



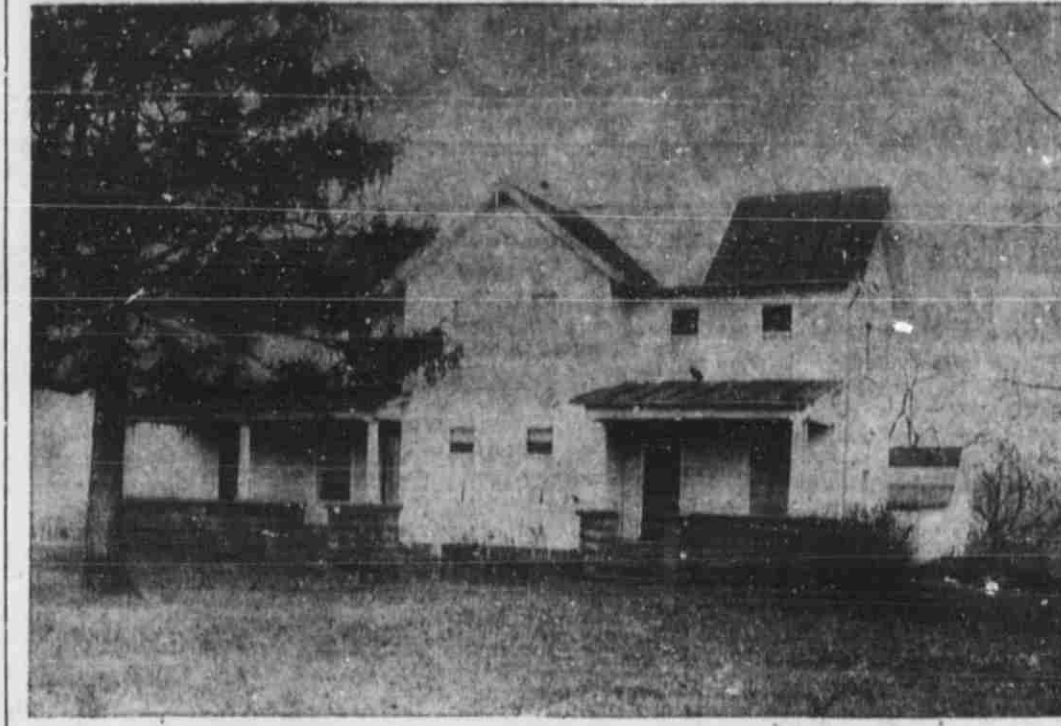
**Conservation Meeting Authorizes Number of Land Transactions**

The Conservation Commission authorized a number of land transactions at its recent October meeting at Higgins Lake training school. A total of 27 acres of hunting lands in Pigeon River state forest, 926 acres of game lands in nine

southern Michigan game areas and 384 acres in the newly-established Mukkawago Lake state park purchase unit were authorized for purchase. A fishing site on Lower Herring Lake, Benzie county, was authorized.

A new Pittman-Robertson game area on land now in Waterloo recreation area was authorized. Other adjacent lands will be purchased to fill out the game area. Timbers sales totaling \$22,061 were approved. Flowage easements, land exchanges and gas and oil lease sales were authorized. The Commission next meets in Lansing, November 8-9.

**Two Centennial Farms Named Here; Hatch, Potter**



Mr. and Mrs. Willis Hatch, of Nash avenue (M-59) have been notified that their farm has been designated a "centennial farm" by the Michigan Historical Commission. This means that a member of the same family has owned the farm for over 100 years. Mrs. Hatch, formerly Arlene Behler, was born here; at the age of 11 she and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Allen Behler, moved to Lake Odessa. Last winter Mr. and Mrs. Hatch purchased the farm from her father, who had rented it to tenant farmers for the past few years. They were all set to move in, in April, and did, 4 days after the April 3 tornado ripped through. Part of the farm, Mrs. Hatch states, must have been there since the farm was purchased in 1833 from John Dash and wife by her great-grandfather, Leonard Behler—because, everyone states that when the tornado destroyed a portion of the barn, some of it remained standing, that which was put together with old wooden pegs—it was the strongest part, and probably had been standing for many, many years.

**Offer Kent Dairy Farmers New Way Of Checking Herds**

The Kent County dairy farmers will have the opportunity to increase the efficiency of their dairy herd by participating in the new "Weigh-a-Day-a-Month" testing program. The new record keeping plan offers the dairyman a simple way to analyze cows in the present herd as a market for feed and labor. This is also a low cost guide for culling out low producers in the present herd. Under this program, an accurate basis for feeding according to production can be accomplished. This program can serve as a valuable yardstick for selecting herd replacement from better cows in the

**Food from Sewage**  
From sewage to milk might well be the title of recent research at the University of California where algae plus sunshine salvaged the nutrients from sewage. It is stated that a fifth of the total protein required by all the cattle in the United States could be produced by this algae treatment of sewage waste. The resultant protein-rich algae, also containing certain minerals and vitamins, is harvested, dried, and sterilized prior to feeding the cattle. Further, algae culture makes sewage water fit for irrigation. In California and Arizona this use alone might pay for the treatment. This subject will grow in importance as the population of the U. S. A. increases probably to 200 million within 25 years—as well as a rapidly increasing world population.

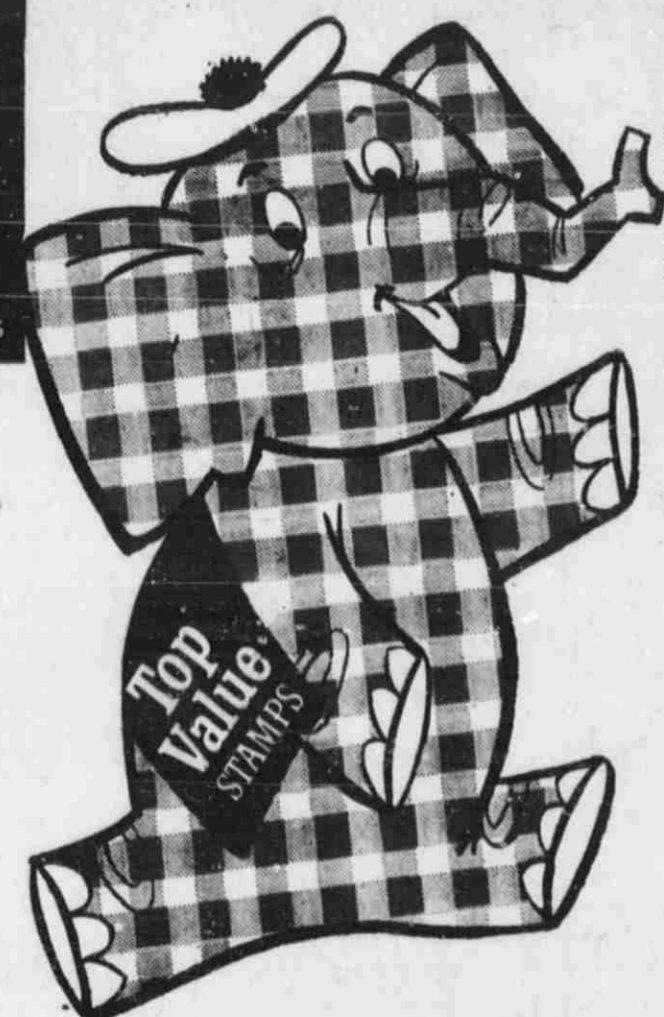
