### March is National Reading Month

March 2<sup>nd</sup> is <u>Read Across America Day</u>. It is a national initiative on reading, created by the National Education Association (NEA) to coincide with the birthday of Dr. Seuss. All over the country, students will be participating in this event. The idea behind Read Across America is to encourage children to read and find a love of reading the whole year through. Many activities in schools on March 2<sup>nd</sup> will revolve around reading.

Why is reading with a child and encouraging them to read so important? According to the NEA's website, students who are read to and/or read themselves do better in many different areas including writing and math.

What can you do to encourage a love of reading?

- Read aloud to a child, especially a child who is an emerging or struggling reader. It helps with fluency.
- Have many different types of reading materials available. Have fiction, non-fiction, magazines, newspapers, etc.
- Talk to a child about what they like to read and make that kind available to them.
- Go to the library and let them spend time perusing all of the different books. Help steer them in the direction of books that fit their interests and are at their reading ability level. (Librarians can help, if you are unsure!)
- Set aside time to read. Maybe they can go to bed at the regular time, but they can leave the lights on for half an hour and read.
- Let children see YOU read. Be a good role model and take the time to read yourself.

Please remember foster parents, that it is your responsibility to get your training completed on time! As foster parents, we hold a license with the State of Iowa, just like teachers, cosmetologists, and other professionals. These other occupations require a person to get continuing education units (approved training), in order to maintain a license. We are also required to continue to learn and stay abreast of the latest information. Please make sure that you are getting six (6) hours of training each year. If you are on a two-year license, you are still required to get six <u>each</u> year. Too many foster parents are waiting too long to schedule their training hours and/or they are trying to get double the amount in one year and then believe they can skip a year. We are professionals. To help you keep track, please make sure that you are turning in your training certificates and training reports to your Iowa KidsNet worker within 30 days of completing training.

#### **Supplies**

- Construction Paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Wiggle Eyes
- Glue Stick
- Markers or Colored Pencils
- Large Bottle Cap or Small Plastic Lid to Trace Around

#### Instructions

- Trace six times around a Snapple cap or other bottle cap onto a piece of construction paper. Cut out the circles.
- 2. Glue the circles together in a row to make a worm.
- 3. Glue on wiggle eyes.
- 4. Cut out or write the letters "READ!" on the circles.
