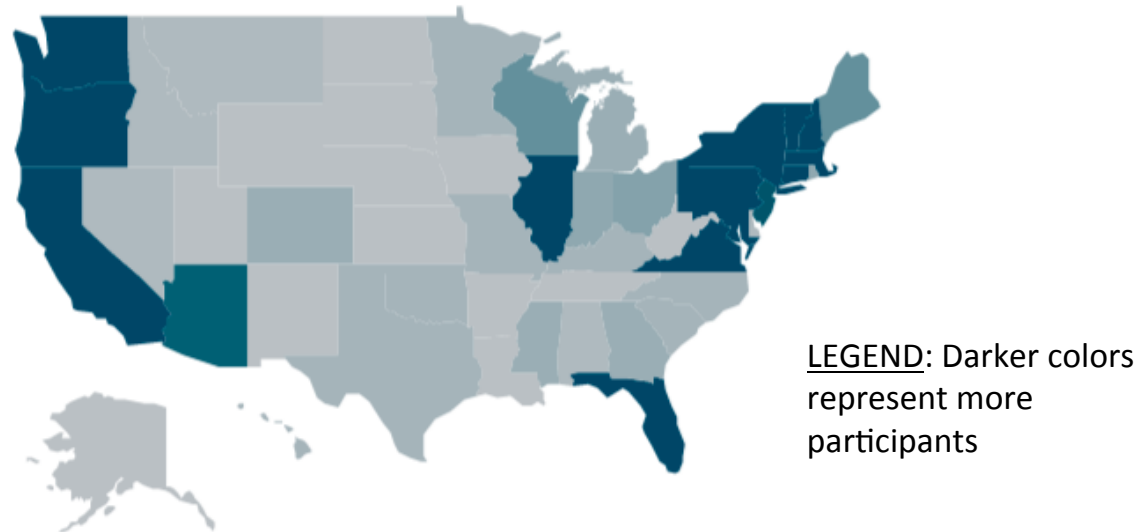


LCIRT Educator Training: Where do our participants come from?

