Repayment

- **£9,000** – for all Honours degree courses
- Tuition fees paid by Department of Health for NHS courses
- Apply for NHS Student Support to pay tuition fees even if you are not eligible for NHS Student bursary



Study



NHS Grant – fixed £1,000 award

- Non-means tested – award made irrespective of family/household income level

NHS Bursary – up to £4,395 on the basis of a 45 week academic year

- Means tested – family/household income taken into account
- Online calculator to see how much you'll be eligible for

Paid monthly into your bank account, maximum grant and bursary = approx. £450 p/month

Non-Repayable

- Travel claims and placement accommodation (based on individual circumstances)
- BU assistance with travel from outlying areas (locality hospitals) to Bournemouth House for study blocks
- Uniforms are provided

Additional finance:

- *Parents Learning Allowance* - means tested, up to £1,180 p/ annum
- *Childcare Grant* - means tested, maximum award of £126.65 per week for one child or £187.85 per week for two or more children
- *Dependents Allowance* – means tested, up to £2,400, subsequent child £539

- Student Maintenance Loan for 2015/16 is £2,324. It is non-means tested so family/household income will not be taken into account
- Loans are paid termly to help with day to day costs – typically accommodation, travel, domestic bills etc. They have to be repaid
- Lower maintenance loan levels are offered to students living in the parental home whilst in study
- Students who have previously had loan and fee support from Student Finance England will need to check their eligibility for finance support at Postgraduate diploma level.

