Advanced Classroom Management: Children as Change Agents (*)

This course focuses on cognitive and cognitive-behavioral interventions with an emphasis on teaching students how to change and manage their own behavior. Since previous knowledge and understanding of traditional behavioral concepts and strategies is required, it is strongly recommended that you take an introductory behavior management course to learn the basic terms and concepts of behavior management prior to taking this advanced course.

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder: Information & Intervention for Effective Teaching

This course will help the learner achieve a better understanding of ADHD and intervention strategies to facilitate positive student change. This course covers the history of the disorder, accepted methods to assess and identify students with the disorder, and various methods, medications, and strategies that are currently used to treat it. For situations in which services beyond what can be provided in the classroom are required, the referral process for getting help for the student will be addressed.

Autism and Asperger's Disorder: Information and Interventions for Effective Teaching

Provides information on the characteristics of the disorder, associated learning styles, communication weaknesses and various intervention strategies that have proven to be successful when working with students with Autism spectrum disorders. Make sense of why individuals with Autism spectrum disorders act the way they do and what you can do to enhance more appropriate behavior.

Behavior is Language: Strategies for Managing Disruptive Behavior (*)

This course provides a developmental framework to help the learner understand what students are trying to communicate through the "language" of their behavior. Topics covered include behavioral techniques and intervention strategies that remediate disruptive behaviors, reduce power struggles while increasing classroom control, reduce educator workload, and help prevent burnout. After successfully completing this

course, the educator and his/her students will be better equipped to find and implement creative, effective solutions to behavioral problems.

Build School Communities: Brain Smart Classroom Management

This course helps teachers build genuine bonds between themselves and their students and between students and their classmates, to create "kindred classhomes" with a foundation of acceptance, respect, and shared purpose. This course will help you develop strategies, rituals, and environmental design skills to create these safe havens of learning. Students will learn how to differentiate for classroom management and discipline similarly to differentiating for students' diverse academic needs.

Career Essentials for Health Science

This course is designed for secondary teachers seeking Class IV licensure in Health Science. Career Essentials for Health Science focuses on the foundation knowledge and skills students will need prior to entry into their desired allied health program. It also provides the basics to best understand and work as an employee in healthcare settings. Emphasis is on types of helalthcare delivery systems and regulations, communication skills, patient-centered care, teamwork, worker behaviors and attitudes, legal and ethical responsibilities, self-care, and safe quality practice.

Child Abuse: Working with Abused and Neglected Children

This course covers how to recognize the signs of physical, emotional, and sexual abuse, and physical and emotional neglect in students. It also discusses the specific factors that exist in families who abuse or neglect their children. A major emphasis in this course is on helping the participant understand the special learning needs of abused or neglected children and how to meet those needs in the regular classroom. Working with parents and community agencies is also emphasized.

Drugs and Alcohol in Schools: Understanding Substance Use and Abuse

This course provides a contextual framework for understanding what students may

be experiencing either through their own substance use or as a result of the substance use of persons close to them and provides a basic historical perspective of substance use along with the biological, psychological, and social factors that comprise the disease of addiction. Upon course completion, the learner will better understand the complex dynamics that contribute to this biological and social phenomenon.

Educational Assessment: Assessing Student Learning in Classroom

This course is designed to further develop the conceptual and technical skills required by teachers to help them identify their educational goals and implement meaningful instructional strategies for effective learning by students with special needs. The focus of the course is on assessment for instructional programming and will outline procedures for designing or selecting, administering, and interpreting, a variety of informal assessment measures typically used in schools.

English Language Learner: Language Acquisition

This course discusses developmental theories and how they apply to English language learners. The focus of this course is on the process of second language acquisition and the role of the classroom teacher. Included in this course is information about the legal obligations of

schools and teachers to provide services and about the types of programs schools might provide. Included is information on communicating with parents/guardians.

English Language Learner: Methods & Materials



This course discusses how to apply instructional methods in creating lessons; how to create a motivating and caring learning environment; how to integrate teaching reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills; how to differentiate instruction for English language learners; and how to identify culturally appropriate curriculum and instructional resources.

Harassment, Bullying and **Cyber-Intimidation in Schools**




This course will discuss definitions and the personal, social, and legal ramifications associated with sexual harassment, bullying, and cyber-intimidation. The course will address what we know about these troubling areas and explore preventative strategies before they occur. A clear understanding of harassment and the harmful effects of harassment on people and institutions is essential to providing a safe and inclusive school environment for all.

