


Ashcreek Playschool Newsletter March 2021

Life Cycles, Magical Creatures, and Read Across America




Spring begins this month, Roses! Our theme this month is "A Look at Life Cycles". This month we will talk about the Life Cycle of a butterfly mostly, but also the life cycle of a seed and a flower. We will have some real butterflies in our classroom! We will be able to see the different stages from egg to larvae (caterpillar) to pupa (chrysalis) to butterfly. We will demonstrate a different stage each day during Free Play activities. One project will showcase the symmetry of a butterfly. What is symmetry? This will be a great Circle Time topic.

We will also plant some seeds during a Free Play activity. We will have to patiently watch the seeds turn into a plant. What a cool process! Amazing how the combination of food, water, soil and sunlight can grow food! We will be talking about Life Cycles but also focusing a little on engineering and architecture.

We will make Fairy houses throughout the month as well as a Leprechaun Trap for St. Patrick's Day. Leprechauns are attracted to gold so we will use gold coins as bait for our trap. The Leprechaun has to grant us wishes in order to be set free. We'll start out with some plain cardboard boxes and see where our imaginations take us. Teachers and kiddos are encouraged to wear lots of green on Wednesday, March 17th.

Dr. Seuss's birthday is coming up on March 2nd . I encourage Teachers and kiddos to dress up as a character from a Dr. Seuss book that day. We will spend the day reading Dr. Seuss books and doing Dr. Seuss activities.

I enjoyed having the chance to meet with all of you and talk about your wonderful children! In March we will get a close look at life cycles as we observe real caterpillars as they go through the stages to become beautiful butterflies in our own classroom. We will also learn about plant life cycles, including planting our own seeds, taking care of them, and watching them grow!

March 2nd is Dr. Seuss's birthday, and we will be celebrating Read Across America all week long, March 1st -5th . Our class will be reading, reading, reading every day in every way!

Monday: One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish (Wear red or blue!)

Tuesday: Cat in the Hat (Dress like a character from Dr. Seuss or wear your favorite hat!)

Wednesday: Wacky Wednesday (Dress backwards, inside out, or mismatched!)

Thursday: Green Eggs and Ham (Would you read with a fox? Bring a stuffy to read to!) **Friday:** Oh, the Thinks You Can Think! (Bring your favorite book to share with the class!)

This month, we will also be planning and building our own leprechaun traps. We will brainstorm ideas as a class, then we will break into pairs to draw and write out our plans, and finally, we will use a variety of materials to make our traps come to life. Everyone is encouraged to wear green on March 17th!

Teacher Beth's Corner

Starfish Breathing is a mindful breathing skill that children can visually learn, self-manage, and practice literally anywhere, in any situation, when they need to self-regulate.

Parents and teachers can print out a visual picture of how to do starfish breathing. The children can practice and use the skill when they feel themselves becoming upset or irritable. This can help replace inappropriate behaviors such as screaming with the starfish breathing.

The book "DBT Therapeutic Activity Ideas for Working with Teens" offers the following description and Handout Instructions:

- Describe starfish breathing with one outstretched hand
- Spread your fingers out wide
- Use your pointer finger to trace along the outside of each finger starting at the base of the thumb
- Bring awareness to your breathing and breathe in, move the pointer finger up the finger
- Then exhale as you move your finger down the other side
- Keep tracing each finger, and following with your breath, until ending at the base of the pinkie finger


