



We're Off to See the Wizard...

**Zoom Book Discussions**

When the library reopened to the public, we were challenged

with continuing to provide core library services. One of our commitments has always been connecting books to readers. Therefore, it was essential to navigate a new way of providing book discussions. Akin to Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz*, we could empathize with the sentiment, "We're not in Kansas anymore." Like her, we had to meet our obstacles with wisdom, courage, and heart.

Follow the yellow brick road...

First we encountered the Scarecrow who inspired us to use our brain. We taught ourselves Zoom technology, practiced relentlessly in front of green screens, and winced when our microphones shrieked with feedback. Because we were one of the few libraries that had reopened, we needed to find a way to secure multiple copies of the books. Eventually we triumphed, metaphorically locked arms, and proceeded on our journey.

We next met the Cowardly Lion. He reminded us that we had already exhibited courage by learning an unfamiliar technology. We already possessed the skills to facilitate thoughtful discussions. It became apparent to be successful we needed our members to have the courage to take the leap *with* us. They, too, needed to embrace the concept of connecting from their homes through personal laptops, phones, and tablets. We scheduled individual technology training sessions. We decided that it was crucial that a second person serve as technical support to troubleshoot during live discussions.

Finally, we encountered the Tin Man. He explained that the heart of our endeavor had been with us all along in the form of our very dear book group members! Masked up and socially distanced, we sat down at the library's conference room table. Our hearts raced with excitement as our first participant joined the Zoom...then a second...and a third. One by one our faithful members all joined us. Our world rushed from black & white to glorious Technicolor--our own dazzling Emerald City! It was then that we knew all our efforts had been worthwhile. It wasn't as easy as clicking our heels together, but we did it!