Inclusion: Working with Students with Special Needs in General **Education Classrooms**

Inclusion is a current educational reform movement that advocates educating students with disabilities in the general education classroom. Upon completion, the learner will be able to define key concepts and terms, identify and describe federal legislature and court cases, and list and describe the federal definition of students entitled to special services. This course will also discuss the roles and responsibilities of educators in providing special services to students educated in inclusive classrooms.

Learning Disabilities: Practical (*) 👣 Information for Classroom Teacher



Reading & Writing in **Content Area**



This course offers instruction in teaching reading and writing in various subject matter fields at the secondary level. The material stresses the skills of vocabulary building, comprehension, and writing, as well as methods for motivating adolescents to read and write. The course also provides information on recognizing reading difficulties, assessing textbooks, and the integration of reading strategies within a content area. Strategies taught align with the Praxis Reading Across the Curriculum test guide and the Reading in the Content Area national standards.

Reading Fundamentals #1: An Introduction to Scientifically-based Research



This course will improve your knowledge of science and the scientific process. This is the first course in a three-course series. This course is designed to be an informational course with application toeducational settings. The curriculum suggestions and teaching strategies explained here were designed to be used for the teaching and remediation of students in kindergarten through sixth grade. Some alterations may be needed if working with specific populations such as gifted, ESL, or special education.

Reading Fundamentals #2: Laying the Foundation for EffectiveReading Instruction (**)



Designed to lay the foundation for effective reading instruction, this course will teach you about the elements of effective instruction and the importance of reading instruction. The purpose of this second course in this three-course series is to lay the foundation for effective reading instruction. Teachers benefit, and more importantly, students benefit, both in terms of their behavior and their academic performance. Further, you will learn about the importance of reading instruction and read some sobering statistics on reading performance in this country and what happens when individuals are not proficient in reading.

Reading Fundamentals #3: The Elements of Effective **Reading Instruction and Assessment**

This course will focus on learning to read, reading to learn, and an introduction to reading assessment. As part of these two key areas of reading instruction, the five elements of effective reading instruction will be

highlighted, including definitions, implications for instruction, and future directions. These five elements include instruction in: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and text comprehension. Additionally, the course will provide information on important assessment terms and definitions and will explore how reading assessment fits within the Reading First Program. This analysis includes specific recommendations on 29 reading assessments. Finally, the course describes how teachers can conduct pivotal curriculumbased measurement procedures in their classrooms

Response to Intervention: Practical Information for the Classroom Teacher



RTI, or Response to Intervention, is a process schools can and should use to help students who are struggling with academics or behavior. Even though RTI is primarily linked to special education and the early identification of learning problems, RTI is not just for students in special education. RTI is for all students and is based on the premise that a student might be struggling due to instruction or the curriculum in the past, or in the current classroom. Every teacher will have students who are struggling and whether it's short term or long term, RTI is a valuable tool. So, welcome to the class on Response to Intervention where you will learn what RTI is and how to use it in your classroom.

Six Traits of Writing Model: Teaching & Assessing



This course will discuss why writing is important and why teachers should include writing as often as possible in all content areas. The course will also include practical applications for assessing and teaching writing, including teaching students how to self-assess their own writing. The first chapter of this course will discuss why teaching writing is important and give you an introduction to the Six Traits of Writing Model. Through chapters 2, 3, and 4 we will discuss the elements of the Six Traits of Writing Model. Throughout those elements we will look at practical ways to use this model in your classroom.

Talented and Gifted: **Working with High Achievers**



This course provides information on the history of exceptional students in relation to education, current law, and accepted methods for referral, assessment, and identification. It covers major program models and methods of differentiating instruction to meet the rate and level of learning of those students identified. The course gives the learner an understanding of ways to meet the affective needs of the gifted and talented student in the regular classroom and lists resources for teachers and parents who would like more information about the talented and gifted.

Teaching Diversity: Influences and Issues in the Classroom (4)

This course will help teachers understand and identify differences in approaches to learning and performance, including different learning styles and ways in which students demonstrate learning. An emphasis in this course will be on understanding how students' learning is influenced by individual experiences, talents, disabilities, gender, language, culture, family and community values. Participants will be challenged to apply knowledge of the richness of contributions from our diverse society to your teaching field.

