**Thai Enquirer Summary** 

#### **Political News**

- The government came under fire for its move to send representatives to join Myanmar's Armed Forces Day.
  - Anusorn Iamsa-ard, spokesman of the opposition Pheu Thai Party, said the decision of the Thai government to send its military personnel to attend the event along with 8 countries raised the question of Thailand's stance towards Myanmar amid ongoing violence against civilians.
    - > Thailand/Russia/China/India/Vietnam/Laos/Bangladesh & Pakistan were the countries which sent representatives, with only Russia sending their ministerial level.
  - Former Democrat MP for Nakhon Si Thammarat Thepthai Senpong called on the Thai government to impose sanctions on Myanmar's army in all aspects.
  - The number of Myanmar protest deaths has risen close to 440 in a latest update while the defence chiefs of 12 countries jointly condemned the bloodbath in Myanmar on the weekend when at least 90 people including a 5-year-old boy were killed. The 12 nations that condemned the atrocities includes US, the UK,

Canada, Germany, Greece, Italy, Denmark, the Netherlands, Australia, New Zealand, Japan and South Korea.

- On the domestic political front, riot police took a swift action to disperse anti-government rallies by 2 groups of protesters near Government House. A total of 99 demonstrators were reportedly arrested in an operation at dawn and dusk on Sunday by the Metropolitan Police Bureau.
  - Two groups of protesters set up camps near Government House. The 1<sup>st</sup> group was the Save Bang Kloi Coalition of ethnic Karen people from the Kaeng Krachan National Park in Phetchaburi. The group held a rally to demand justice for ethnic minorities.
  - The 2<sup>nd</sup> group comprised members of the Ratsakon group who had marched to Bangkok from Nakhon Ratchasima who rallied under the name "Ban Thalu Fah ("Through the Sky") Village to demand the release of their arrested leaders, the resignation of Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha and his government, amendment of the constitution and reform of the lese majeste law.
  - The police said a total of 99 protesters were arrested and taken to the Border Patrol Police Region 1 headquarters where they would be initially charged with violating the Communicable Disease Control Act and the emergency decree. Several monks were also apprehended and disrobed at Wat Benjamaborphit near the site, according to Deputy Metropolitan Bureau chief Pol Maj Gen Piya Tawichai.
    - Pol Maj Gen Piya said the anti-government rally was against the law and police had issued warnings to protesters to dismantle several times. Police also found some protesters raised some parts of state agencies, stole electricity and tap water at state offices and vandalised state property. Police also seized illicit substance dried marijuana, condoms and sex toys from some protesters.

- A highly-placed source with security agencies said the reason that police took swift action to disperse the "Ban Thalu Fah Village" mob because they were concerned by the rally site that is adjacent to Government House. The position of the rally camp put the area at high risk of Covid-19 infections.
- Meanwhile Wassana Nanuam, a senior reporter covering military affairs, said on her Facebook page that the reason that the "Ban Thalu Fah Village" mob was dispersed to clear space for new cabinet ministers who will have their photo taken at Government House today.
  - In fact, Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha has instructed police to evict protesters from the rally site for quite some time following the incident involving some protesters who shouted for his ouster.



• The parliament looks set to hold an extraordinary parliamentary session scheduled for April 7 to deliberate the referendum bill after the Royal Gazette published His Majesty the King's royal endorsement for the special House session.

- The recently downed constitutional amendment plans continues to remain a hot topic as the list of people from the Pheu Thai party who did not vote for the passage of the charter amendment seems to out in public now.
  - A total of 26 MPs of the Pheu Thai party voted against the party and opposition's motion.



- Elections for the mayors and councillors of municipalities in most provinces in the country met with a lively atmosphere. There are various reports that suggest that some big and powerful families may have lost their stronghold positions but results of the local elections would be known in over the next couple of days. Elections were held in all provinces except in Bangkok and Pattaya.
  - Election Commission (EC) secretary-general Jarungvith Phumma said the EC had received 289 complaints for municipal elections, divided into 190 fraud complaints at the tambon level; 83 complaints at the muang level and 16 complaints at the Nakhon level.

- Jarungvith said the EC has up to 30 days to finalize the results of Sunday's municipal elections or on April 27, 2021.
- Reports have come out that Chaturon Chaisang along with the "October People" will form a group of "OCTDEM" as a key mouthpiece against the government of Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha over its unaccountability to be held under the rule of law.
  - The so-called "OCTDEM" group will comprise a group of nearly 20 people known as "October People" including Chaturon himself, former finance minister Surapong Suebwonglee, former deputy minister Prommin Lertsuridej, Kriengkamol Laohapairot, former president of the National Student Centre of Thailand, Krissadang Nuttajaras, lawyer and former president of the Thammasat University Student Union and Surachart Bamrungsuk, former vice president of Chulanglongkorn University's Student Council.
  - The group has set its 1<sup>st</sup> task to set up a chatroom with the CARE group (Creative, Action, Revival and People Empowerment) on the clubhouse app. It plans to invite prominent scholar Thongchai Winichakul, one of the October People, to join a forum with Chaturon, Surapong and Panas Thasaneeyanont. The group also plans to release a statement calling on the government to treat people with different political views equally.