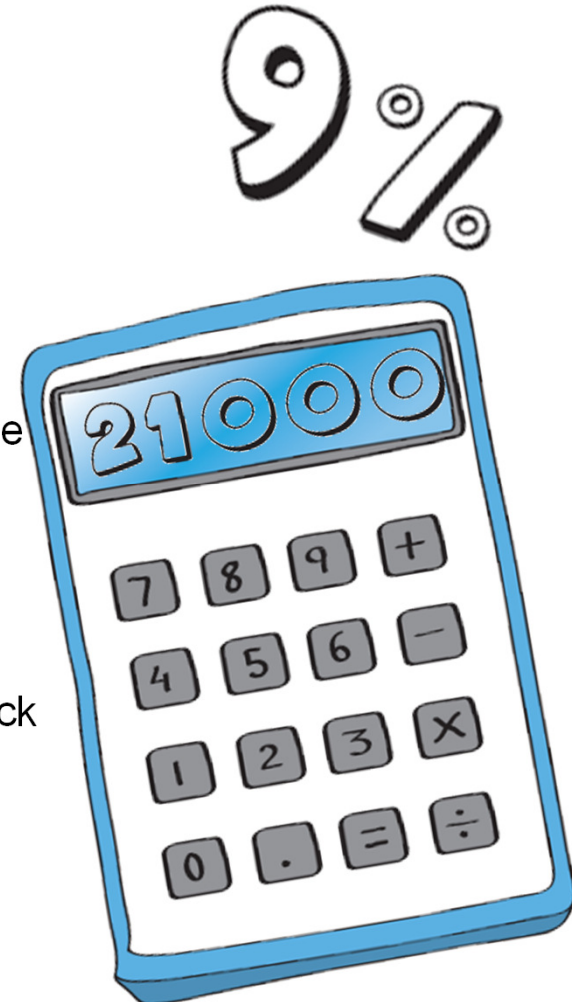

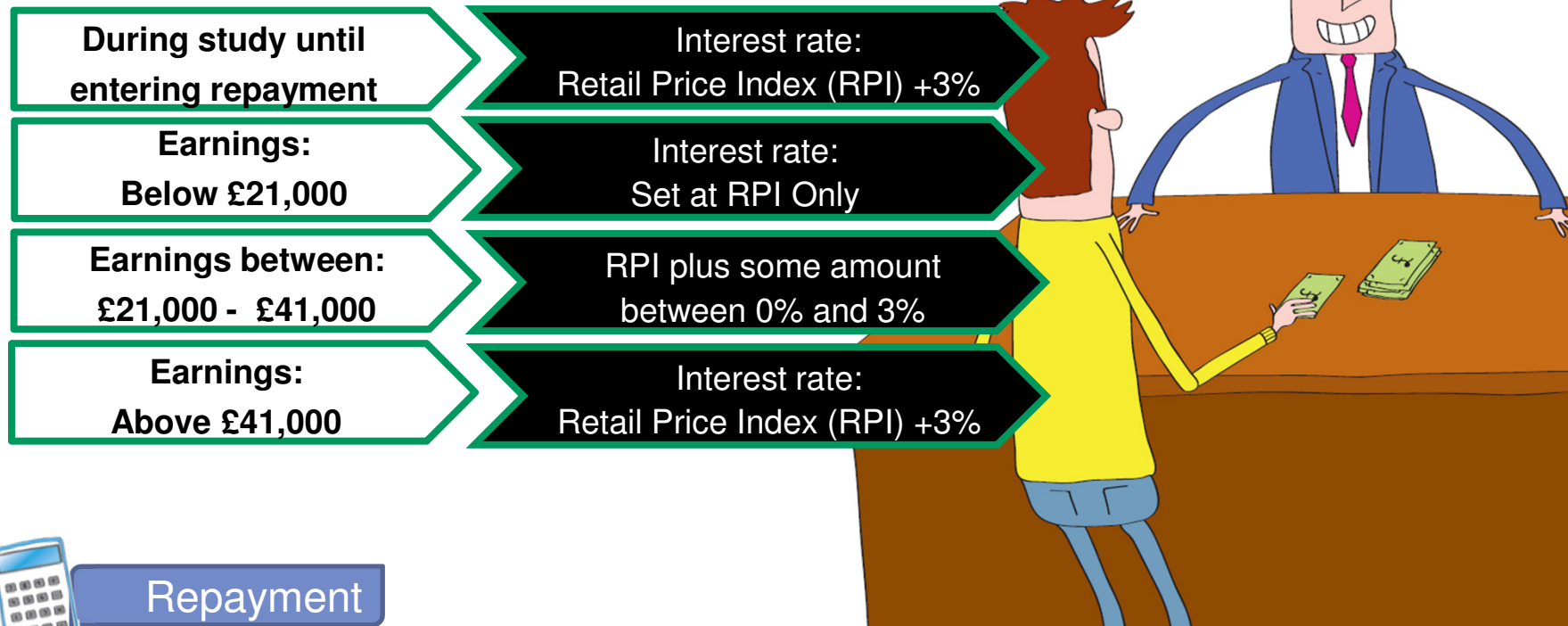
- Apply through Student Finance England - deadline usually around end of May.
- **Apply early** to avoid delays in payment, you can update the university information at a later date. You **do not** need to have a guaranteed place to apply for support.
- You will only need to provide National Insurance numbers and Passport numbers for income assessments, there is often no need to send further documents.

- Loan repayments will start only when you have finished your studies and earning £21,000 or over. They are calculated at 9% of the income over £21,000
- You will commence repayment in the April following graduation or leaving the course.
- Repayments are taken directly from your wages using the NI number
- Any outstanding loans will be written off after 30 years
- For example: if you are earning £25,000, you will pay back £7.50 a week (£30 a month or £360 a year)



- Student Loans accrue interest from the moment you take them out, **but the amount you repay remains the same** – 9% of your income over £21,000.

Options for HSC Students

- If you're going to study **Nursing, Midwifery** or **Operating Department Practice** we recommend that you obtain accommodation near your placement locality
 - Travelling to your study base will only be required on weekdays when it's easier to get there, however the requirements of shift patterns and community-based placements can be during the evening and at weekends
 - Your offer letter will normally state your placement locality
- Some financial and travel support for NHS students is available for both journeys to campus, and journeys to your placement locality.

Hospital-based accommodation (Nursing Midwifery, ODP): Staff residences adjacent to the major hospital central to your location. Our admissions team advise the hospitals of the confirmed students that will be placed in their locality but you will still need to make an application.