Teaching Elementary Math Conceptually: A New Paradigm

This course is designed to expand your methodology for teaching Mathematics. The course will explore an innovative teaching model that incorporates strategies for teaching concepts constructively and contextually. The goal is for you to gain a deeper understanding of the underlying concepts of various math topics and to explore the principles of teaching those concepts to learners. This course will focus on the topics of number sense, basic operations, and fractions.

Teaching Secondary Math Conceptually: Meeting **Mathematics Standards**



This course will explore an instructional methodology that incorporates strategies for teaching concepts, constructively, and contextually. The goal is for you to gain a deeper understanding of the underlying concepts of various math topics and explore the principles of teaching those concepts to learners. The course will also explore teaching methodologies that support many federal and state standards.

Traumatized Child: The Effects of Stress, Trauma and Violence on Student Learning

Participants will learn the signs and symptoms of stress and trauma and explore how stress, violence, and trauma affect a student's learning, cognitive brain development, and socialemotional development. The short- and longterm consequences of being exposed to stress, trauma, or violence, as well as the social and family causes, will be reviewed. The dynamics of domestic violence and community violence are also discussed, as is the educator's role in the intervention and prevention of violence.

Try DI!: Planning & Preparing a 🕒 👣 **Differentiated Instruction Program**



Try DI! is designed to provide you an opportunity to learn about an instructional framework, Differentiated Instruction (DI), aimed at creating supportive learning environments for diverse learning populations. Students will be presented a method for self-assessment of the extent to which their current instructional approach reflects the perspective, principles, and practices of the DI approach. The concept of a "theory of action" will also be provided within a DI context. Strategies included in this course have been selected on the basis that they are effective in the widest possible range of educational K-12 settings.

Understanding Aggression: Coping with Aggressive Behavior in the Classroom

This course includes topics on violence, aggression in the classroom, youth gangs, aggression in sports and on television, how drugs and alcohol play a role in aggression and violence, and "hot spots" that tend to breed aggression and violence. It is designed to help school personnel become more aware of the causes of aggression and ways to evaluate it and intervene before it turns to violence in the schools.

Understanding & Implementing Common Core Standards



This course has been divided into four chapters. The organization of the course covers the rationale for and design of the Common Core State Standards, the "Common Core Mindset" practitioners need for successful implementation, and what specific actions can be taken for deeper implementation across settings.

Violence in Schools: Identification, Prevention & **Intervention Strategies**



This course provides an overview of violence and the motivational purposes behind aggression. The correlation and impact of the media, community, and family upon violence is investigated. The learner will gain an

understanding of identification and intervention approaches to working with out-of-control behaviors. In addition, information about the national resources available for both parents and teachers is covered. Upon successful completion of this course, participants will have a better understanding of violence and the motivations behind its use, as well as specific strategies to minimize the occurrence of violence in the school and community.

Why DI?: An Introduction to **Differentiated Instruction**



In this course you will learn what is meant by Differentiated Instruction (DI) and the common myths associated with creating the differentiated classroom. We will discuss the legal, theoretical, and pedagogical foundations in the field of education that support the utilization of DI practices and principles. We will reflect on best practices and national trends in the design of the educational setting to meet the needs of a diverse learning population. This course also provides connections to a variety of concepts, variables, and resources that will assist practitioners in aligning their own professional practices with those found in the differentiated classroom.

Certificate in Infectious Diseases & Infection Control (*)

Infectious diseases (IDs) kill more people worldwide than any other single cause. Infectious diseases are caused by pathogenic microorganisms, such as bacteria, viruses, parasites or fungi. The diseases can be spread, directly or indirectly, from one person to another. The outcome of this program is for the learner to describe basic infection control principles as well as describe how to recognize, treat, and prevent some of the most common (and often deadly) infectious diseases.

Certificate in Violence Prevention & Awareness (A)

In addition to the tremendous physical and emotional toll, violence has substantial medical, lost productivity, societal, and environmental costs. This program examines workplace violence, domestic (intimate partner) violence, elder abuse, child abuse, pediatric abusive head trauma, and sexual assault, gender violence, and rape. The learner will be able to describe several key types of violence, risk factors specific to those types of violence, assessment and treatment options, and prevention measures to reduce the incidence of violence.

