the eyes. A guided tour is a good idea. Marine Parade is also where the impressive

National Aquarium of New Zealand

is located. The Nelson city centre buzz is infectious with many cafés and restaurants, as well as a raft of attractions from museums and minigolf to parks, gardens and commanding views from Bluff Hill. The artistic community can be explored with the local art guide map, which takes you from city galleries to home studios. Napier Prison tours provide a look into the region's criminal past.





ALONGSIDE THE TRAIL

The Hawke's Bay is a leading food and wine region with captivating architecture and prime lookouts.

The chic Havelock North village is packed with charm and loaded with appealing eateries, bars and boutique shops. The arty Pipi Café (housed in a pink building) is one of the standouts and has earned an enviable reputation for both its pizza and the ambience. The growers' market



at Black Barn Vinevard on Saturday morning is worth a visit, as is the Arataki Honey Visitor Centre

For an essential photo stop, head to the top of Te Mata Peak, five minutes' drive from Havelock North's centre. This famous peak is found in Te Mata Park, a popular park visited by over 200,000 people every year. The rewards from the 399m high summit are many; full-circle views of the region include Hawke Bay, the rugged ranges and Cape Kidnappers. Snow-capped Mt Ruapehu can also be seen on a clear day. Best visited at sunrise or sunset, Te Mata Peak is rich in Maori history; take time to study up before making the journey.

Please Note: be careful when driving up and down Te Mata Peak as there are no guardrails and the road narrows as you near the top.

Waipukurau has an interesting past and was formerly a Maori pa site; stockade Hill in Hunter Park holds the remains of the fortifications. There are plenty of activities to entertain the whole family. Visit the art gallery - it displays and sells an outstanding collection of works by local and well-known New Zealand artists. Have a game of golf at Waipukurau's 18-hole golf course, or go fishing for trout in the local river.

HASTINGS

Hastings, like neighbouring Napier, suffered damage in the 1931 earthquake. While it didn't sustain quite the devastation inflicted on its twin city, Hastings was forced to undergo some reconstruction and it opted to rebuild predominantly in Spanish missionstyle architecture. This resulted in a pretty city with gorgeous buildings and a special character.

The architecture can be observed best by taking a walk around the city to check out the art deco and stripped classical buildings. Take a look at the city's street art – sculptural delights from talented local artists. Family entertainment comes in the form of the water theme park, Splash Planet, and the Hawke's Bay Farmyard Zoo.

With restricted public access, the best way to maximise the experience is to book a tour. Aside from the gannets, other bird life and marine life add to the appeal.