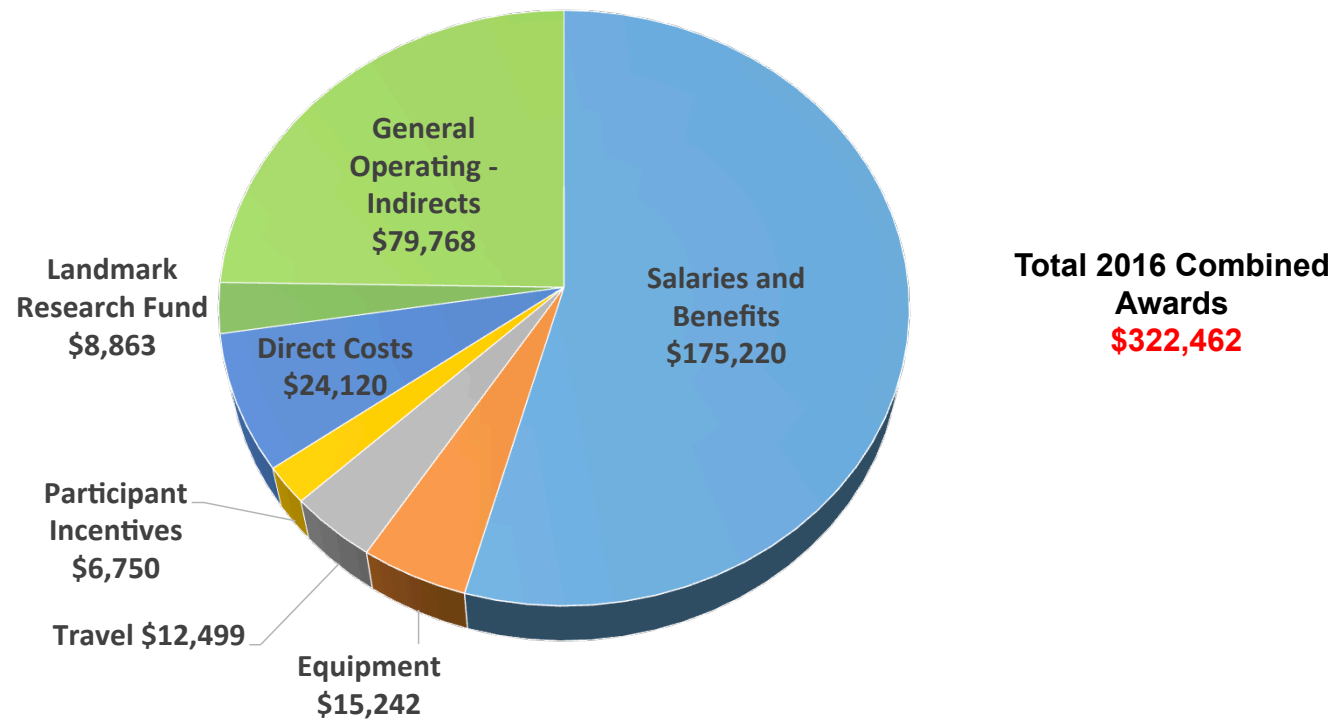


2,136 participants took part in Professional Development events* hosted by the Landmark College Institute for Research and Training (LCIRT) between 2013-2015.

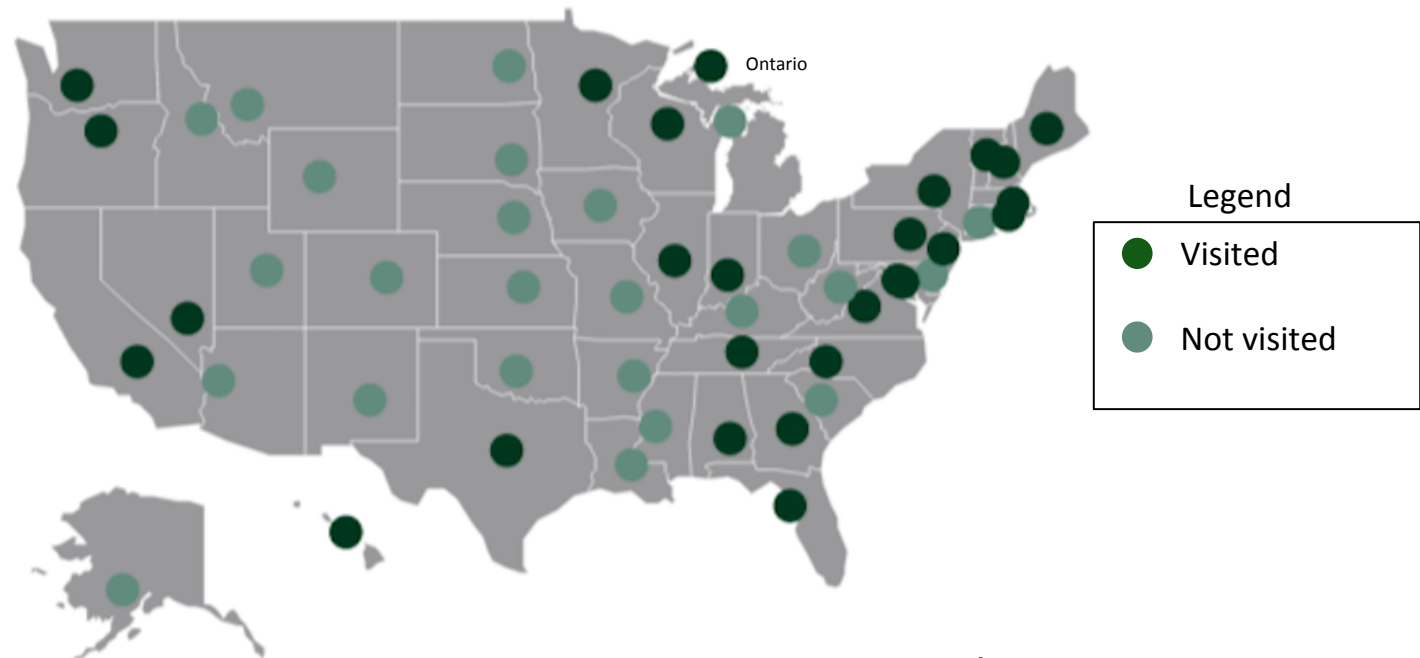
Keynote: Drs. Brock and Fernette Eide Founders of The Dyslexic Advantage

The keynote topic will be ground breaking research in understanding the dyslexic brain from the perspective of its advantages as well as its challenges. The Eide's research has been influential in showing that dyslexic individuals perceive the written word differently from non-dyslexics, but also may excel at spatial reasoning, interconnected thinking, and display creativity in many areas.