Certified Inpatient Coder (*)

Earning CIC™ certification requires previous work experience, so most professionals prepare for the exam while working full-time. With this course's flexible online format, you can prepare for the CIC™ exam on your own schedule.

Clinical Medical Assistant





This program prepares learners to assist physicians by performing functions related to the clinical aspects of a medical office. Instruction includes preparing patients for examination and treatment, routine laboratory procedures, pharmacology, taking and documenting vital signs, technical aspects of phlebotomy, the 12-lead EKG and the cardiac life cycle. The purpose of the Clinical Medical Assisting program is to prepare learners to assist physicians by performing functions related to the clinical aspects of a medical office.

Dialysis Technician (**) 🕵



Learn the knowledge and skills needed to perform the duties required of dialysis technicians. Dialysis technicians operate kidney dialysis machines, prepare dialyzer reprocessing and delivery systems, as well as maintain and repair equipment. Technicians work with patients during dialysis procedures and monitor and record vital signs, as well as administer local anesthetics and drugs as needed. Dialysis technicians must assess patients for any complications that occur during the procedure and be ready to take the necessary emergency measures. Additionally, they may also be involved in the training of patients for at-home dialysis treatment and providing the emotional support patients need for self-care.

Electronic Health Records Management (P) 12

With the nation's healthcare system moving to the electronic medical record, numerous employment opportunities exist for medical assistants, health information systems staff, patient registration professionals and other related positions. This program prepares learners to understand and use electronic records in a medical practice. Learners will review the implementation and management of electronic health information using common electronic data interchange systems and maintaining the medical, legal, accreditation and regulatory requirements of the electronic health record.

HIPAA Compliance (*)





In this course, we'll demystify the compliance process. We'll focus specifically on the Administrative Simplification portion of HIPAA and use real-world examples to help explain the Privacy Rule, and since computers are an integral part of health care, we'll see how they fit into the Security Rule. Medical Administrative Assistant (*) 3



Career Essentials in Health Sciences focuses on the foundation knowledge and skills students will need prior to entry into their desired allied health program. It also provides the basics to best understand and work as an employee in healthcare settings. Emphasis is on types of healthcare delivery systems and regulations, communication skills, patient-centered care, teamwork, worker behaviors and attitudes, legal and ethical responsibilities, self-care, and safe quality practice.

ARTH 160: Global Visual Culture



Students explore visual arts, music, drama/ theatre, and dance with some attention to literature and applied arts. Students read, view, listen, and participate in the arts, learning fundamental vocabulary and concepts, and discussing such questions as: what are the arts; how are the arts created; how and what do

arts communicate; and how do the arts reflect society? The depth and quality of their arts observations and reflection, both written and oral, are assessed.

EDEC 247: Child & Adolescent Growth & Development (A)



Students will examine, analyze, and apply research, theories, and issues concerning basic biosocial, cognitive, and psychosocial developmental stages from conception through childhood and adolescence. For integrated lab students use a variety of instruments to observe and interact with individual children as a way of integrating theory and practice. Students will need access to an approved early childhood program to complete the required 45 lab hours. NOTE: Offered as hybrid coourse (components of face-to-face and online) in two locations; Hamilton and Helena

EDEC 273: Early Childhood Curriculum & Environments I (*)



Focus will be on curriculum content and methods in the areas of language and literacy; science; mathematics; social studies; the performing and visual arts; health and wellbeing; and physical development, skills, and fitness. Additionally, students will explore the developmentally appropriate environment and its effect on the learner in the physical, cognitive and social domains. Students will develop, implement, and evaluate relevant and meaningful curriculum and environments for young children with an emphasis on providing for the unique needs of each child. Students will need access to an approved early childhood program to complete the required 45 lab hours. Prereq: EDEC 247.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

EDU 201: Introduction to Education w/ Field Experience (a)



The first formal course in the Teacher Education Program, this course provides an introduction to the field of education and the relationships between schools and society. Students begin to evaluate the reasons chosen to become a teacher and the effects that decision will have on their lives. Students examine social, cultural, political, legal, economic, and historical issues within schools and how these issues impact professional educators. During this course, students begin to assemble the professional portfolio, which is a requirement for entry into the Teacher Education Program (TEP). The portfolio will be maintained throughout participation in the Teacher Education Program and is an integral part of the evaluation process. Students will complete a field experience in a school setting. The field experience placement will be made by the Director of Field Experiences.

