A Litany of Repentance is written for Ash Wednesday.

The responsive Prayers of the Church draw themes and *prayable thoughts* from the assigned passion history readings for each week. An additional prayer for Holy Week is based on two of the Revised Common Lectionary readings for Holy Week Tuesday, 1 Corinthians 1:18-31, John 12:20-36.

The responses are taken from the seven penitential psalms:

Ash Wednesday: Psalm 51 Second Midweek: Psalm 6 Third Midweek: Psalm 32 Fourth Midweek: Psalm 38 Fifth Midweek: Psalm 102 Sixth Midweek: Psalm 143 Holy Week: Psalm 130

The congregation's responses are printed in **bold type**, which by itself is an obvious direction for the congregation to respond. **M**: and **C**: may be added by the user if necessary.

Ash Wednesday

To be used with the Lectionary Readings for Ash Wednesday.

Litany of Repentance

Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

God, compassionate and gracious Father, **have mercy on us.**God, the Son, you bought us with your own blood, **have mercy on us.**God, the Holy Spirit, present with the penitent, **have mercy on us.**

Holy Trinity, merciful God, **have mercy on us.** Holy Trinity, forgiving God, **have mercy on us.**

You created us in your image.
When our first parents lost your image,
you restored it with your promise.
You led and trained Abraham in faith.
You were patient with stubborn Israel through their desert journey.
You pronounced forgiveness for David's sin
and restored his soul, have mercy on us.

You sent your prophets to restore and guide your people.
You sent John the Baptist as a preacher of repentance.
You sent your only Son as the great Prophet to reveal your will.
You sent him also as our great High Priest who offered himself for our sins, and he sits at your right hand, interceding for us, have mercy on us.

Forgive our worship of self, our lack of reverence for your name, our despising of preaching and your Word, our dishonor of our parents and authorities, our anger, hate and hurtfulness to our neighbors, our impurity of thoughts, words and actions, our misuse of our possessions and our abuse of our neighbors' possessions, our carelessness in speaking of others, our thoughts and desires for our neighbors' things, our thoughts and desires for our neighbors' people.

Have mercy on us, God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion, blot out our transgressions.

Work in us fear, love and trust for you.

Cleanse our lips to pray, praise and give you thanks.

Lead us to regard your Word as holy, and gladly hear and learn it.

Move us to honor, serve and obey those who represent you.

Show the value of all human life, that we regard it as your most precious gift.

Teach us respect for marriage, the foundation of family and society.

Teach us to be good stewards of all your gifts.
Fill our words about others with care and love.
Increase holy desires in us,
to respect the roles and responsibilities you have given other people,
and to focus on our needs rather than our wants.

Create in us pure hearts, O God, renew right spirits within us.

The Litany is an ancient form of prayer that recites lists of the attributes or works of God and lists of short petitions. The idea is that the attributes or works of God are the reasons we can ask God to have mercy. Then the list of petitions follows.

In this Litany of Repentance, after one list of the works of God and another list about God sending his messengers to call people to repentance, there is a list of ten petitions for forgiveness corresponding to the Ten Commandments, and another list of ten petitions for strength and guidance in obeying God's Ten Commandments.

Versicles and responses (a verse of Scripture arranged to be read by a leader with a response by the congregation) are very common in litanies. There are three versicles and responses from Psalm 51 in the second half of this litany. Imitating ancient litanies, this litany closes with "Lamb of God," a versicle and response, and a closing collect.

Second Midweek Wednesday

To be used with the Passion Reading from Mark 14:1-26

Jesus Christ, our precious Savior, you were anointed with expensive perfume and you were sold for thirty pieces of silver. You have redeemed us, not with silver or gold, but with your own precious blood.

Turn, Lord, and deliver us; save us because of your unfailing love.

Special prayers and intercessions may follow.

Hear us, Lord, as we bring you the thoughts and cares from the depths of our hearts.

Silent prayer.

Lord Jesus, moved by your love you went forward to suffering, just as the prophets had written. Show us our worth to you, and the new value you have given us since you shed your blood for us; you live and reign, now and forever.

Amen.

Based on two Revised Common Lectionary readings for Holy Week Tuesday, 1 Corinthians 1:18-31 and John 12:20-36.
