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**Total Nonfarm employment (1,937,400 jobs)** gained 3,800 jobs over the month and gained 49,200 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month in 12 of the last 14 months. The series has seen 20 consecutive over-the-year gains.

**Private sector employment (1,628,300 jobs)** gained 3,700 jobs over the month and gained 49,700 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month in 13 of the last 14 months. The series has seen 20 consecutive over-the-year gains.

**Mining and Logging (31,600 jobs)** gained 500 jobs over the month and gained 1,500 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month in three of the last four months. This shows 18 consecutive over-the-year gains.

**Construction (128,400 jobs)** gained 3,400 jobs over the month but lost 1,300 jobs over the year. This ends a streak of seven consecutive months with an over-the-month loss. This shows four consecutive over-the-year losses.

**Manufacturing (138,200 jobs)** lost 600 jobs over the month but gained 8,000 jobs over the year. Manufacturing has seen over-the-month gains in 11 of the last 14 months. Manufacturing has seen over-the-year gains for 14 straight months. Durable goods manufacturing (65,000 jobs) added 100 jobs over the month and added 5,300 jobs over the year. Non-durable goods manufacturing (73,200 jobs) lost 700 jobs over the month but added 2,700 jobs over the year.

**Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (368,800 jobs)** added 500 jobs over the month and gained 4,100 jobs over the year. This series has added jobs over the year for 20 consecutive months. Wholesale trade (65,900 jobs) added 100 jobs over the month and added 2,900 jobs over the year. Retail trade (217,600 jobs) added 200 jobs over the month and added 400 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the year in 11 of the last 12 months. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities (85,300 jobs) added 200 jobs over the month and added 800 jobs over the year.

**Information (23,700 jobs)** showed no change over the month but lost 100 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the year in 19 of the last 20 months.

**Financial Activities (90,400 jobs)** added 600 jobs over the month but lost 1,800 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the year in 16 of the last 20 months.

**Professional and Business Services (227,700 jobs)** showed no change over the month but gained 10,700 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month in 10 of the last 14 months. This shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. Professional, scientific, and technical services (100,400 jobs) added 700 jobs over the month and gained 9,700 jobs over the year. Management of companies and enterprises (21,200 jobs) lost 100 jobs over the month but increased by 100 jobs over the year. Administrative and support and waste management and remediation services (106,100 jobs) lost 600 jobs over the month but gained 900 jobs over the year.

**Education and Health Services (329,800 jobs)** added 1,300 jobs over the month and gained 14,800 jobs over the year. This shows over-the-month gains in 13 of the last 14 months. This shows over-the-year gains in 18 of the last 20 months. The educational services subsector (48,500 jobs) showed no change over the month but added 1,100 jobs over the year. This shows over-the-year gains in 18 of the last 20 months. The health care and social assistance subsector (281,300

**Leisure and Hospitality (219,900 jobs)** lost 1,900 jobs over the month but added 13,700 jobs over the year. This shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. Arts, entertainment, and recreation (25,000 jobs) showed no change over the month but gained 2,100 jobs over the year. Accommodation and food services (194,900 jobs) lost 1,900 jobs over the month but added 11,600 jobs over the year.

**Other Services (69,800 jobs)** lost 100 jobs over the month but added 100 jobs over the year. This shows over-the-year gains in 16 of the last 20 months.

**Government (309,100 jobs)** added 100 jobs over the month but lost 500 jobs over the year. Federal government (31,300 jobs) lost 100 jobs over the month and lost 400 jobs over the year. State government (86,200 jobs) lost 100 jobs over the month but added 300 jobs over the year. Local government (191,600 jobs) added 300 jobs over the month but lost 400 jobs over the year.

**Civilian Labor Force - Statewide and National Trends:** The November 2022 preliminary, seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate for Louisiana was 3.3 percent, matching its October rate. The national unemployment rate for November 2022 was 3.7 percent, equaling the October rate. Unemployment in the state for November was 68,360. The state civilian labor force increased to 2,084,843, and total employment increased to 2,016,483.

## November 2022 Not Seasonally Adjusted Employment

### Statewide

**Nonfarm employment** (1,954,800 jobs) in Louisiana added 11,300 jobs over the month and gained 51,000 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month in nine of the last 10 months. This also shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. This is the highest level of employment in the series since March 2020.

