Chapter 17 revealed the whore of Babylon, and the sevenheaded beast she rides.

Chapter 18 looks at the fall of the city from which she ruled, "Babylon the great."

And he cried mightily with a strong voice, saying,
 Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every faul spirit.

and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird.





The angel announced the fall of the city of Babylon, just as Isaiah foretold the fall of the empire of Babylon.

Isaiah 21:8b-9

- ⁸ ... My lord, I stand continually upon the watchtower in the daytime, and I am set in my ward whole nights:
- ⁹ And, behold, here cometh a chariot of men, with a couple of horsemen.

And he answered and said, Babylon is fallen, is fallen; and all the graven images of her gods he hath broken unto the ground.

- ³ For **all nations** have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication,
 - and **the kings of the earth** have committed fornication with her,
 - and **the merchants of the earth** are waxed rich through the abundance of her delicacies.

The seductions of Babylon had spread throughout the entire world.

- And I heard another voice from heaven, saying,
 Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.
- ⁵ For her sins have reached unto heaven, and God hath remembered her iniquities.

But even in Babylon, God has his elect, and the angel calls them out lest they get caught in the storm.

- And I heard another voice from heaven, saying,
 Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.
- ⁵ For her sins have reached unto heaven, and God hath remembered her iniquities.



The Lord cries out the same thing to his people today:

2 Corinthians 6:17-18

- ¹⁷ Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you,
- ¹⁸ And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

- ⁶ Reward her even as she rewarded you, and double unto her double according to her works: in the cup which she hath filled fill to her double.
- ⁷ How much she hath glorified herself, and lived deliciously, so much torment and sorrow give her: for she saith in her heart, I sit a queen, and am no widow, and shall see no sorrow.

The double portion emphasizes the full punishment for her sins.



In contrast, God gives his children **double** the mercy and grace needed to pardon all their sins!

Isaiah 40:1-2

- ¹ Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God.
- ² Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned: for she hath received of the LORD'S hand double for all her sins.

The condemnation of the city of Babylon echoes the word of Isaiah against the Babylon of old:

Isaiah 47:8-9

- ⁸ Therefore hear now this, thou that art given to pleasures, that dwellest carelessly, that sayest in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me;
 - I shall not sit *as* a widow, neither shall I know the loss of children:
- ⁹ But these two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood: they shall come upon thee in their perfection for the multitude of thy sorceries, and for the great abundance of thine enchantments.

⁸ Therefore shall her plagues come in one day, death, and mourning, and famine; and she shall be utterly burned with fire: for strong *is* the Lord God who judgeth her.



Isaiah 47:8-9

- ⁸ Therefore hear now this, thou that art given to pleasures, that dwellest carelessly, that sayest in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me;
 - I shall not sit *as* a widow, neither shall I know the loss of children:
- ⁹ But these two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood: they shall come upon thee in their perfection for the multitude of thy sorceries, and for the great abundance of thine enchantments.

- ⁹ And the kings of the earth, who have committed fornication and lived deliciously with her, shall bewail her, and lament for her, when they shall see the smoke of her burning, ¹⁰ Standing afar off for the fear of her torment, saying, Alas, alas, that great city
 - Alas, alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city! for in one hour is thy judgment come.



¹¹ And the merchants of the earth shall weep and mourn over her; for no man buyeth their merchandise any more:





- ¹² The merchandise of gold, and silver, and precious stones, and of pearls, and fine linen, and purple, and silk, and scarlet, and all thyine wood, and all manner vessels of ivory, and all manner vessels of most precious wood, and of brass, and iron, and marble,
- ¹³ And cinnamon, and odours, and ointments, and frankincense, and wine, and oil, and fine flour, and wheat, and beasts, and sheep, and horses, and chariots, and slaves, and souls of men.
- ¹⁴ And the fruits that thy soul lusted after are departed from thee, and all things which were dainty and goodly are departed from thee, and thou shalt find them no more at all.

Revelation 18:15-17a

- ¹⁵ The merchants of these things, which were made rich by her, shall stand afar off for the fear of her torment, weeping and wailing,
- ¹⁶ And saying, Alas, alas, that great city, that was clothed in fine linen, and purple, and scarlet, and decked with gold, and precious stones, and pearls!
- ¹⁷ For in one hour so great riches is come to nought.





Revelation 18:17b-19 ¹⁷ And every shipmaster, and all the company in ships, and sailors, and as many as trade by sea, stood afar off, ¹⁸ And cried when they saw the smoke of her burning, saying, What city is like unto this great city! ¹⁹ And they cast dust on their heads, and cried, weeping and wailing, saying, Alas, alas, that great city, wherein were made rich all that had ships in the sea by reason of her costliness! for in one hour is she made desolate.

²⁰ Rejoice over her, thou heaven, and ye holy apostles and prophets;


for God hath avenged you on her.



²¹ And a mighty angel took up a stone like a great millstone, and cast it into the sea, saying,


Thus with violence shall that great city Babylon be thrown down, and shall be found no more at all.


and the sound of a millstone shall be heard no more at all in thee;


