To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb



GOD CALLS US TO CONFESS OUR SIN

from Hebrews 2:17; 7:25; 4:16

Christ was made like us in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make atonement for the sins of the people. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Prayer of new belief


