chine to the Respiratory Therapy program. The machine is an Instrumentation Laboratories GEM® Premier™ 3000 with Intelligent Quality Management (iCM™), a fully automated Quality Assurance system. In addition to the standard quality control features, the company has equipped the machine with an

educational tutorial that will enhance our student's laboratory experience. Lew Staum, Illinois area sales representative, provided an introductory in-service for program faculty. He has offered to provide continued technical and instructional support.

Tony Schmitt, Respiratory Therapy faculty, reports that this machine performs several functions. It can be used as an actual blood gas machine and also as a teaching tool. The device plays a video that explains each step of the process from introducing blood into the machine, testing, and maintenance. Students also can interact with the machine by entering patient data, analyzing, and printing results.


