- ♦ Deadline is April 30th at 12:01am

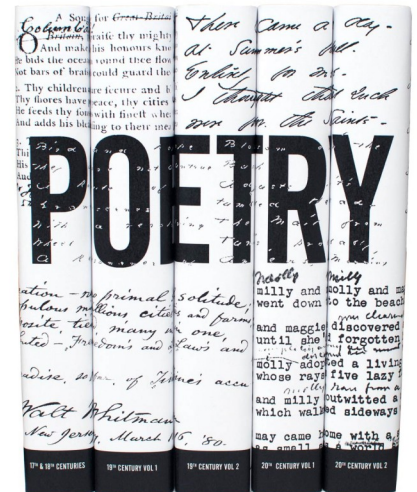


