COVID-19 Update for Parents

Good news – parents and carers are now allowed on school sites! As restrictions are easing, many of activities can return to normal and some activities can return in a modified COVID safe format.

The key changes are:

- We can now mix cohort groups so Bands and Strings can go back to ability based not grade based groups
- Buddy classes across the school can recommence
- Parents and carers can stay in the school grounds whilst waiting for children to complete extra-curricular activities such as swimming classes, tutorials, dance etc
- Friday Night Seahorses can have parent spectators outside the Pool Area (we have capacity limits for inside so students will be seated in the grandstand). Parents are welcome to watch on Pool Playground.
- We still ask that parents 'Kiss and Drop' in the mornings so that we can quickly get children into classes for learning time
- We can recommence some Community Events including Working Bees
- Onsite after hours P&C Meetings are permitted with a COVID Safety Plan
- We can invite some parents to important assemblies eg Lindfield Blue (capacity issues apply)
- Singing can recommence with no limits on numbers
- Visitors for teacher meetings, enrolment interviews etc still need to use the QR Code and sign the Visitors Book

Please note that physical distancing of adults (1.5 metres apart) remains in force at all times.

Intake area change

Key information

- Lindfield Public School's intake area is changing from 2022 onwards.
- This change affects new enrolments into our school from 2022.
- There may also be a change to the designated high school for some families if they are designated to Chatswood High School in 2021.
- Visit schoolfinder.education.nsw.gov.au to look for your family's designated high school and more information.

What is an intake area?

Most NSW Government schools have specific local enrolment areas, also known as a designated intake area. They are determined by the Department of Education to ensure that there are enough places in schools for students who reside in their local enrolment area.

Why is our intake area being changed?

The population in our school's local and surrounding area is changing. Adjusting our intake area boundary will help to balance future enrolments at schools in our area.

How were the new intake areas determined?

The process was informed by demographic advice about projected enrolments in the local area and in consultation with local primary and secondary school Principals.

When will the change take place?

The intake area adjustment will apply to all new K-6 enrolments commencing their year in 2022.

What if I now live in the new intake area but I want to enrol my child in our previous in-area or other school?

The standard process will apply for requests for out-of-area enrolments in accordance with the department's enrolment policy.

Please contact the Principal of the school where you are seeking enrolment for further information.

I have a child already attending Lindfield Public School, can they stay there if I am now living in the new intake area?

Yes they can. There is no change for students already attending Lindfield Public School. They can complete their education to Year 6.

What happens if I currently have a child enrolled in my previous in-area school and I want to enrol their sibling in the same school, which is now deemed out-of-area?

Families living in the area affected by the change who have a child/children already enrolled at a different school are able to stay at that school and also able to enrol other siblings.

Where can I enrol my child commencing high school in 2022?

Please visit the School Finder website at schoolfinder.education.nsw.gov.au. Select the **high school** button and enter your residence in the **search bar** to see which high school is designated for your area

Where can I find out more information about this change?

Zone Swimming Carnival Results 2021

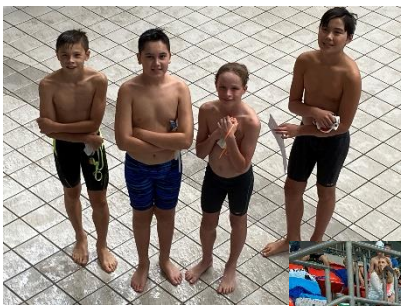

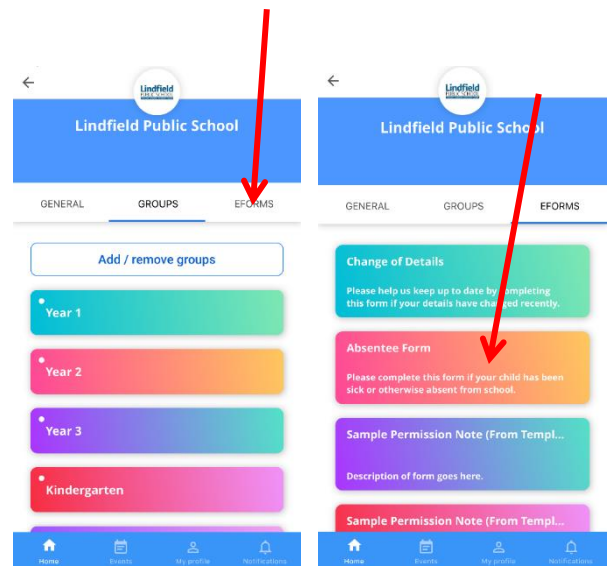

At Lindfield Public School in 2021, we have a small number of children who could have a potentially life threatening allergic reaction. They are found across our school from Kindergarten to Year 6. How can parents help these children?



- Choose alternative sandwich spreads to peanut butter and Nutella. Inform your child that these foods can trigger an anaphylactic reaction.
- Reinforce the school's **NO FOOD SHARING** message.

Exciting new changes to borrowing!

- All staff will continue to use hand sanitiser before handling books as an advised precaution.
- Library staff will continue to clean high touch surfaces between stage group classes.
- Library staff will no longer be removing available reserved books from the shelves. Books can still be reserved online, but students will be able to collect any available books themselves during their borrowing time. We will only collect and store reserved books when returned from 'on loan'.
- Books will no longer be quarantined and will instead be safely shelved during the day.
- Borrowing limits will return to pre-COVID amounts: 1-2: 2 books, Year 3-4: 3 books, 5-6: 5 books. Kindergarten will continue to borrow one book a week until Term 2 as this is already our normal routine.

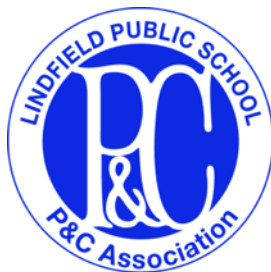
