The 2021 Legislative Session: Taking Shape

The five committee weeks leading up to the 2021 Legislative Session, which begins on March 2, were incredibly efficient and ultimately very productive. During these meetings, important bills that protect our health care heroes, promote home-based businesses and protect responsible businesses passed committees. The most notable pieces of legislation include the following:

CS/HB7: Civil Liability for Damages Relating to COVID-19: Our businesses have done everything they can to stay open, to stay safe and to serve us during the COVID-19 pandemic. We can champion their comeback by protecting those who did the right thing from frivolous lawsuits with HB 7 — the most aggressive liability protection bill in the nation. HB 7 provides COVID-19 lawsuit protections to businesses, schools, nonprofits and religious institutions making good-faith efforts to follow established federal, state and local guidelines. HB 7 passed its third and final committee stop on Tuesday, February 16, and is now headed to the House Floor.

HB403: Home-Based Businesses: Florida's home-based businesses are currently burdened by heavy local regulations and unfair taxation from each of the local jurisdictions that they work in. HB 403 empowers business owners to challenge impractical local mandates, allows startup businesses to flourish without high overhead, and encourages entrepreneurship by limiting business taxes to only the county and municipality where their home-based business is physically located. This bill will allow businesses to grow and thrive in their communities and throughout the state. HB 403 passed its first committee stop on Thursday, February 18, and is headed to the Commerce Committee.

PCB HHS 21-01: Our health care heroes saved lives in the face of daunting challenges throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. They confronted changing government guidance, inadequate personal protective equipment, and staffing shortages. They deserve protections from frivolous lawsuits so they can focus on patient and resident health — not unnecessary legal defense. PCB HHS 21-01 protects hospitals, practitioners, mental health facilities, nursing homes,

assisted living facilities and many other health care providers from being unnecessarily second-guessed by COVID-19 claims. Health care heroes should not be overburdened by lawsuits if they are following public health guidance. PCB HHS 21-01 passed its first committee stop on Wednesday, February 17.

I am also pleased to report that HB259: Safety of Religious Institutions, which I wrote about last month, passed its first stop in the Criminal Justice & Public Safety Subcommittee with bipartisan support. HB259 allows concealed weapons permit holders to carry on the property of church, synagogue or any other religious institution when it is located on the same property as a school or preschool. However, it is important to reiterate that the bill does allow religious institutions or owners of the property to continue prohibiting firearms should they so choose. I've also filed several other bills, which I look forward to sharing more about in the next few issues.

For the most up-to-date information, I would encourage you to set up a bill tracking account at MyFloridaHouse. gov. The process is simple and allows you to customize your notifications to receive emails on legislation and issues that are important to you. We also post updates on my official office Facebook page (@RepJayerWilliamson) and distribute a monthly e-newsletter, which you can subscribe to from my Facebook page. It is truly an honor to serve District 3 in the Florida House of Representatives.

With Ultra-low Rates, Should You Still Invest in Bonds?

If you've been investing for many years and you've owned bonds, you've seen some pretty big changes on your financial statements. In 2000, the average yield on a 10-year U.S. Treasury security was about 6%; in 2010, it had dropped to slightly over 3%, and for most of 2020, it was less than 1%. That's an enormous difference, and it may lead you to this question: With yields so low on bonds, why should you even consider them?

Of course, while the 10-year Treasury note is an important benchmark, it doesn't represent the returns on any bonds you could purchase. Typically, longer-term bonds, such as those that mature in 20 or 30 years, pay higher rates to account for inflation and to reward you for locking up your money for many years. But the same downward trend can be seen in these longer-term bonds, too — in 2020, the average 30-year Treasury bond yield was only slightly above 1.5%.

Among other things, these numbers mean that investors of 10 or 20 years ago could have gotten some reasonably good income from investment-grade bonds. But today, the picture is different. (Higher-yield bonds, sometimes known as "junk" bonds, can offer more income but carry a higher risk of default.)

Nonetheless, while rates are low now, you may be able to employ a strategy that can help you in any interest-rate environment. You can build a bond "ladder" of individual bonds that mature on different dates. When market interest rates are low, you'll still have your longer-term bonds earning higher yields (and long-term yields, while fluctuating, are expected to rise in the future). When interest rates rise, your maturing bonds can be reinvested at these new, higher levels. Be sure you evaluate whether a bond ladder and the securities held within it are consistent with your investment objectives, risk tolerance and financial circumstances.

Furthermore, bonds can provide you with other benefits. For one thing, they can help diversify your portfolio, especially if it's heavily weighted toward stocks. Also, stock and bond prices often (although not always) move

in opposite directions, so if the stock market goes through a down period, the value of your bonds may rise. And bonds are usually less volatile than stocks, so they can have a "calming" effect on your portfolio. Plus, if you hold your bonds until maturity, you will get your entire principal back (providing the bond issuer doesn't default, which is generally unlikely if you own investment-grade bonds), so bond ownership gives you a chance to preserve capital while still investing. But if the primary reason you have owned bonds is because of the income they offer, you may have to look elsewhere during periods of ultra-low interest rates. For example, you could invest in dividend-paying stocks. Some stocks have long track records of increasing dividends, year after year, giving you a potential source of rising income. (Keep in mind, though, that dividends can be increased, decreased or eliminated at any time.) Be aware, though, that stocks are subject to greater risks and market movements than bonds. Ultimately, while bonds may not provide the income they did a few years ago, they can have a place in a long-term investment strategy. Consider how they might fit into yours.

Before investing in bonds, you should understand the risks involved, including credit risk and market risk. Bond investments are also subject to interest rate risk such that when interest rates rise, the prices of bonds can decrease, and the investor can lose principal value if the investment is sold prior to maturity.