**Total private employment** (1,640,000 jobs) showed a gain of 9,100 jobs over the month and a gain of 50,800 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month for 10 consecutive months. This also shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. This is the highest level of employment in the series since February 2020.

**Mining and logging** (31,500 jobs) added 200 jobs month and added 1,400 jobs over the year. This shows 18 consecutive months with an over-the-year gain.

**Construction** (129,400 jobs) gained 2,300 jobs over the month but lost 1,400 jobs over the year. This shows over-the-month losses in five of the last seven months, and shows jobs lost over the year in three of the last four months. The construction of buildings subsector added 500 jobs over the month and added 1,800 jobs over the year. The heavy and civil engineering subsector added 1,000 jobs over the month but lost 1,500 jobs over the year. Specialty trade contractors gained 800 jobs over the month but lost 1,700 jobs over the year.

**Manufacturing** (139,200 jobs) lost 500 jobs over the month but added 8,100 jobs over the year. Manufacturing has added jobs over the year for 14 consecutive months. Durable goods manufacturing showed no change over the month but added 5,500 jobs over the year. Non-durable goods manufacturing lost 500 jobs over the month but gained 2,600 jobs over the year.

**Trade, transportation, and utilities** (372,500 jobs) added 5,600 jobs over the month and added 4,200 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the month for three consecutive months and shows over-the-year gains for 12 straight months. Wholesale trade lost 200 jobs over the month but gained 2,900 jobs over the year. Retail trade added 3,800 jobs over the month and added 100 jobs over the year. *General merchandise stores* was responsible for 2,000 of the 3,800 jobs gained over the month. Retail trade has added jobs over the year in 10 of the last 11 months. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities added 2,000 jobs over the month and added 1,200 jobs over the year.

**Information** (23,800 jobs) added 400 jobs over the month and gained 200 jobs over the year. The series has seen 20 consecutive over-the-year gains.

**Financial activities** (90,500 jobs) added 500 jobs over the month but lost 1,500 jobs over the year. The series has still added jobs over the year in 17 of the last 20 months. Real estate and rental and leasing services added 100 jobs both over the month and over the year.

**Professional and business services** (230,600 jobs) lost 1,000 jobs over the month but gained 11,300 jobs over the year. This shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. Professional, scientific and technical services gained 200 jobs over the month and gained 9,900 jobs over the year. Management of companies and enterprises added 100 jobs over the year. Administrative and support and waste management and remediation services lost 1,200 jobs over the month but added 1,300 jobs over the year.

**Education and health services** (331,700 jobs) added 1,300 jobs over the month and gained 15,200 jobs over the year. Educational services (49,300 jobs) lost 200 jobs over the month but added 1,100 jobs over the year. Educational services has seen over-the-year gains in 18 of the last 20 months. Health care and social assistance (282,400 jobs) gained 1,500 jobs over the month and gained 14,100 jobs over the year. *Ambulatory health care services* gained 600 jobs over the month and added 5,100 jobs over the year. *Hospitals* added 500 jobs over the month and gained 2,900 jobs over the year. *Nursing and residential care facilities* added 400 jobs over the month and gained 3,300 jobs over the year. *Social assistance* showed no change over the month but gained 2,800 jobs over the year.

**Leisure and hospitality** (221,200 jobs) added 800 jobs over the month and added 13,400 jobs over the year. This is the highest employment level for the series since March 2020. This shows 20 consecutive over-the-year gains. Arts, entertainment, and recreation added 400 jobs over the month and added 1,900 jobs over the year. The accommodation industry added 200 jobs over the month and added 2,400 jobs over the year. Food services and drinking places gained 200 jobs over the month and added 9,100 jobs over the year.

**Other services** (69,600 jobs) lost 500 jobs over the month and lost 100 jobs over the year. The series has added jobs over the year in 16 of the last 20 months. The repair and maintenance industry lost 200 jobs both over the month and over the year.

**Government** (314,800 jobs) added 2,200 jobs over the month and gained 200 jobs over the year. Federal government (31,600 jobs) gained 100 jobs over the month but lost 400 jobs over the year. State government (89,600 jobs) added 700 jobs over the month and gained 800 jobs over the year. Local government (193,600 jobs) added 1,400 jobs over the month but lost 200 jobs over the year.

