## **Update from Charisse:**

#### Hi Everyone,

It has been quite the year as we think about all that has happened as we approach March and the mark of 1 year since the pandemic began. I want to say thank you for being patient, adaptive, flexible and understanding through this tough time especially for the 4-H program, thank you! This is an ever changing time and I appreciate your support as we deal with the constant changes and unknowns. As we look forward we will be moving into a new set of guidelines very soon! A brief outline is below and you can always find more information and the current guidelines at: https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-fags-related-to-covid-19/

#### Beginning April 1, 2021:

- Increasing total event participants to 50 indoors (or 30% of room capacity) / 150 outdoors
- Increasing pod numbers to 20, with additional flexibility to have one large group if there is no safety reason to have participants in pods
- Increasing length of events to 4 hours
- Face coverings and other safety precautions are still required
- Pre-approval for in-person meetings/trainings/gatherings is still required. Contact Charisse to work through the process.
- All of the above options are for events planned now that will occur April 1 or later

These changes cover events April 1 to June 1; we'll be communicating soon on any changes for events in June and thereafter.

Please continue to take safety precautions – the end of the pandemic is in sight!



<u>Grant County 4-H Scholarships:</u> Grant County 4-H Scholarships are available in the amount of \$500.00 each to 4-H members who are high school seniors. Applicants must have been a 4-H member for the last 4 years (consecutively), have exhibited at a Grant County Fair and must have held an active leadership role. Scholarships will be awarded after the recipient successfully completes a program of study or semester of post-high school classes, achieving a 2.0 gpa or higher. The program can be either full or part-time and tuition costs must be at least \$450 to receive the entire \$500 award. Applications are due April 1. **4-H Member Dues:** Each member and leader of the Grant County 4-H program needs to pay a membership due of \$5.00. In the past, you may have heard these referred to as "club dues", when they are actually member dues that the club collects from each member and turns into the county. "So why do I have to pay \$5 and where does it go?" The member dues are turned into the county and from there a portion of it goes to insurance and a portion goes to the State 4-H Foundation.

Please understand that each club handles member dues differently and you should talk to your club leader about your club's process.

Club leader's may choose not to confirm your 4hOnline registration for the club until dues are paid. Once a club confirms registration your enrollment will be processed by the county. Wanna learn more about Livestock? Then you should think of joining one of the many judging teams. You can learn about animals without showing them. First, there is the Livestock Judging team. Here you evaluate the live animal just by looking at them. You will have a class of 4 and you will place the animal from top to bottom. Next there is Meat Judging. You can learn the different cuts of meat and can learn how to evaluate the carcass. Last year I was able to participate in Quiz Bowl and Skillathon for my first year. What is quiz bowl and Skillathon? It is a competition where the judge asks you different questions about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goats. It is a team of 4 where you answer 4 questions each that the judge gives you. If you are interested in any of these judging events I hope to see you at the practices. ## **Grant County Fair Poster Contest**

This year the fair will take place August 18-22. We are again offering students a chance to help us out. We would like to do a poster contest for students to participate in, in grades 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup>. If you choose to participate, all entries must be in to the Grant County Fair, 916 E. Elm Street Suite B, Lancaster, WI 53813 no later than 3:00 p.m. on May 7, 2021. The sooner the better! No entries will be accepted after that date and time.

Contact the Fair Office for guidelines, along with a form to be completed and attached to the back of each poster.

The "theme" for the contest is **"Fair, Friends, and Fun in 2021".** All entries will be judged by the Grant County Fair Board. Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 12" x 18". There will be a first, second and third place winner. First place entry will receive 1 season pass and \$25.00. Second place entry will receive 1 season pass and \$15.00. Also, in addition to a student being rewarded for their work, the main 4-H leader of the first place winner will receive an All Event Pass. This pass will get you into the gate and grandstand events during the fair.

We will get in touch with the poster contest winners and the leader as soon as the posters are judged. Some of the top posters will be displayed at the fairgrounds all summer.
