Educators, researchers, school administrators, parents, and anyone interested in any sector of schooling are likely to agree on one thing: Students benefit from having great teachers. Public discourse on issues in education focuses largely on the need to improve public schools. Popular media, university and foundational research, state and federal agencies, as well as many others are attempting to discern what is at the heart of school improvement and student learning. A common issue that emerges repeatedly from this discourse is teacher quality. Many educational organizations have turned their attention to issues of how to identify, find, measure, develop, and/or keep great teachers. As 75 percent to 85 percent of school financial resources are attributed to teachers' salaries, school leaders are also fiscally motivated to hire, develop, and retain the best teachers. (We will address these topics from our research in subsequent blogs.)

Here it is late October and that means book fair is right around the corner. We hope you'll be able to join us for an exciting fair with new events.

The book fair is about encouraging the love of reading. Nothing brings this message home more for a child than having loved ones participate in their reading choices.



Monday, November 9 -Friday, November 13

Encourage daily reading by helping children keep track of the pages you and/or they read each day. For example, if your child reads alone, he/ she counts the pages read. If you read to your child, you can multiply by two since you read and they listened to the same number of pages. Students will record on a piece of scrap paper the number of pages read then feed this paper to the Hungry Monster Box in their classroom. Boxes will be collected each day by the Bookie Monster (Ms. Penny), emptied, and the number of pages read school wide will be tallied and posted near the library. The Monster Box will be very hungry for the next day's offerings! Let's see how much reading Manzano Day School can do in one week and keep that hungry monster happy!


A Monster Grand Event! Thursday, November 12 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.



NURSE'S NOTES: Think You Have the Flu?

Often times, parents are worried about strep throat; however, there are many viruses that also can cause a sore throat. Symptoms of strep throat are a red, painful throat with or without white patches on the tonsils, swollen lymph nodes, a fever, headache, and sometimes nausea, vomiting, and abdominal pain. The only way to diagnose strep throat is with a throat culture. Strep throat can be treated with antibiotics, but viruses cannot. A viral infection usually gets better in a few days without any intervention.

If a viral sore throat is what you have, there are some things you can do to help relieve some of the symptoms: Tylenol to help with the pain, warm salt water gargles, or throat lozenges. Make sure you drink plenty of fluids and get enough sleep and within a few days you will be as good as new.

Please contact the nurse's office at 243-6659 if your child has a strep infection or any other contagious illness. Our office will notify all parents in the grade level by email of this contagious exposure so that necessary precautions can be taken.

To prevent further spread and keep kids healthy, remember to encourage good hand washing techniques, especially after coughing, sneezing, and before preparing food or eating. If your child has a fever of 100° or above or if your child has diarrhea, please keep your child home an additional 24 hours after they are symptom free.
