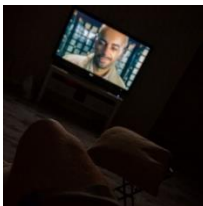

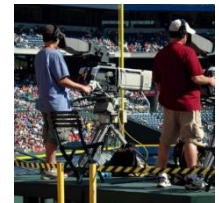

pop modern music that is popular, especially with young people, and usually consists of simple tunes with a strong beat

jazz an improvised music that has a strong beat and parts for performers to play alone

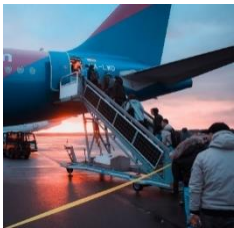


1. Check-in counters are open two hours before the schedule flight **departure** time.

2. Passengers are required to produce appropriate **identification** at the check-in counter.



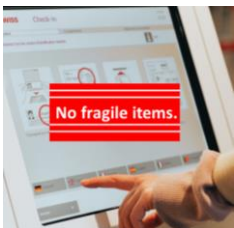
3. Passengers are advised to be at the **boarding** gate at least thirty minutes before the scheduled departure time of their flight.

5. Passengers are strongly **advised** not to check in valuable or fragile items as baggage.



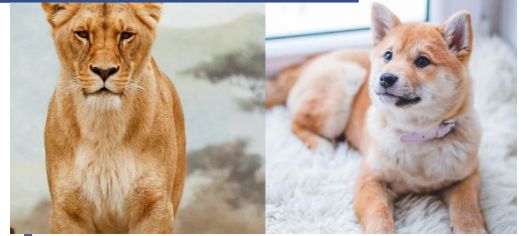
- departure** an act of leaving a place, especially at the start of a journey

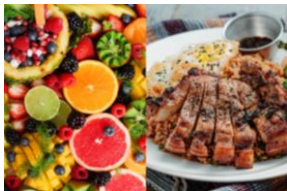