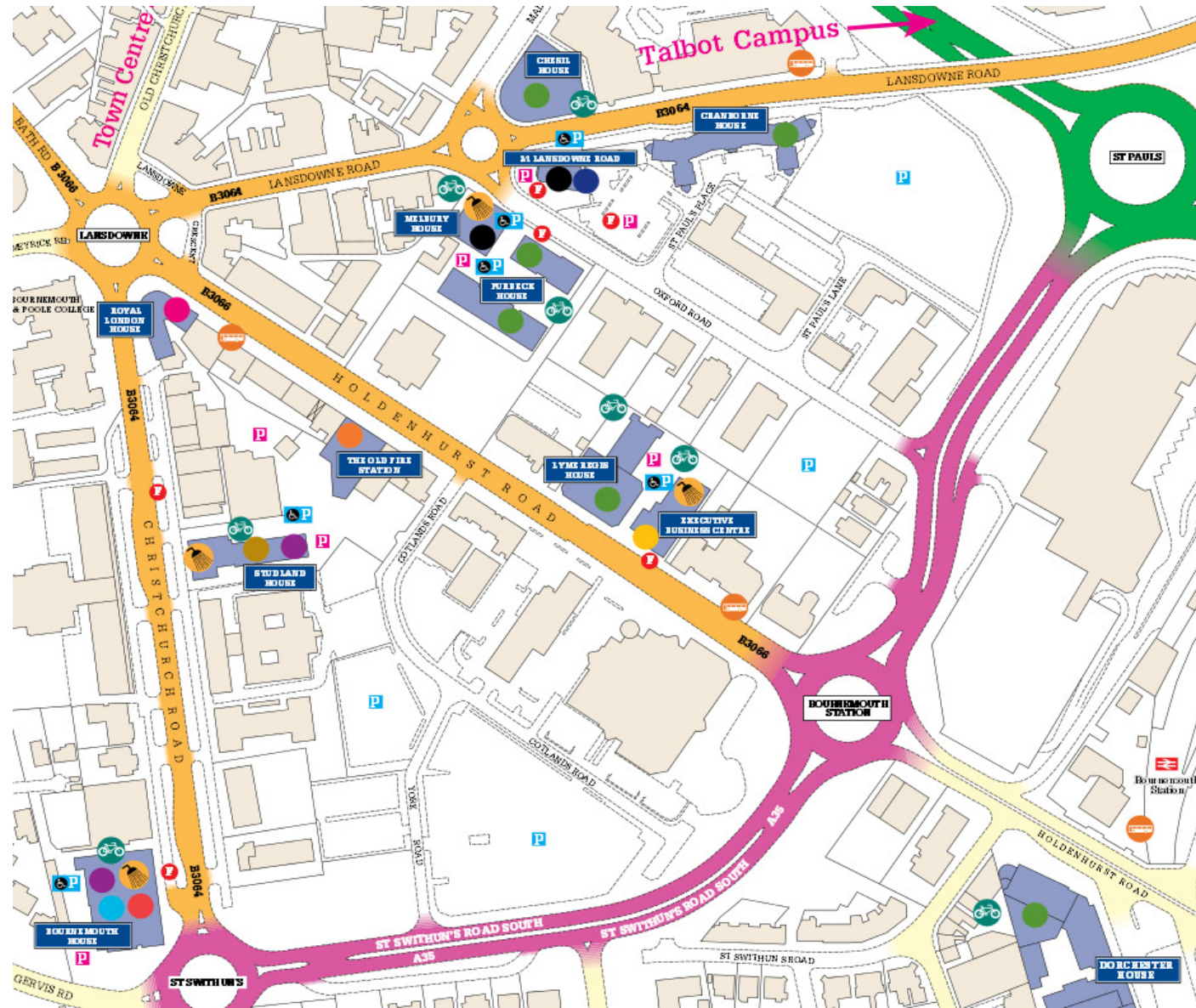


BU accommodation: Option for those based in Bournemouth or Poole (50 week options available to HSC students & Postgraduates)

