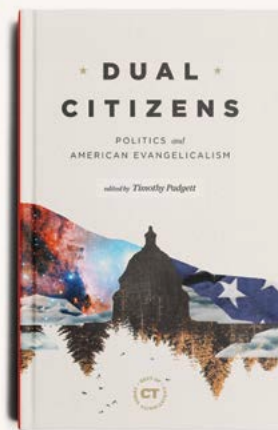
When responding to objections that both evil and God can exist, many resort to a “free will defense,” where God is not the creator of evil but of human freedom, by which evil is possible. Williams argues that much thinking on free will fails to carve out the necessary

distinction between an autonomous will and an unforced will. With clarity, precision, and charity, he judges the merits and shortcomings of the relational free will defense while offering a philosophically and biblically robust alternative that draws from theologians of the past to point a way forward.

LESSON 5 O-Stem Nouns (Second Declension)

We identify verbs by the stems and endings they use. Similarly, we identify nouns and adjectives by their case endings. Like verbs, nouns and adjectives consist of three parts: root, stem, and ending. The case system in Greek includes three types of stems: O-stems, A-stems, and consonant stems. These three types of stems combine with case endings to create three patterns, called “declensions.”
Nearly all nouns in the O-stem pattern—or “second declension”—are masculine (see Lesson 7 for further discussion of gender and nouns). These nouns all have an *o/e* variable vowel for a stem before the case ending. O-stem nouns are declined as follows:
