information for what to bring to your student camp(s):

- 1. Print and fill out a Risk Release Waiver for each attending student. Students will not be admitted to camp without it. See page 5.
- 2. Please fill out a photo release form for each student. See page 6.
- 3. Be sure to arrive early the first day of camp.
- 4. Please notify the on-site camp leader of any allergies and bring an appropriate snack, as needed.

# Nursery (0-2 years)

Please bring any needed baby items in a labeled bag and a bottle and/or cup with your child's name clearly marked. A snack will be provided daily. Parents are responsible for picking children up and providing lunch during the one-hour lunch break.

# Play Camp (3-5 years)

Please bring any needed items in a labeled bag and a cup with your child's name clearly marked. A snack will be provided daily. Parents are responsible for picking children up and providing lunch during the one-hour lunch break.

# GeoDraw Camp (6-8 years)

Students should bring two good erasers, a ruler or straight edge, two pencils, and a daily snack with beverage. Parents are responsible for picking children up and providing lunch during the one-hour lunch break.

# Academic Camps (9-14 years & 13-17 years)

Students should bring: two pencils, notebook paper, and a daily snack with beverage. Parents are responsible for picking children up and providing lunch during the one-hour lunch break.

Some academic camps require students to purchase specific resources. Please consult the list at right to see if the camp you are registered for requires you to purchase and bring a book or other resources.
