COTA Letter

He Breathes for Me

January 16, used to pass unnoticed just like most days in the year. This year, that is changing. A year ago, someone who I hold the closest to my heart passed away. His name is Caleb. I wish I could have gotten the chance to meet him in person as I know that I would have loved him. I've had the pleasure of speaking to his family, especially his mama Tawnya (she doesn't let me call her Mrs. Hogue anymore). This time last year, Tawnya tragically lost her son, but while grieving his loss, she chose to donate his organs. I cannot form proper words to thank his family enough. It feels like I'm writing with half the alphabet as I struggle to find words worthy enough to portray my gratitude.

The decision to donate his organs saved not only my life but so many more. The strength I have witnessed from Caleb's family is immeasurable. I have never experienced loss as immense like the loss of Caleb. He is loved by everyone that knows him. When he was with us, he didn't pass judgment, he was kind to everyone he met, and his heart was like no other. The love he had is one the world could not handle.

It breaks my heart that in a world with so much darkness that his light was extinguished. If I emit just a fraction of the happiness and kindness he did to those in his short life, then I will be complete. HE BREATHE FOR ME. I couldn't do it by myself before. Now, because of him I can run which is something I would watch in envy when my friends did.

I used to spend my days coughing while everyone around me worried that I would lose my air. Those around me ache as they watched me at my weakest displaying my greatest insecurity. Now, I'm not constantly deeply breathing trying to get oxygen in my lungs. I don't hunger for air anymore. I have so much more to thank Caleb.

Please say a prayer for his loved ones and all the really special people who received his gifts or were touched in some way by Caleb in their lives. Register to become an organ donor.

My gratitude is infinite. I will spend the rest of my days thankful for Caleb and his family's decision to donate his organs. I am the most grateful for the loving family I have gained.

Community Service

How to Help Veterans Around Their Home

Plan of Action:

Many of our nation's veterans need assistance around their home. Elderly or limited-mobility veterans may not be able to take care of all their housekeeping requirements and would appreciate some extra help. Knowing that veterans and current servicemembers do not always come to the Auxiliary in times of need, here are a few places where you can go to share our mission and help veterans who may need some help at home. This type of volunteer work is known as field service. Often, organizations or individuals aware of a veteran's issues will either encourage them to contact us or share his/her information with the local Auxiliary unit. In this manner, volunteers can be matched with veterans in need of help around the house.

How to Find Veterans:

1. In order to find veterans in need of help around the house, contact local Vet Centers and the state-level Veterans Administration office. Many of these state offices are located at Veterans Affairs Medical Centers (VAMCs). Express to them that the Auxiliary unit is looking to assist disabled veterans around their homes.
2. Contact your local Operation Homefront by visiting www.operationhomefront.net. Operation Homefront provides assistance to deployed and wounded servicemembers and their families.
3. Be sure let the Legion, SAL and Riders (if applicable) in your area (especially at your post home) know what your unit is planning. They may know of a veteran who could use your help and/or be willing to volunteer to help on your project.

Planning to Help the Veterans:

1. Gather the contact information of all volunteers. If you are faced with choosing from several projects on the day of service, take a popular vote in order to select which veteran(s) to help.
2. Assess what specific services, costs and materials are needed for your project. Plan for the help that will be needed besides manpower (volunteers).
 - For instance, for a project like a wheelchair ramp, a unit should consider contacting a contractor to see if they would be willing to donate their time or skill in labor or materials for building the ramp.
 - Consider fundraising within your unit, post home and possibly publicly for the remaining cost of the project.
 - Additional volunteers could come from other veterans organizations and local JROTCs.

Ways to Help Veterans at Home:

- Basic home repairs (e.g., painting a room or the exterior of a house).
- Seasonal yard work (e.g., snow removal, raking leaves, weeding or mowing the lawn).
- Build a wheelchair ramp for a veteran who has lost a leg or an elderly veteran who is less mobile.
- Cook a meal for them at their home.
- Do their laundry or housecleaning.