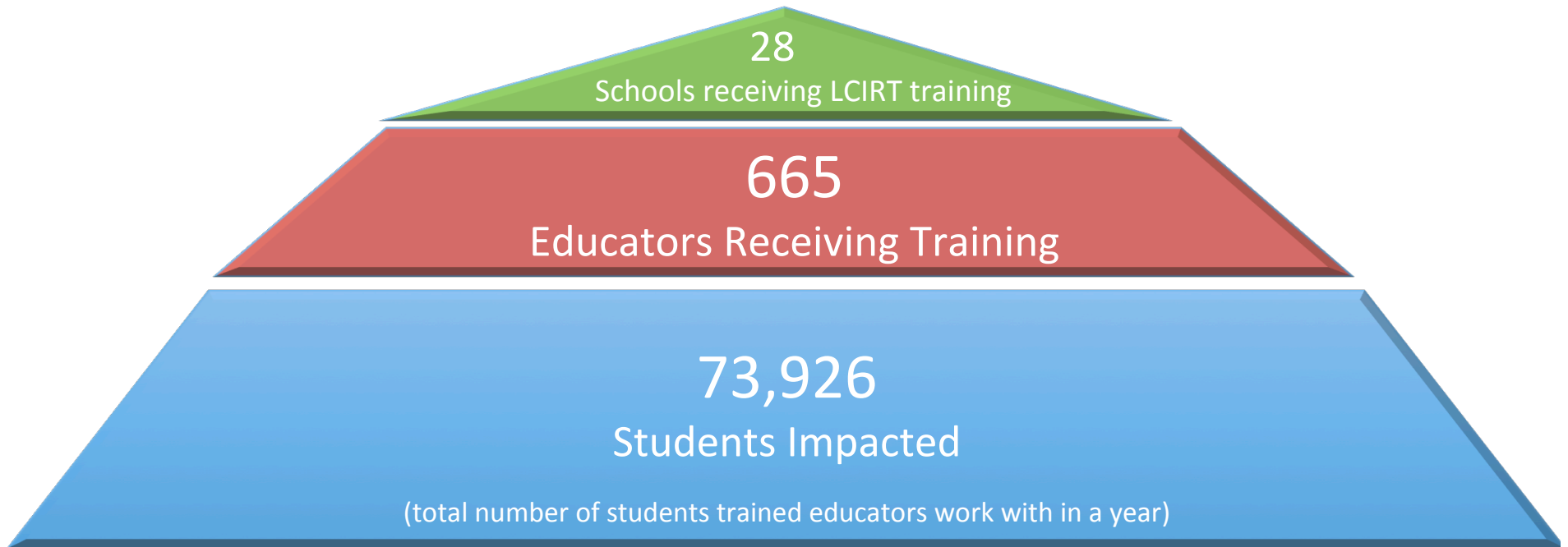

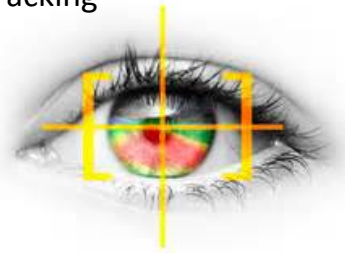
Three Undergraduate Research Assistants (URAs) at

Coding video data and interpreting results



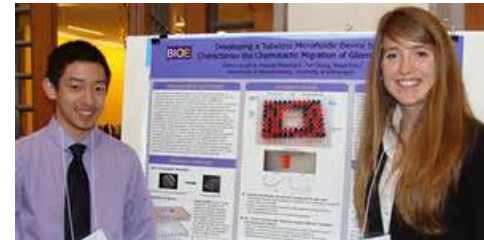
