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<u>Prerequisite:</u> Math 64 or qualification through the Math placement process.

<u>Course Description:</u> This course covers advanced algebra topics including functions and their properties. Topics include linear, quadratic, polynomial, rational, exponential, and logarithmic functions and their applications, graphs of functions, inverse functions, and systems of equations and inequalities.

<u>Student Learning Outcomes</u>: For a given set of problems the student will demonstrate quantitative reasoning by developing a problem-solving strategy, performing appropriate analysis and computation, and critically assessing the meaning of the conclusion or outcome.

Workload: It is essential that you understand how much work is required for this course. This is an online class, not a self-paced class. Students need to spend at least 4 hours a day, 6 days a week to this class. Students need to be very self-motivated and self-disciplined to succeed in this class. So please be ready with your hard work, effort, and outstanding algebra skills. You can do it!
