#	Discussion Items	Summary
1	Welcome	Secretary Torres opened the meeting with a welcome to members and attendees.
2	Approval of December 10, 2020 Meeting Minutes	A motion to approve the minutes was made by Teresa Osborne and seconded by Heshie Zinman. The minutes of the December 10, 2020 meeting were unanimously approved.
3	Commonwealth Updates	<ul> <li>PA Department of Aging (PDA) - Secretary Torres reported on the following:</li> <li>Engaging MCOs/OLTL – Meetings to address procedural and workflow issues were conducted by Steven Horne and discussions over the past three months have been very productive.</li> <li>Financial Exploitation Task Force – Task force continues its work to develop solutions that are more proactive in identifying, addressing, and preventing instances of abuse. PDA working with public and private sector representatives. Several interagency MOUs have been entered into to facilitate information sharing.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Pilot Program with Slippery Rock University – Program is expanding into the spring semester. More students, older adults and AAAs have engaged for the spring semester.</li> </ul>
	• <b>Protective Services</b> – Consultant, RTI, has been engaged in order to review data capture, look at workflow, provide recommendations to improve data collection, make systems more efficient and enhance outcome data to help make appropriate referrals, measure effectiveness of service, etc. Next steps include evaluating actions to implement recommendations.
	• <b>Dementia Friends</b> – Work completed with Jewish Healthcare Foundation to make Pennsylvania dementia friendly. Almost 5,600 individuals have been trained to become a Dementia Friend and 224 have been trained as Dementia Champions to help train others.
	<b>PA Department of Human Services (DHS)</b> – Jennifer Hale, Director of the Bureau of Policy and Regulatory Management for DHS' Office of Long-Term Living (OLTL), provided departmental updates as follows:
	<ul> <li>Provided information to the Council on the community vaccination strategy for phase 1A. Guidance was also added for Adult Protective Services staff. Meetings were held to discuss Rite Aid/MCOs collaboration to coordinate vaccines administration.</li> </ul>
	PA Department of Health (DOH) – Kristen Faust, Deputy Director, Office of the Deputy Secretary, PA Department of Health
	<ul> <li>Provided updates on Covid-19 vaccinations and data across PA. There is more predictability coming from a Federal Level.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Orders were issued for providers that mandated 80% of doses be distributed within 7 days of receipt. Additional requirement added that vaccine providers must have phone option for scheduling vaccine appointments.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Q: Bob Marino: Vaccine Dashboard: Why is there a difference between figures on vaccine map and those on the table by county? I'm looking at 877k versus 1.3 million administered.</li> <li>A: The numbers don't entirely match because that 1.3 number is partial vaccinations administered; 436k is whole (both doses)</li> <li>Q: Rep. Gary Day: On the Your Turn Tool, once a senior signs up to register, what are the guarantees? Is there redundancy built into that to make sure that everyone is accounted for?</li> <li>A: The Your Turn tool is one to use to find out if they are eligible. It is not a registration tool that would sign them up for an appointment or necessarily match them with an appointment. We have some additional thoughts we are having around that. It's most helpful for those in 1B to find out when it's their turn. We share the concern and want to make sure those in 1A are getting vaccinated as quickly as possible.</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Q: Representative Samuelson – Clarification – Are home and community-based caregivers a part of the 1A vaccination effort?</li> <li>A: Yes, caregivers, paid and unpaid, are a part of the 1A group.</li> <li>PA Insurance Department – Emily Holladay, Deputy Legislative Director</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Director</li> <li>December 27<sup>th</sup> - Trump signed the "No Surprises Act", which states that providers and facilities need to give patients the cost information prior to the service. It goes into effect in 2022.</li> <li>PENNIE open enrollment period is from February 15- May 15, 2021.</li> </ul>
		<b>PA Department of Transportation (PennDot)</b> - Danielle Spila, Director of the Bureau of Public
		<ul> <li>Public transportation – Ridership is down. Federal funding from the Cares Act is helping to maintain services</li> <li>Shared ride – offer free transportation for vaccine appointments for seniors funded through existing programs at the AAAs</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Q: Teresa Osbourne: Many AARP Members are asking about the upcoming toll increases. When is that list going to be available?</li> <li>A: The list was just posted today.</li> </ul>
5	Vet Connect	<ul> <li>PA Department of Miltary &amp; Veterans Affairs (DMVA)- Richard Adams, Acting Director, State Veterans Homes and Commandant of SW Veterans Center, PA Department of Military &amp; Veterans Affairs. presented the following information:         <ul> <li>Each Veteran home follows safety guidelines to provide safe environment for employees and staff veterans. Three clinics are scheduled for residents and staff in homes. Data was provided of estimated vaccination results in each facility.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
6	Senator Casey's Office Update	<ul> <li>Samantha Koehler –</li> <li>Congressional activity focused on pandemic response. Senate Select Committee on Aging – 1<sup>st</sup> congressional hearing on social isolation and racial disparities.</li> <li>Congress also working on reconciliation bill. Contact information was provided to the Council for future connections.</li> <li>Senator Casey's focus is on fraud and scams. They are working on their annual book that outlines the year's scams and fraud.</li> <li>There is a reconciliation package being worked on. It includes provisions for senior services and facility support.</li> <li>Q: Secretary Torres: Senator Casey recently held a hearing on technology, is this something that will have continued interest?</li> <li>A: Yes, we have been working with the AAAs and hearing the different issues. The Access Act was just introduced and would bring technology into nursing homes and other facilities.</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Q: Secretary Torres: Can you talk more about how the reconciliation package might support AAAs in the vaccination efforts?</li> <li>A: I am not yet sure if extra funding for this will be included in the package. There is currently \$1.4 billion for OAA services.</li> <li>Q: Margie Zelenak: Will there be funding going directly toward personal care and assisted living facilities, or is the funding going through the state?</li> <li>A: There is not specific funding for this currently, but it may be added in the Senate.</li> </ul>