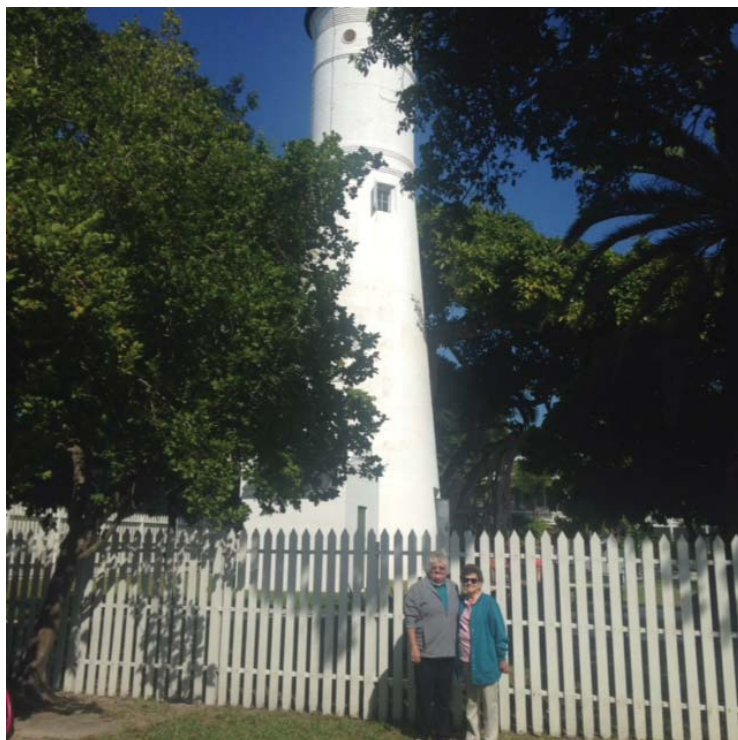

Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules

I am working on the following Units 17,55,58,186,220,303,and 348 and plan to have them back to the Units as quickly as possible along with corrections.

If you are updating the Unit Constitution and Bylaws please be sure that you change the wording for the following:

Nature

Section 1. The American Legion Auxiliary (insert legal name) _____
Unit _____ is a civilian patriotic service organization of women that supports the mission of the American Legion.

Article III - Objective

Section 1. The objective of the American Legion Auxiliary, (insert legal name) _____
Unit No. _____, Department of _____ shall be as stated in the Preamble of the Constitution.

Eligibility

Section 1. Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives and direct and adopted female descendants of members of The American Legion, and to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following periods: April 6, 19 to November 11, 1918, December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946, June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955, February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975, August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984, December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990, August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States, all dates inclusive, or who, being, citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during any of said periods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharge; and to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion

(Note: The wording above for Article IV, Section 1, was adopted at the August 2013 National Convention under a proviso that delays enactment upon the Legion's adoption of corresponding changes to its governing documents. Until The American Legion enacts this wording, the previous wording remains in effect, as follows:

Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the, mothers, wives, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters, and grandmothers of members of The American Legion, and to the mothers, wives, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters, and grandmothers of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following periods: April 6, 19 to November 11, 1918, December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946, June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955, February 28, 1961

to May 7, 1975, August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984, December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990, August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States, all dates inclusive, or who, being, citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during any of said periods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharge; and to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.)

Section 2. There shall be two classes of membership, Senior and Junior.

(a) Senior membership shall be composed of members over the age of eighteen years; provided, however, that a wife under the age of eighteen years, who is eligible under Section 1 of this article shall be classed as a Senior member.

(b) Junior membership shall consist of that group under the age of eighteen years, whose activities

shall be supervised by the Senior membership. Upon reaching the age of eighteen years, Junior members shall automatically be admitted into Senior membership with full privileges.

(c) Dues of both classes shall be paid annually or for life.

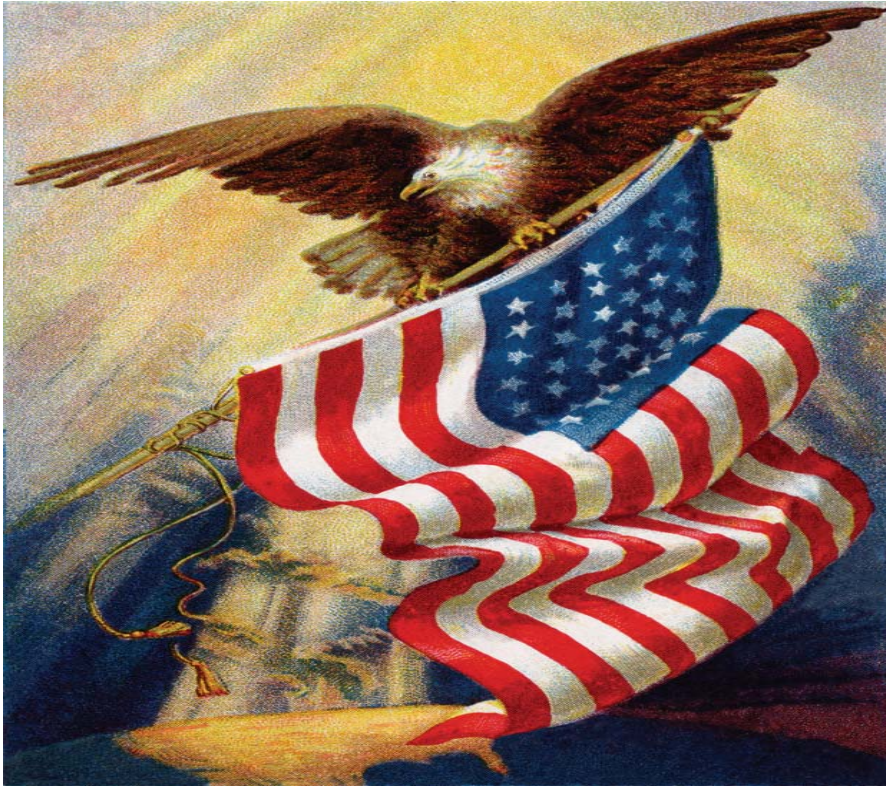