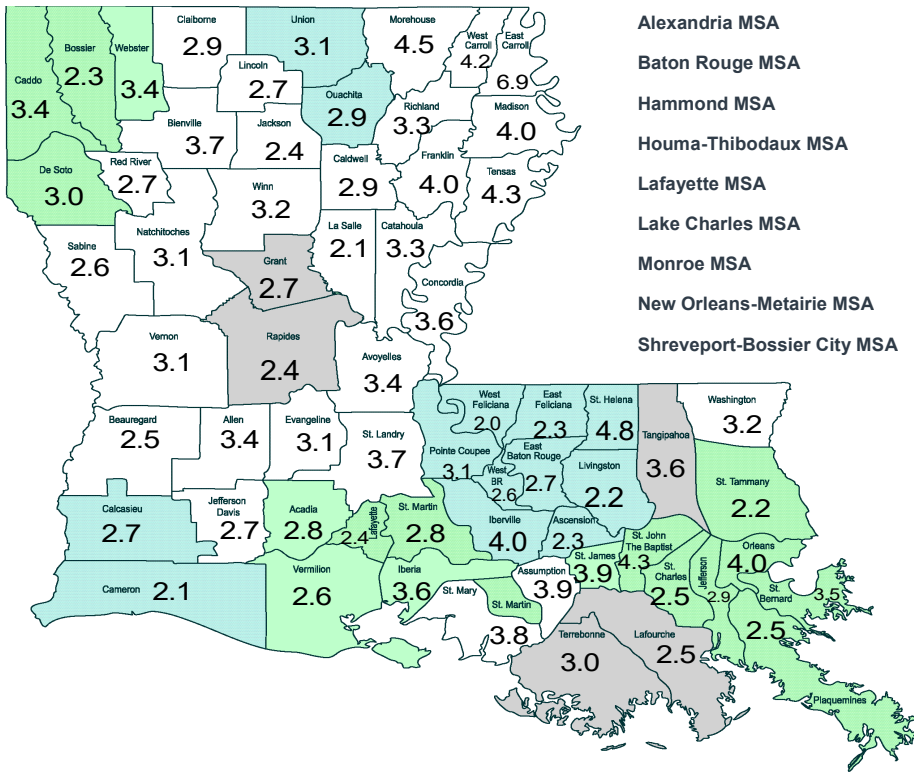

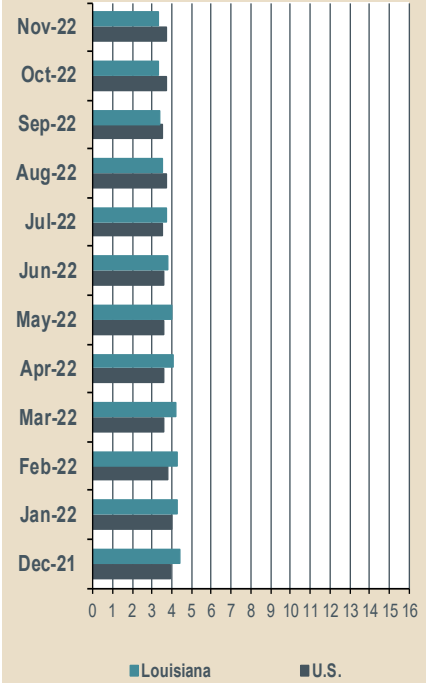


# Louisiana Unemployment Rates (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

November 2022

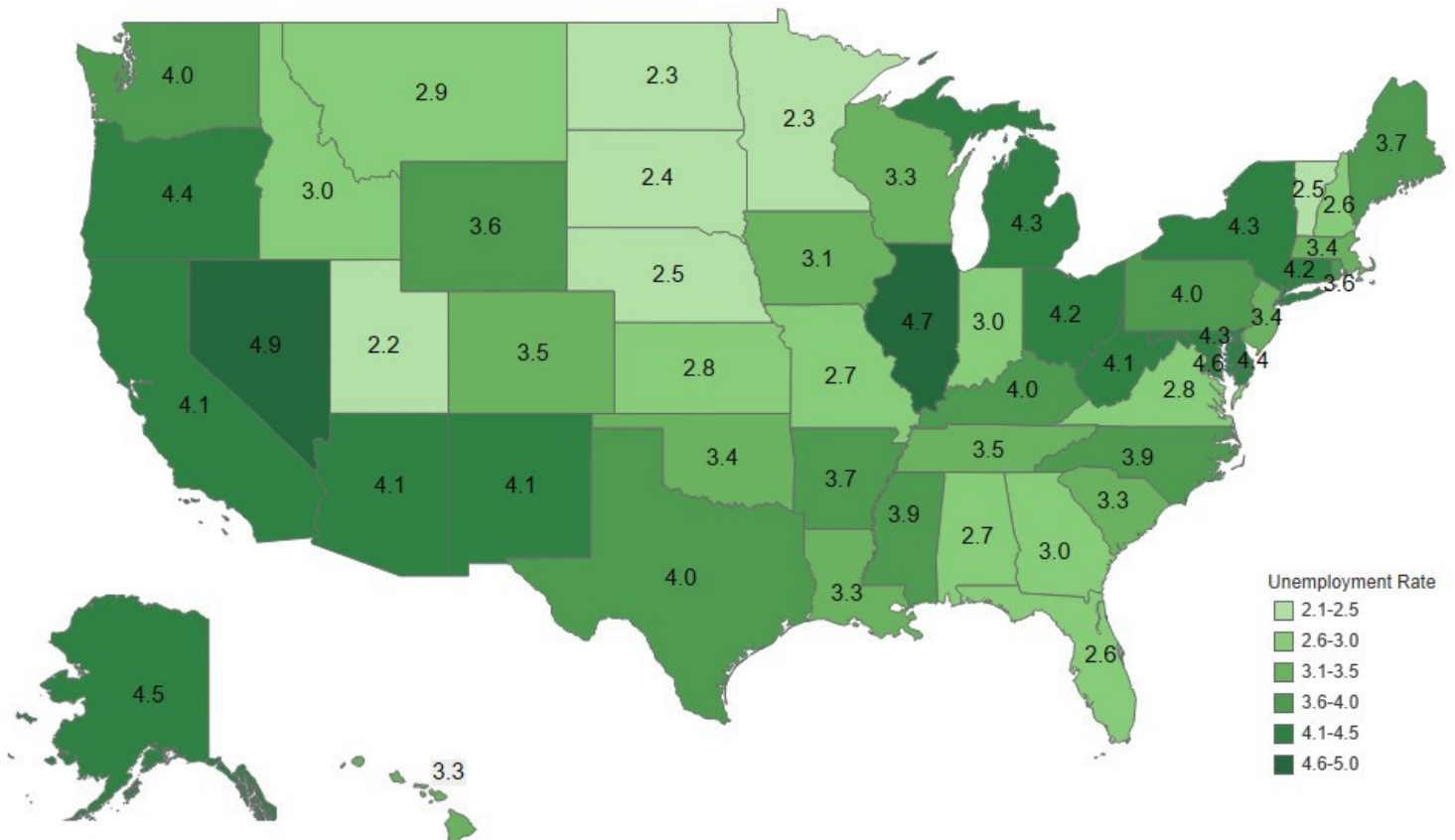


## United States - Louisiana Unemployment Rates (Seasonally Adjusted)

# Glossary & Technical Notes

**Average Hourly Earnings/Average Weekly Earnings/ Average Weekly Hours (CES/BLS)** - average total money earnings, in the survey week (i.e., the week that includes the twelfth of the month), of production workers plus nonsupervisory workers not in production, including overtime, paid vacation and sick leave.

**Civilian Labor Force** - that portion of the population, age sixteen or older, which is employed or unemployed and actively seeking employment during the reference week of the twelfth of the month.

**Employed** - the members of the labor force who worked for pay or profit, or had a job from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, vacation, labor dispute, or other reasons not reflecting a shortage of work, or who worked fifteen hours or more as unpaid workers in an enterprise operated by a member of the family.

**Unemployed** - the members of the labor force who did not work but were seeking work or were awaiting recall from layoffs or the beginning of a new job within thirty days.

