How to get certified

Represented nurses

Two ways to get reimbursed:

- 1. Bargained benefit covers eligible certification and recertification exam fees (see website).
- 2. \$2500/year National Tuition Reimbursement benefit covers certification exam fees and prep courses.

Non-represented nurses

\$3000/year National Tuition Reimbursement benefit covers certification exam fees and prep courses.

Exam Prep

Registered nurses in pursuit of advancing their clinical knowledge may have access to certification preparation courses located online in KP HealthStream.

- 32+ courses cover a wide variety of popular national certifications, including CCRN, CNOR, RN-NIC, and many more.
- Access to these courses is available 24/7 so that nurses can study at a time most convenient to their busy schedules.
