A GENTLE NUDGE

Help others discover the love, hope of Jesus

One of my childhood heroes was Christian Hosoi. He was considered by many to be the best skateboarder in the world (he was a contemporary of Tony Hawk, which may be a more familiar name to non-skateboarders!). In many ways, Christian was the rock star of skateboarding.

He skated with great skill, authority, power and style. He had a wild fashion sense. He indulged in the rock star party lifestyle. He was a regular in the LA celebrity party and club scene. He was known for a trick called the "Christ Air", where he posed like Jesus on a cross while soaring above the ramp. He had fortune. He had fame. He had everything he desired.

Christian's lifestyle of excess also led to addiction. For the most part, while struggling with addiction, Hosoi was able to maintain his skateboarding success. Eventually, a reckless lifestyle caught up to him and he found himself falling behind in the rankings.

As his career began its downward spiral, his addiction was also raging out of control. In early 2000, Hosoi found himself in prison.

Upon entering prison, his wife said, "We need God." Initially, Hosoi dismissed the idea of "needing God." However, while in prison, he started reading the Bible and his life was changed.

In his book, "Hosoi: My Life as a Skateboard Junkie Inmate Pastor", Christian writes, "It's not as if God's been silent over the years. Jen's uncle Chris, the pastor, has been reaching out to her forever, since long before we left California. Even after she started going to church with her grandmother she remained unconvinced, and I'm not even listening. Here we are, a stripper doing drugs and a strungout pro skateboarder. In the world's eyes, and in hers and mine, that's about as far from God as it gets. In God's eyes, however, she and I are no different from some nice teadrinking husband and wife who do good and productive work and coach their kid's soccer team on the weekends."

Hosoi's reflection reminds us that no one is beyond the redemptive love and grace of God.

The season of Lent is a reminder of our own need for God's redemptive love and grace. Lent reminds us that, whether we consider ourselves worthy or unworthy, God loves us!

Lent is also a wonderful opportunity to reach out to those around us who may consider themselves to be "about as far from God as it gets." Extending an invitation to join us for worship (in-person or online) might be the gentle nudge someone needs to discover the love, hope and grace of Jesus.

I pray that our church will be known as a place where all are welcome, loved and accepted...whether they are "about as far from God as it gets" or "some nice tea-drinking husband and wife".

Upon his release from prison, Christian Hosoi returned to a career in professional skateboarding, while also becoming the Outreach Pastor at The Sanctuary Church in Orange County, California.

Re-launching in-person worship