EDU 222: Educational Psychology & Child Development (A)

Candidates will explore, compare, contrast, and analyze major psychological theories of development and learning. Teacher candidates will apply these theories to teaching practices. The major progression of physical, social, emotional, moral, and cognitive development and the ranges of individual variation within these domains of development in children from birth to adolescence will be emphasized. The course will emphasize the diversity of all learners with regard to learning styles, multiple intelligences, gender differences, cultural expectations, and exceptionality, as well as teaching approaches to accommodate these differences as well as normal psychological development.

GEO 115: Essentials of Geology



This course provides an introduction to geologic processes and Earth history. Students will learn about the interrelationships between biological systems, atmospheric processes, oceanic processes, crustal processes, and deep-Earth processes, and apply their understanding to Earth history and the impacts that their existence has on the natural environment. The course is taught in an online format, and is not intended for students majoring in Environmental Science or Environmental Interpretations.

PSYX 100: Introduction to Psychology (*)


A survey of the history, methodology, and

major theories of psychology. Topics include the influence of biology, individual experience, and culture on human consciousness. Students are expected to demonstrate understanding and comprehension of course content through course examinations and out-of-class writing assignments.

THTR 101: Introduction to Theatre



The basics of drama-including formal theatre, improvisational drama, and narrative film and television-are story, place, audience, and actor. Students actively explore the relationships between these elements in a lab setting, by creating scenes based on selections from literature, current and historical events, cuttings from film scripts, and more. They analyze the purposes of drama, and learn about a variety of "Western" as well as non-European traditions. They study the responsibilities of the actor, script writer, director, and design staff in theatre and film productions.

Safe @ Home (A)



Safe@Home by Safe Sitter® is a program designed for students in grades 4-6 and enables an adult that to facilitate an introductory level program to prepare students to care for themselves when parents are away for short periods of time. Safe@Home teaches students how to practice safe habits, how to prevent unsafe situations, and what to do when faced with dangers such as power failures or weather emergencies. Students are also introduced to the Safe Sitter® First Aid Chart and learn a system to help them assess and respond to injuries and illnesses. A Safe@Home student booklet (\$10) is required for each student.

Safe Sitter Essentials (89)



Safe Sitter® is for young teens in grades 6-8 who are ready to learn the skills they need to care for themselves and younger children. In addition, Safe Sitter® teaches young teens life and business skills, so that they know how to be prepared, be responsible, and be considerate whether they are babysitting or doing odd jobs for family, friends, or neighbors. Safe Sitter classes offered in southwest Montana; Butte, Dillon, and surrounding areas.

Safe Sitter Essentials: Girl Scouts (28)



Safe Sitter® Essentials is a 1-day class designed to prepare Girl Scout Cadettes to be safe when home alone, watching younger siblings, or babysitting. Completing a Safe Sitter® class will help Cadettes check off some of the requirements for the Babysitter Badge and First Aid Badge and earn a Safe Sitter® Patch. UMW will schedule upon demand with 5-8 students committed to taking the course.

SAT/ACT Prep Course (*)





This course will provide grammar and usage review specifically geared to the rules that you'll be tested on in the ACT/SAT. Learn how to maximize your time on reading comprehension passages and the passages in the science test. In addition to preparing for specific question types on both exams, this course will give you pointers in time management, anxiety relief, scoring, and general standardized test-taking. Weekly assignments encourage you to work with fellow classmates and the instructor to maximize your performance on all aspects of the verbal questions of the ACT and SAT.

Virtual Career Fair (A)



The Virtual Career Fair will be held in April 2021, and will deliver career exploration experiences for high school students (9th-12th grades) as well as middle school students (7th and 8th grades). The live-virtual event will involve over 25 vendors including business and industry representatives and colleges/training facilities. Students will explore interactive sessions and engage with vendors who will provide interactive, career-relevant demonstrations and presentations through multiple sessions within six Career Sectors (healthcare, agriculture, information technology, education, STEM and skills trades) which represent high demand careers available within Montana and across the nation. Sessions will include applicable topics such as exploring non-traditional career opportunities, career planning, financial aid & planning, job searching, dual enrollment for high school students and informative sessions designed for parents of high school students plus much more.
