About Lausanne 2020

From January 9 to 22 2020, Lausanne will be welcoming the third edition of the Winter Youth Olympic Games. 26 years after obtaining the title of Olympic Capital, Lausanne will become an Olympic city by hosting the second largest multisport winter event after the Olympic Winter Games. This event will offer a unique and unforgettable Olympic experience to young athletes. The combination of culture, performance and education will give rise to a genuine celebration of sports!

Lausanne 2020 Ambition

Lausanne 2020 is seeking to create a new sports platform for young people by actively involving them in the preparation and organisation of the event. This means engaging the local, regional and even national population around a unique, unifying occasion, that seeks to create a better world. Promoting and giving responsibility to young people by providing them with an opportunity to become ambassadors of positive sports values, acquire new talents and achieve self-accomplishment by becoming the leaders of tomorrow. All this while making the Youth Olympic Games a creative laboratory; an incubator of ideas from young people, for young people, drawing inspiration from Switzerland's heritage and unique assets in education, culture and innovation.

About the Youth Olympic Games

The Youth Olympic Games are an international Olympic sporting event of the highest level for athletes aged 15 to 18. They combine sports performance, culture and education in an authentic celebration of sport with a festive atmosphere. The aim is to encourage young people to adopt and represent the positive values of sport – respect for others, for themselves and for our environment; friendship between people and cultures; and, excellence in self-giving – and to become sports ambassadors throughout the world.

About the Olympic Flame

An integral part of the countdown to an Olympic Games, the lighting of the Olympic flame is a ceremony of great symbolic importance, one that binds the ancient and modern versions of the Games firmly together. Today, the purity of the flame is guaranteed by the way it is lit using the sun's rays. The Lausanne 2020 Youth Olympic Games Flame will be light on September 17, 2019 in Athens in a traditional ceremony.

Lausanne 2020 Torch Tour


The Lausanne 2020 Torch Tour - starts 21 September to 9 January!

As is tradition, the Lausanne 2020 Olympic torch will be lit in Athens, Greece, on September 17. The next day, it will make its way back to Switzerland, where it will make an appearance at a Swiss Games for the first time since the Winter Olympic Games in St. Moritz in 1948. From 21 September, the torch will travel through the 26 Swiss cantons for a four-month trip that will end on the evening of the opening ceremony of Lausanne 2020, on 9 January.

Virginie Faivre, President of the Lausanne 2020 Organising Committee

Born in Lausanne, Virginie Faivre has a long career as a Swiss elite freestyle skier behind her. Three times FIS (International Ski Federation) world champion in half-pipe (2009, 2013 and 2015) and three times crystal globe winner in the discipline (2008, 2009, 2013). Today, Virginie is head of Suisse Romande at the Swiss Sport Foundation (note: Swiss "Sporthilfe"), where she closely follows the challenges of youth sport development in the country.

Virginie Faivre has been involved in the Lausanne 2020 project since its beginnings in 2013. Since January 7th 2019, she has taken over the reins of the Organising Committee, bringing to the project her extensive experience of major international winter sports competitions.

Ian Logan, CEO of the Lausanne 2020 Organising Committee

Ian Logan is the CEO of the Winter Youth Olympic Games Organizing Committee Lausanne 2020 Organizing Committee, since its creation in 2013.

He started his career as a pilot at the age of 16 by flying gliders, before becoming a military pilot. While Logan is a fighter pilot, colonel and general staff officer, he is also an avid sportsman (running, biking, ski mountaineering, gym and mountain hiking).

Before becoming CEO of Lausanne 2020, Logan headed several International Committees which represented the Swiss Department of Defense where he gained strong expertise in negotiation, diplomacy and leadership. Since 1991, Ian Logan has refined his extensive experience in the management of major events by successfully managing events such as "AIR'14", the largest international air show ever held on Swiss soil, which attracted more than 400,000 spectators in the summer of 2014.

Logan also acted as a consultant for various cultural and sporting organising committees including the 2015 FAI World Air Games in Dubai, the 2016 Federal Wrestling Championships and the 2019 "Fête des Vignerons", Switzerland's largest cultural gathering, taking place only every 25 years.

Ian Logan has a strong passion for sport and the Olympic Movement. He strongly believes that the Youth Olympic Games serve as a tool to inspire the youth of the world to be active, practice sport and live accordingly to the Olympic Values of Respect, Friendship and Excellence.

Born in 1965 in Pully Switzerland, he is fluent in French, German, Swiss German and English. He holds an Executive MBA in International affairs and lives near Lausanne, with his wife and five children, who all practice a lot of sport.