- The Campaign for Popular Democracy (CPD) or "Kor Ror Por" organised a public forum entitled "Digest 7 years under Gen Prayut's helm" at the October 14 Memorial near Kok Wua intersection on Ratchadamnoen Avenue.
  - The event was chaired by Pichai Ratnatilaka Na Bhuket, dean of the School of Social and Environmental Development, who served as chairman of the "CPD" and attended by Wiwatchai Atthakorn, a professor from Nida's Graduate School of Public Administration and former foreign minister Kasit Piromya.
  - During his speech, Pichai likened Prime Minister Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha's administration to a "mafia-style" administration because Gen Prayut failed to tackle any political conflict, driving a wedge of divisiveness and hatred deeper into Thai society. He went on to criticise Gen Prayut for allowing his temper tantrums to ride above logics. Pichai said the current national administration led by the 3 generals with the initial "P" has fallen into a state of despair, resulting in people taking to the streets in the hope of getting rid of those in current power.
  - Kasit said over the course of 7 years Gen Prayut's government succeeded with 2 things; the 1<sup>st</sup> is various mega projects and the 2<sup>nd</sup> is populist policies that rely on a massive amount of taxpayers' money for those in power to reap benefits, sending corruption to spiral at a massive scale. The ex-foreign minister said the only way to get rid of Gen Prayut is to get more than 60 million Thais to sign up for a petition to His Majesty the King like in the era of King Ramkhamhaeng the Great.

### Economic News

• The value of Thailand's exports to Myanmar via border checkpoints plunged 15.2 per cent for 2 consecutive months in the wake of Myanmar's coup.

- The Trade Policy and Strategy Office has set up a war room to assess the Thai-Myanmar trade situation in order to help exporters to tackle problems, directorgeneral Phusit Rattanakul Sereroengrit said.
- The war room comprises representatives of both public and private sectors such as the Thai Chamber of Commerce, the Federation of Thai Industries, the Thai National Shippers' Council, the International Trade Promotion Department, the Ministry of Labour and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- The war room is tasked with assessing the impact of the Myanmar's coup on Thai exporters and the impact of sanctions by the international community on Thai exporters.
- There are reports that more than 100 Thai firms investing in Myanmar, most of which are small-sized enterprises, started to feel the pinch after the Myanmar coup forces businesses to shut down.
  - Kich Aungvitulsatit, chairman of the Thai-Myanmar Business Council, reported that more than 100 small companies began to face liquidity problems after their businesses were forced to shut down since February. They feared that they will not able to bear the blunt and may face closure within 6 months.
  - Bunyarit Kallayanamit, permanent secretary for commerce, said the ministry had met with the private sector and discuss problems facing private operators. He promised that the ministry is looking for relief measures including tax reduction and new soft loan schemes.
  - Bunyarit, however, said Thai-Myanmar border trade in Mae Sod district of Tak continues as usual with 700-900 good transport trucks going between the 2 countries on a daily basis. He ruled out the possibility of Thailand's imposing a sanction on Myanmar because the move will affect Thai-Myanmar border trade in a greater scope.

- Thai vessels may have to be rerouted and seek an extension of deadlines for shipments if efforts to salvage a large container ship blocking Egypt's Suez Canal take longer than expected, Deputy Prime Minister Jurin Laksanawisit said.
  - The 400-metre Ever Given container vessel has been stuck in one of the world's primary shipping canals since Tuesday, suspending traffic of containers taking goods, parts and equipment through the shortest sea link between Europe and Asia.
  - The blockage comes as shipments have already been disrupted by the coronavirus pandemic and a surge in demand for goods. Efforts are under way to free the vessel, although salvage experts warn the process may take weeks. Roughly 10% of global trade passes through the canal annually.