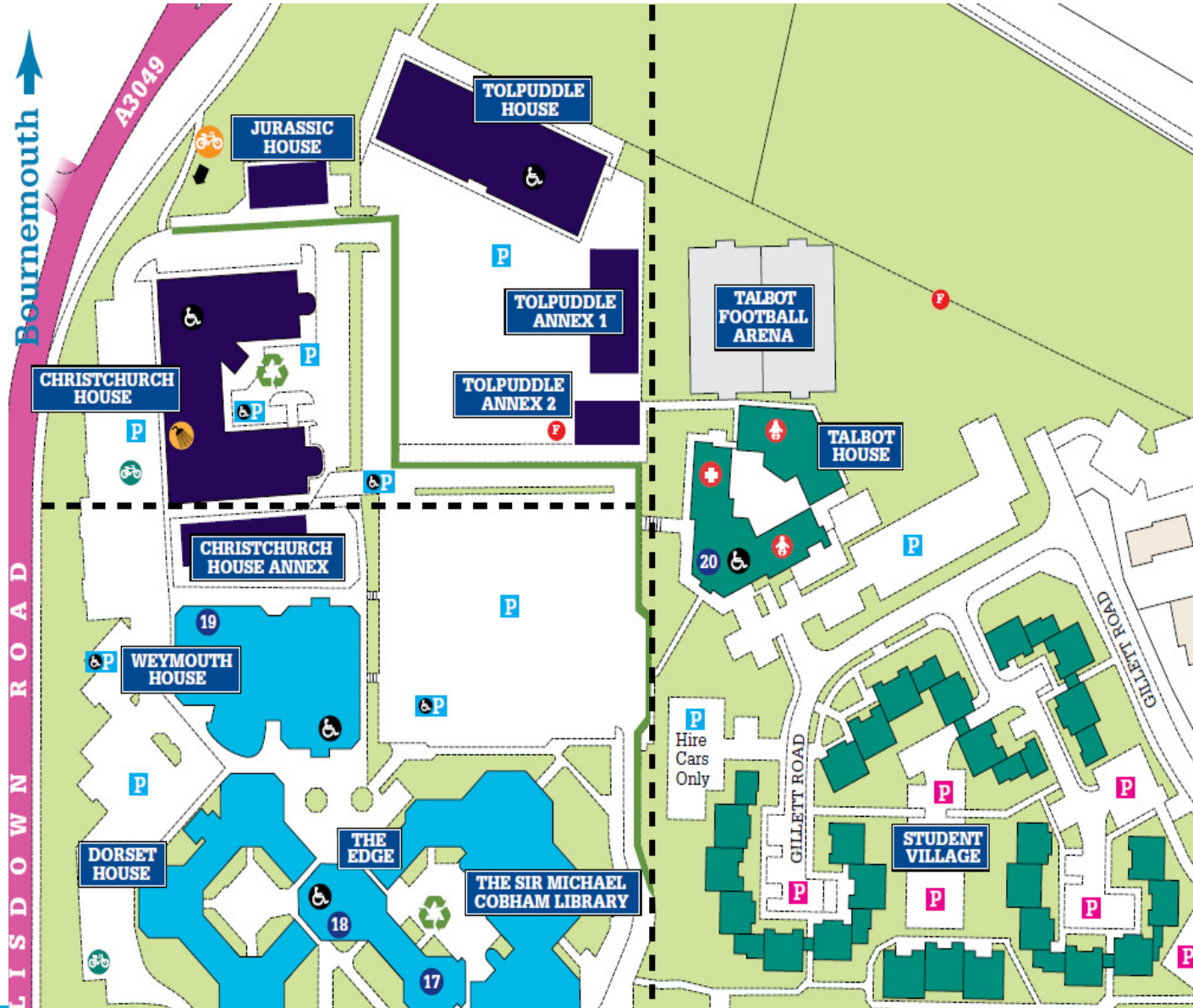

Think now about the 'life skills' of living independently and cooking, cleaning.

You will share with between 3 – 8 others in all and there are regular checks.

Protect

Limited possessions insurances is provided to all students in halls of residence and Unilet options.

You may want to consider comprehensive cover to include any valuables.

Plan

Think carefully about what you will bring. Space is extremely limited.

A TV licence is required if you wish to watch television live (even if online). You are likely to require a separate licence.

Parking restrictions apply on-campus and in accommodation.

A few tips for HSC students

- We recommend you select a 50 week license Hall of Residence as NHS courses are generally longer than usual due to the placement element.
- Look for a similar length contract if you are getting private accommodation.

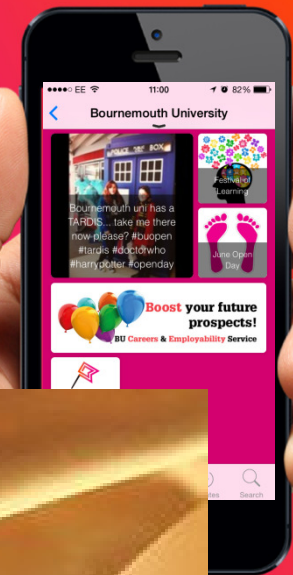

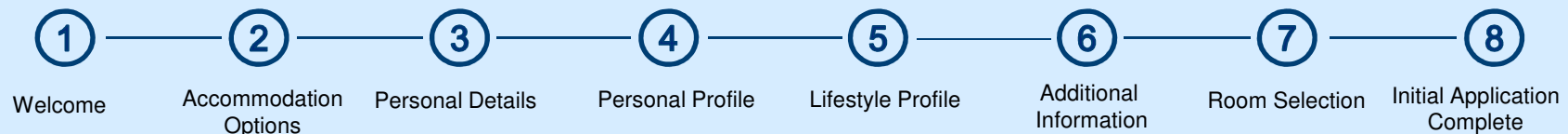


What next...
