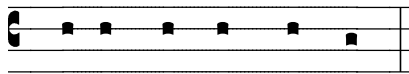

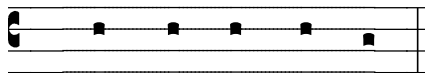

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

All **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

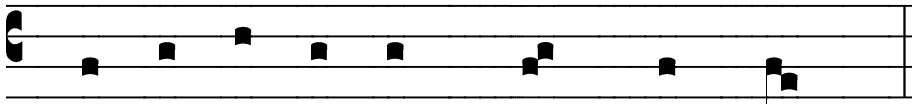

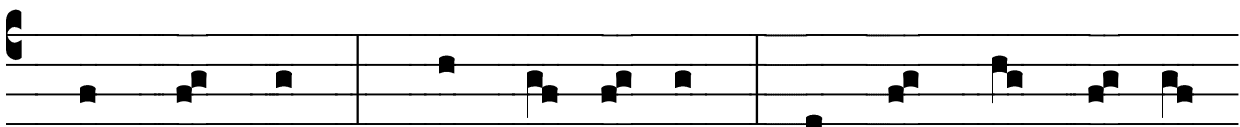

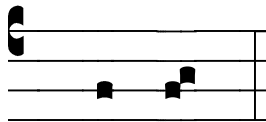