- Around 80 percent of hotel operators are expected to join state-sponsored debt relief plan worth 100 billion baht.
  - The Thai Hotels Association (THA) said it plan to send letters to survey hotel operators who may be interested in joining the plan following the cabinet's approval in early March to approve a budget of 100 billion baht to allow hotel owners to temporarily park their assets with lenders in exchange for credit to boost liquidity, instead of having to liquidate distress assets or go out of business due to their debts.
  - The THA's survey found that out of 198 hotels featuring 23,499 rooms, 79.63 per cent or 158 hotels with combined assets worth 82.437 billion baht and 32.172 in outstanding loans are interested in joining the debt relief scheme, President Marisa Sukosol Nunbhakdi revealed,
- Thai Airways International Plc (THAI) unveiled plans to send its menus to modern grocery and convenience stores.
  - THAI Managing Director for the Catering Department Varangkana Luerojvong said THAI's Catering Department is speeding up negotiations to launch its food and beverage menus in various department stores, modern trade stores and convenience stores.
  - Recently, the Department has been in talks with CP All Plc, which operates 7-Eleven, to distribute its "Nam Phrik Long Ruea" menu at 7-Eleven branches starting from the Songkran festival. Other menus queuing up to be served to the public are halal foods such as the chicken biryani dish. THAI Catering Department will also join forces with Thailand Post Distribution which has more than 1,000 branches nationwide to deliver products directly to customers.

- The Tobacco Authority of Thailand is gearing up to rejig cigarette price at 50-55 baht per pack this year.
  - Director-General Panuphol Rattanakanjanapatra said TOAT is pursuing the idea of setting up a new price for cigarettes at 50-55 baht per pack this year. However, this will also depends on whether the amended excise tax structure for cigarettes proposed to the Excise Department will pass its approval to take effect from October 1 this year to maintain its market share.
  - TOAT could still gain profit of 0.50 baht per pack if the retail price is set at 60 baht per pack, Panuphol said, pointing that its market share will drop to 56 per cent from 79 per cent in the past because more people turned to illicit cigarettes.
- The government will sign three contracts relating to the Thai-Sino high-speed train project between Bangkok and Nakhon Ratchasima today, deputy government spokeswoman Traisuree Taisaranakul said on Sunday.
  - Ms Traisuree said the contracts which are due to be signed at the Transport Ministry today include the 4-3 contract on civil engineering works along the Nava Nakhon-Ban Pho section, the 4-4 contract to build a maintenance depot at Chiang Rak Noi, as well as the 4-6 contract on rail engineering works along the Phra Kaew-Saraburi section.
  - The contracts will be signed by the State Railway of Thailand's governor and the contracting parties. After the signing, the SRT will issue a letter to launch the work outlined in the three contracts.
- The global selloff seen with Goldman Sachs and other banks offloading close to \$20 billion of assets that prompted major correction in share prices of some of the world's leading companies.

- Reports are that the family office of Tiger Management trader Bill Hwang was behind the unprecedented selling has already seen impact in Asia as Japan's Nomura has come out to warn of significant' loss from an unnamed US client.
- Shares of Nomura were down nearly 15 per cent, the biggest drop in 9-years.

#### General News

- The world seems to be heading into yet another round of outbreak of the Covid-19 as global outbreak number heads close to 128 million.
  - India is leading the number of new outbreak in the world with more than 68,000 new cases followed by Brazil and United States with just over 44,000 new cases.
- In Thailand Centre for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) reported 77 new cases and 1 new death in the last 24 hours, bringing the accumulated number of confirmed infections since the pandemic began to 28,734 and 94 deaths in total.
  - Bangkok has seen the most number of infections in the country with 20 cases reported by hospitals and 12 from mass testing. Samut Sakhon registered 7 cases filed by medical facilities and nine from mass testing, while Samut Prakan logged 3 infections reported by hospitals and two from mass testing.
  - Pathum Thani recorded 2 new cases at hospitals and active case-finding in communities also uncovered 2 in Nonthaburi and 1 in Ratchaburi.
  - The 19 imported cases comprised 6 from Hungary, 3from the United States, 2 from the United Arab Emirates, 2 from India and 1 each from South Korea, Sweden, Russia, Bulgaria, Ethiopia and Kuwait.

- A pageant contestant from Myanmar has used her moment in the spotlight to appeal for urgent international help for her country as security forces suppressing protests against last month's coup killed more than 100 people.
  - Yangon University student Han Lay made the comments Saturday night at the Miss Grand International pageant held in the Thai capital Bangkok. As she was speaking news was coming out from across the border in Myanmar that at least 114 people had been killed in the bloodiest day since the Feb. 1 coup.
  - Han Lay had made no secret of her sympathies in a publicity video interview two weeks ago and on her Instagram page, which shows memes and photos from the protest movement in her homeland. Yet it was still surprising to see a contestant at an international pageant use the event to in part criticize her own country's leaders.
  - "I deeply feel sorry for the people who have lost their lives on the streets. Every citizen of the world wants the prosperity of their country and the peaceful environment. In doing so, the leaders involved should not use their power and selfishness to apply," she said.