**Unemployment Rate** - the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labor force.

**Continued Claim** - each week claimed subsequent to the filing of the initial claim for a week of unemployment compensation.

**Current Employment Statistics (CES)** - estimates of nonfarm employment and production workers hours and earnings by industry. They are produced as part of a nationwide program, in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), for the state and each metropolitan statistical area (MSA) from a sample of employing establishments.

**Current Population Survey (CPS)** - a monthly household survey of the U.S. population conducted for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) by the Bureau of the Census, of 60,000 selected households. Respondents are interviewed to obtain information on the employment status of each household member age 16 and over, during the reference week of the twelfth.

**Durable Goods** - items with a normal life expectancy of three years or more. Automobiles, furniture, household appliances, and mobile homes are examples.

**Extended Layoff Event** - Fifty or more initial claims for unemployment insurance benefits from an establishment during a 5-week period, with at least 50 workers separated for more than 30 days.

**Initial Claims** - a new claim, filed to open a claim for unemployment compensation.

**Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)** - a geographical area comprised of a parish generally containing a central city (or twin cities) of 50,000 inhabitants or more and contiguous parishes that are socially and economically integrated with the central city.

**Micropolitan Statistical Area (MC)** - a geographical area comprised of a parish containing a central city of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 inhabitants and contiguous parishes that are socially and economically integrated with the central city.

**NAICS (North American Industry Classification System)** - an industry classification system that groups establishments into industries based on the activities in which they are primarily engaged.

**Nonfarm Employment** - employment by place of work that does not include the self employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, or agriculture workers. All estimates of nonfarm employment in this publication are in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics and include all full-time and part-time workers who were employed during the pay period including the twelfth of the month.

**Nondurable Goods** - items that generally last for only a short period of time (less than three years). Food, beverages, apparel, and gasoline are common examples.

**Seasonally Adjusted** - monthly data that is adjusted to minimize the changes in any time series which result from normal annual occurrences such as Christmas, summer vacations, and weather patterns.

**Separation** - The release of persons from an employer as part of a mass layoff event. Such releases involve both persons subject to recall and those who are terminated by the establishment.

**Subsector** - refers to the three-digit NAICS code, which will fall under the particular sector. Example: If Manufacturing (31-33) is the industry sector, then Food manufacturing (311), Paper manufacturing (322), Chemical manufacturing (325), Transportation equipment manufacturing (336), are some of the subsectors of manufacturing.

**Supersector** - refers to these five categories: Total Nonfarm, Total Private, Goods-Producing, Service-Providing, and Private Service-Providing.

**Summary Industry Sector** - a combination of industry sectors. A summary sector may or may not be published. The summary industry sectors are Mining & Logging; Construction; Manufacturing; Trade, Transportation, & Utilities; Information; Financial Activities; Professional & Business Services; Education & Health Services; Leisure & Hospitality; Other Services; and Government.

**Industry Sector** - 20 industry sectors based on two-digit NAICS code. They are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (11), Mining (21), Utilities (22), Construction (23), Manufacturing (31-33), Wholesale Trade (42), Retail Trade (44-45), Transportation and Warehousing (48-49), Information (51), Finance and Insurance (52), Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (53), Professional and Technical Services (54), Management of Companies and Enterprises (55), Administrative and Waste Services (56), Educational Services (61), Health Care and Social Assistance (62), Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (71), Accommodation and Food Services (72), Other Services (81), and Public Administration (92).

## Constraints of the monthly civilian labor force and nonfarm employment estimates:

The civilian labor force estimates are derived by a monthly survey of approximately 723 households throughout Louisiana following the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) methodology. The US Census Bureau conducts the survey by calling randomly selected households and providing BLS with survey results. Households are asked for the number of residents who are sixteen and over and whether they were working or actively looking for work during the week of the twelfth of the month. Responses to these questions become part of the formula to determine the number of people employed and the number of individuals unemployed for the state, MSAs, and each parish every month.

The nonfarm employment estimates are derived from responses received from the monthly BLS survey of approximately 7,000 businesses across the state. Responses capture employment activity during the 12th of each month. This survey relies on responses from these businesses to produce industry employment levels for the state and all metropolitan statistical areas.

Both data sets are comparable with estimates for the U.S., all 50 states, and 387 metropolitan areas across the U.S.
