





Itinerary

DAY 1 MONDAY, NOVEMBER 12 I DEPARTURE I SAN FRANCISCO DE SOLANO MISSION I NAPA VALLEY .

Depart on a group flight out of Chicago O'Hare Airport to San Francisco. Upon arrival, board a private motor coach and transfer to Napa Valley. Along the way, stop to celebrate Mass at the San Francisco de Solano Mission, followed by a visit and tour. Learn the history and influence of St. Francis Solano, a Spanish Franciscan who served 20 years as a missionary in Peru and Paraguay. Upon arrival in Napa, check into the hotel and freshen up before a special Welcome Dinner. Overnight in Napa.

DAY 2: TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 13 I CARMELITE HOUSE OF PRAYER I CASTELLO DI AMOROSA WINE TASTING 🛛 💻 👼

This morning, celebrate Mass at the Carmelite House of Prayer. After Mass, enjoy a tour of the Monastery and gain a deeper understanding into the Carmelite Order, learning why we can thank St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross for the revitalization of the Order in the 16th century, leading to the arrival of its presence here in California in 1955. Then, visit Castello di Amorosa, an authentically-built 13th century inspired Tuscan castle and winery. Begin with a guided tour of the winery followed by a culinary experience. Enjoy their hand-crafted wines paired with classic Italian cuisine in a private location within the castle. The rest of the afternoon and evening will be at leisure in Napa Valley for additional wine tastings, exploration and dinner on your own, cherishing the beauty this region has to offer.

DAY 3 WEDNESDAY NOVEMBER 14 I MISSION SAN RAFAEL ARCANGEL I SAN FRANCISCO 🔎 👼

After breakfast, depart toward San Francisco. Celebrate Mass at the Mission San Rafael Arcangel, named for Saint Rafael, patron of good health and travelers - originally founded as a hospital to treat sick Native Americans. Embrace the opportunity for prayer and reflection in this Mission of Bodily Healing, offering up special intentions for loved ones back home and those present on the pilgrimage. Continue to San Francisco. Upon arrival, embark on a city tour to see the famous Twin Peaks and Golden Gate Park. Enjoy a late group lunch at the Cliff House, overlooking the Pacific Ocean. The remainder of the afternoon and evening will be at leisure in the heart of San Francisco. Overnight in San Francisco.

DAY 4 THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 15 I CARMEL I SANTA CRUZ SAN CARLOS BORROMEO & SAN JUAN BAUTISTA MISSIONS 🐙 🗃 着

This morning, depart to Carmel-by-the-Sea, situated on the Monterey Peninsula, known for its natural scenery and rich artistic history. Along the way, stop at the Mission Santa Cruz, overlooking Monterey Bay and learn the history of this Mission named for The Exaltation of the Holy Cross of Christianity. Transfer to the Mission San Carlos Borromeo de Carmelo designated as the Father of the Alta California Missions. Celebrate Mass here, followed by the opportunity to pray at the elaborate Serra Memorial Cenotaph - a monument made of marble and bronze showing the life-sized figures of Fr. Junipero Serra and three other pioneer missionaries, all of whom are buried under the church sanctuary. Afterwards, have a special group lunch at Carmel-by-the-Sea and time to soak in the sunshine. In the afternoon, visit Mission San Juan Bautista offering the best opportunity to see and appreciate the California of 160 years ago, including 30 historic buildings in the 12-block area surrounding the Spanish Plaza. Enjoy a celebratory Farewell Dinner and overnight in San Francisco.

DAY 5 FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 16 I MISSION SAN FRANCISCO DE ASIS I RETURN 🛛 🕊

After breakfast, check out of your hotel and transfer to Mission Dolores named for St. Francis of Assisi, founder of the Franciscan Order, and celebrate a farewell Mass. Opportunity to pray in the Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine, a beautifully landscaped oasis, and pay respects to the Mission Indians buried here. Depart to San Francisco Airport for your return flight home.
