Buckingham Palace

Buckingham Palace serves as both the office and London residence of Her Majesty The Queen. It is one of the few working royal palaces remaining in the world today.

The Royal Mews (on the grounds of Buckingham Palace) is one of the finest working stables still in existence, responsible for the training of the Windsor Greys and Cleveland Bays, the horses that pull the royal carriages. Admission: Adult £8.25

St. Paul's Cathedral

Come and experience the glory of St. Paul's Cathedral and see how it's iconic dome dominates the London skyline. Built between 1675 and 1710, the catherdral has gone through a £40 million programme of cleaning and repair work for its 300th anniversary and the work has transformed the exterior and interior of the building. There is so much to discover throughout this vast cathedral including The Aspe, an American Memorial Chapel dedicated to servicemen and women who died during World War II. Also there is The Quire, where the choir and priest sit during services and is home to the cathedrals grand Organ and High Altar.

British Museum

The British Museum is a museum of human history and culture. It houses more than thirteen million items originating from all continents of the world. It attracts over four million visitors a year, and with the extensive galleries, it's not surprising! It is situated on Great Russell Street and the nearest tube stations are Holborn and Tottenham Court Road. Admission: Free, donation welcome!

Victoria & Albert Museum

The worlds greatest museum of art and design is home to over 4.5 million objects. It was founded in 1852, and was originally known as the South Kensington Museum. It contains 5000 years of art from all cultures, from all over the world, including photography, sculptures, art and textiles.

Museum of London

Documents the history of London from the prehistoric to the present day. The museum is located close to the Barbican Centre, as part of the striking Barbican complex of buildings created in the 1960s and 70s as an innovative approach to re-development within a bomb damaged area of the City. It is a few minutes' walk north of St Paul's Cathedral, overlooking the remains of the Roman city wall and on the edge of the oldest part of London, known as the City, now the financial district. It is primarily concerned with the social history of London and its inhabitants throughout history.

Natural History Museum

Distance: 2.0 miles about 5 minutes (30 minute walk)

The heart of London shopping, bustling Oxford Street has more than 300 shops, designer outlets and landmark stores. Home to the legendary Selfridges, it also boasts a range of famous department stores such as John Lewis and Debenhams scattered among every well-known high street chain imaginable.

Regent Street and Jermyn Street

Distance: 1.6 miles about 4 minutes (22 minute walk)

An impressively elegant shopping street, Regent Street offers a good range of mid-priced fashion stores alongside some of the city's oldest and most famous shops, including Hamleys, Liberty and The Apple Store. Nearby, historic Jermyn Street is renowned for men's clothing shops and is so typically British it's enough to bring out the old-fashioned gent in anyone! Jermyn Street is particularly well known for its bespoke shirt makers such as Charles Tyrwhitt and shoe shops including John Lobb.

Bond Street and Mayfair

Distance: 0.9 miles about 3 minutes (14 minute walk)

If you are looking for high end designer clothes, or just love luxury window shopping, New Bond Street, Old Bond Street and Mayfair are the ideal places to go for some extravagant retail therapy. Popular with celebrities on a spree, this is probably London's most exclusive shopping area, home to big names including Burberry, Louis Vuitton and Tiffany & Co. Neighbouring South Molton Street boasts iconic fashion store, Browns.

Westfield London

Distance: 4.3 miles about 12 minutes

More than just a shopping centre, Westfield London is an innovative place to shop, to eat, and to meet. Inside the largest urban shopping centre in Europe you'll find high street favorites including Debenhams, Next, Marks & Spencer and House of Fraser. There are also more than 275 luxury, premium and high-street retailers showcasing over 700 brands including Louis Vuitton, Jimmy Choo, All Saints and Ted Baker as well as a cinema, gym, several bars and restaurants.

Carnaby Street

Distance: 1.7 miles about 7 minutes

Carnaby Street is a pedestrian shopping street in London, located in the Soho district, near Oxford Street and Regent Street. It is home to numerous fashion and lifestyle retailers, including a large number of independent fashion boutiques.

Kings Road

Distance: 2.6 miles about 13 minutes

Shopping is the King's Road's main obsession – here you'll find an eclectic mix of trendy boutiques, unique labels, designer shops and high-street staples, alongside a vast array of cafes and eateries. It's also a great place for inspirational interior design, with Peter Jones, Heal's, Cath Kidston and Habitat all vying for attention. Be sure to check out the store where punk was born in the 70s, Vivienne Westwood's shop and the treasure trove of antiques at the Chelsea Antiques Market.

Knightsbridge

Distance: 1.9 miles about 7 minutes (29 minute walk)

Visitors from around the world flock to Knightsbridge and Brompton Road to visit the illustrious shops and department stores. This is the place to go if you're looking for prestigious brands and up-to-the-minute trends from the world's fashion elite. Best known for Harrods and Harvey Nichols, you'll also find a whole host of big-name fashion designers on Sloane Street. Showing Knighsbridge caters to all tastes, there's a big branch of Topshop opposite Harrods!

