



A virtual presentation by Michael Palmer on "Eric Mendelsohn: Synagogue Architect with a Vision."

His story is fascinating and relevant, since the Jewish issues in his life and times are with us still today.

Eric Mendelsohn designed and built four synagogues in the United States that became benchmarks for modern American synagogue architecture, as Neville Teller wrote in the Jerusalem Post. The aim of my book is to bring Mendelsohn's lyrical architecture to the attention of contemporary Jewish communities and to discuss the roots of his Jewish identity, from which his synagogue architecture arose.

#### Chanukah Blessings



Candles are added to the *Chanukiah* from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Chanukah, kindle the Chanukah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the *Shamash* - the helper candle - first using it to kindle the rest of the Chanukah lights; say or sing:






