Sadly the annual Cheese & Wine party in aid of the Churchyard had to be cancelled due to a change of date and therefore lack of advance publicity and support. It is not intended to hold the event later in the year but donations towards the Churchyard fund are always welcome and would go towards maintaining the graveyard and keeping the grass cut both at the Church and outside the Church Room.

At the recent PCC meeting considerable discussion was given towards fund raising and whether to hold a Fete this year. It was decided that after the success of our Summer Supper last year at East Penrest, a similar event would be held in 2018 and every effort would be made to form a Fete Committee to hold a Fete in 2019. This would require finding a new venue as well as a team of volunteers. There is no requirement to be a Church member to be on the Fete Committee. We are just looking for people who support the Church and wish to see it continue to provide the community with its present level of services and pastoral care.

Many of you will have noticed that the Church clock is now back in working order and striking again, although it does require one or two small tweaks to its new automatic system to make it completely accurate. A final sum of £3319 was raised to help pay for the clock repairs, which was a marvellous effort given the other demands on Church finances. We are delighted that we are now able to go ahead with the restoration of the lovely East window, which will require scaffolding to be erected for a week or two but hopefully will not cause much disruption to our services.

She enjoyed and embraced village life and was a friend to many. She will be sadly missed. She died on the 5th May with her funeral being held at Lezant Parish Church on the 24th May. This was a very well attended event which paid tribute to the love and respect in which she was held by the community. 



aim of them being able to attend the Russell Group Universities. They have been mentored by Professor Colin Webb, Professor Fenella Wojnaowska and Brenda Hooton. As part of this programme the young scientists have been asked to present their favourite presentations on subjects which inspire them to tonight's meeting of CaféScientifique, Launceston. There will be a mixture of physics, engineering, and biomedical science. JULY WALK

Calstock—Along the waterfront and over the hill Wednesday 4th July 2018

Meeting Point/Parking Directions. Calstock Quay car park (free) behind village hall. Grid ref: (Explorer 108) SX436 684. Post code PL18 9QA. Further parking at Calstock Station PL18 9QY approx 5 mins walk away.



Time: 10.00 am for prompt 10.30am start returning at 3pm (very approx).

From the rear of the car park we follow the river through to the bottom of the Danescombe Valley, which we visited one winter a few years back. The path up the valley is not too bad – a steady but not too steep climb up through the woods past industrial remains, up to a lane. Then there is a steep climb up the lane to The Butts, before we descend a steep lane to pick up a narrow footpath gradually uphill. After a short uphill stretch on a main road - the last bit of uphill - we head to Calstock Church along the road and then back downhill to the river on quiet lanes & a bridleway.

Toilets: Public toilets at the car park in Calstock. We may be able to use the loo at St Andrews Church around lunchtime for a donation.

Refreshments: Bring a packed lunch. There is a convenience store in a bus in the car park that will be open before we set off if you need to buy a picnic (but not when we get back).

Dogs: Well-controlled dogs on leads please as we are on using lanes for parts of the walk.

Distance/difficulty/hazards: About 5¾ miles. Traffic on lanes & roads. No stiles or steps.





Eg, a return journey from Treburley to Launceston will cost £10 in total. The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Pre-booking the day before can sometimes help. Remember, the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.

dens instead. The rain kept away and we spent time wandering through the gardens, walked down by the river and finished with tea at the hotel.