Savile Row

Distance: 1.7 miles about 4 minutes (27 minute walk)

Known worldwide as the home of bespoke British tailoring, Savile Row is the place to come if you want a handmade suit crafted the old-fashioned way (with a price tag to match). Credited with inventing the tuxedo Henry Poole & Co– also the first Savile Row tailor – is still cutting cloth at no. 15. Other big names include Gieves & Hawkes, H. Huntsman & Sons and Ozwald Boateng. On the corner of this "golden mile" of tailoring you'll also find the flagship Abercrombie & Fitch store.

Notting Hill

Distance: 3.4 miles about 10 minutes

Famous worldwide thanks to the film of the same name, Notting Hill offers a vast array of small, unique shops selling unusual and vintage clothing, rare antiques, quirky gifts, books and organic food. There's also the unmissable Portobello Road Market – a mile-long (1.6km) street with a vibrant array of different stalls set out daily. Nearby Westbourne Grove offers more high-end shopping, with stylish designer shops dotted between a mix of quirky boho boutiques, hip cafes and art galleries.

Canary Wharf

Distance: 6.9 miles about 20 minutes

Canada Square, in London's Docklands, is home to many of the UK's leading businesses, but it also has a great shopping centre, open seven days a week. Sleek and modern, Canada Square boasts more than 200 shops, with all the major high-street chains as well as a good selection of designer stores. Look out for big names like Oasis and Zara and luxurious fragrance store Jo Malone. chilled-out shopping experiences.



Spa London

Distance: 6 miles about 20 minutes

Treatments range from an Escape in the City Salt Scrub (a 25-minute cleansing that should remove all trace of London grime) to the spa's signature Gym & Tonic in which your body is cleansed, body brushed and exfoliated, before being treated to an aromatherapy massage and warm marine mask. Indulgence without the price-tag Location: York Hall Leisure Centre, Old Ford Road, London, E2 9PJ

The Porchester Spa

Distance: 2.9 miles about 13 minutes

The Porchester Spa, located in a spectacular 1929 building, is one of London's more authentic spa experiences –This is the spa to come to if you like pools (they have a proper swimming pool, plus a plunge pool for cooling off after a stint in one of the three Turkish hot rooms). People come here for no-nonsense treatments (like the Hot Towels Treatment, £30, for 30 minutes) at affordable prices, including wraps, facials and massages

Away Spa

Distance: 1.0 miles about 2 minutes (15 minute walk)

The Away Spa offers decadent treatments, which seem primarily aimed at helping you detox after a big night. Revitalize with one of our delightful Spa Signature treatments or revive your soul in our Sauna and Steam Rooms. Location: W London, Wardour Street, London, W1D 6QF

MayFair Spa

Distance: 1.5 miles about 7 minutes

An impressive wet room, great treatments and striking Middle Eastern statues make this one of central London's most tranquil hotel spas. Spa-goers are encouraged to lounge in the relaxation area post-treatment as well as to indulge in the sauna and steam chamber, which features fibre-optic lights on the ceiling to simulate a night's sky. Spa Illuminata

Distance: 0.3 miles about 2 minutes (4 minute walk)

This Mayfair spa delivers one of the best massages. 'It's Swedish aromatherapy with a bit of shiatsu thrown in,' before being smothered in balm and digging out every recalcitrant knot with the vigour you always ask for but rarely get. Even palms and toes are attended to. There are more unusual treatments too. The Madagascar Escape, takes you on a 'voyage to the beautiful island' through essential oils and no less than 52 acupressure-style techniques. Location: South Audley Street, London, W1K 2QS

Distance: 3.5 miles about 11 minutes

Discover this gourmet's paradise in London. With a range of fresh produce including fruit, vegetables and meat, as well as condiments, bakery treats and delicious street food Borough Market is great for lunch or grocery shopping. There's also a wide selection of special ingredients and indulgent treats.

Camden market

Distance: 3.8 miles about 12 minutes

Camden Lock is the central hub of Camden's huge market. Here you'll find an extensive range of goods from designer clothes and accessories, to one-off pieces of art, food and furnishings. There's also designer workshops, studios, stalls, shops, cafes, restaurants and bars.

Portobello Road Market

Distance: 3.9 miles about 12 minutes

Portobello Road has been a market since the 1800s but became particularly famous for its antiques in the 1950s. Now there are numerous stalls offering everything from fruit and bread to posters, clothes, music and, of course antiques!

Columbia Road Flower Market

Distance: 5.2 miles about 20 minutes

Anyone with green fingers should make a stop here for plants, shrubs, bulbs and trees. This colorful street market is a must-see. You can also pick up gardening accessories from the surrounding shops, and make sure you take home some of the gorgeous cut-flowers on offer.

Old Spitalfields Market

Distance: 5 miles about 20 minutes

Popular covered market selling everything from clothes to food to artwork. Nearby you'll also find specialist shops, hairdressers and restaurants. Once you've finished shopping, you won't be stuck for entertainment options; the cool bars and clubs of Shoreditch are just up the road.

Broadway Market

Distance: 6.7 miles about 25 minutes
