Thai Enquirer Summary

Political News

- During the Cabinet meeting the government of 2014 coup leader – Prayut Chan-o-cha, approved the expenditure budget for fiscal year 2023 (starting October 2022)
 - ❖ After this, the budget will be reviewed by the Office of the Council of State with documents supporting the budget, then it will be presented to the Secretary-General of the House of Representatives for consideration as an urgent matter and approved the establishment of an extraordinary committee to consider.
 - ❖ It is reported budget will be reviewed in the parliament from May 31 to June 2 and Prayut has instructed that the government should be ready to answer all questions from the floor of the parliament.

- Today another rebellion in the ruling Palang Pracharat party (PPRP) is likely to be seen as some of the Bangkok Council members are likely to break from the party's demand for them to support Aswin Kwanmuang.
 - ❖ As many as 27 of the Bangkok Council members are set to announce that they will support Sakoltee Pattiyakul, the former deputy of Aswin and another candidate who has the backing of the 2014 protest group – People's Democratic Reform Council (PDRC).
 - ❖ The orders to support Aswin was given by Gen Prawit Wongsuwan, Deputy Prime Minister and leader of PPRP.
 - ❖ The shift of the council members to support Sakoltee could mean that he may end up having more votes than is former boss Aswin in the upcoming Bangkok polls on Sunday May 22.
- Yesterday marked the 30th anniversary of the 1992 coup that saw scores of people dead and the question was being raised whether Thailand could see more coups or not and what benefit the coups have brought to Thailand.
 - ❖ Suchinda Kraprayoon, the coup leader of 1992 who ousted the elected government of Chatchai Choonhavan, had ordered the killing of scores of protestors to a point where late HM the King had called both the then coup leader and self-declared Prime Minister and protest leader to his office to put an end to the violence.
 - ❖ 2014 coup leader General Prayut Chan-o-cha came out to say that the ongoing discussion during the ongoing Governor elections was nothing to worry as there will be no coup and that debates on the benefits of coup has nothing to do with the election of the Bangkok governor.

- Thanakorn Wangboonkongchana, spokesman for the Prime Minister's Office talking about the case of Pheu Thai, the campaign to invite the Red shirts back to home, will be a wake-up call for a new round of conflict or not.
 - ❖ Gen. Prayut came out to say that there are laws in place that are there to control any violence (if they may occur).
 - ❖ Those issues will be handled by the security agencies.
 - Uttama Savanayana, leader of the Saan Anakhot Thai (Build Thailand's Future) confirmed that the party was going to invite Somkid. Jatusripitak, former deputy prime minister, as a candidate for the prime minister.
 - ❖ On the same day, the Facebook page Somkid Jatusripitak, which has been launched since early 2022, posted a picture of Somkid with the message 'I can't choose my birth. but can choose to build a Thai future'.
 - Yesterday at the Criminal Court, Pita Limcharoenrat Leader of the Move Forward Party along with Krisdang Nutjarat, a lawyer, filed an objection to the detention of Ms. Thantawan Tuatulanon, an independent activist.
 - ❖ The accused in the case of breach of Section 112 of the Criminal Code, where Pita used his position MPs to ask for bail, but the court, in the 7th inquiry, allowed the detention request of the investigator to extend the detention for another 5 days and dismissed the request for the position submission.
 - ❖ Miss Tantawan has been detained since April 20 and has started fasting for 27 days.

Economic News

- The better-than-expected data on the growth of the Economy with the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) rising by 2.2% against the 1.7% expected by the investors, pushed Thailand's stock market to surge yesterday.
 - ❖ The SET Index closed at 1,614.49 points, an increase of 30.11 points, with a net trading value of 85.22 billion baht
 - Therdsak Thaveeeratham, from Asia Plus Securities Plc, said that the Thai stock market has recovered, and more companies will start to report better earnings now that the economy is picking up.
 - Meanwhile opposition Pheu Thai party's Pichai Nariphaphan, the strategist for economic affairs, said that the Thai economy grew only 2.2% in the first quarter, which is very low. He added that the US interest rates are increasing and continued impact from the Russo-Ukrainian War including the slowing Chinese economy which may enter a recession will worsen the Thai economy.
 - He said that Thailand must be prepared to deal with and accelerate energy price management and also look at reducing electricity bills to help people first.
- The Government decided to give a 5 baht/litre for diesel only up until July 20th
 - ❖ The Fuel Oil Fund is now more than 70 billion baht in red
 - ❖ The compensation would be about 9.91 billion baht/month or 19.82 billion in 2-months to be lost in the 2-months
 - Arkhom Termpittayapaisith Minister of Finance, said that this will not affect the revenue collection target for the full fiscal year 2022, which is 2.4 trillion baht.
 - In the past 6 months of the fiscal year 2022 (October 2021 to March 2022), the total revenue collection exceeds the target of 68.89 billion baht, which the Treasury is still managing during 2 months with measures but after that, the Ministry must continue to monitor the situation.
 - ❖ Those using gasoline will not be subsidized yet but only specific groups such as motorcycle taxi users will get to fill their tanks for up to a certain level each month.

- The Fuel Oil Fund postponed a meeting to discuss the rising diesel prices after the cabinet approved a 5 baht per litre diesel tax cut by Supattanapong Punmeechaow, Deputy Prime Minister and the Ministry of Energy said that on May 18 there will be a meeting of the fund to discuss the situation of all oil prices and determine the retail price of diesel after the tax reduction of 5 baht.
 - ❖ If there is no government measure to help fix the price, then diesel prices would be higher than 40 baht per litre. But if the price is fixed too low, it will risk smuggling exports to neighboring countries.
 - ❖ It is reported that the price of crude oil, the Thai reference price is at \$107/barrel. If the price is floated then retail diesel price in the country will be 42-43 baht per litre, while the price fixed measures are at 32 baht per litre.

- Palm Oil
 - ❖ Consumers are complaining about rising palm oil prices and restaurants are raising their price of food
 - ❖ Ministry of Commerce has set at 66.50 baht per bottle, but prices are now well above 70 baht a bottle
 - ❖ The Ministry of Commerce reported that many residents and restaurant operators have complained about the continued increase in bottled palm oil prices.
 - Most recently, on May 16-17, 2022 convenience stores throughout Bangkok have adjusted the price of many brands of palm oil bottles to 70 baht per bottle, higher than the Ministry of Commerce announced at 66.50 baht and as a result of the higher price of palm oil.
 - Including the cost of raw food ingredients, pork, chicken meat, chicken eggs, seasonings, and cooking gas 15 kilograms (kg.) that have already risen by 30 baht per 15-kg tank, resulting in the restaurant's ready-to-eat dishes gradually increasing the price by another 5-10 baht per dish.

- Thanakorn Kuptachit, Advisor to the Thai Alcoholic Beverage Business Association, said that at the meeting of the Center for Covid-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) on May 20, would likely consider reducing the level of Warning of Covid-19 from level 3 to level 2 across the country and reviewing permission to open entertainment venues, pubs, bars, karaoke as part of night travel before foreign tourists decide to visit other countries which now other countries flock to open the country and promote various activities.

- ❖ In this regard, the plan is proposed for permission to open entertainment venues in 2 phases, the first phase is the trial phase from June 1, only the 28 provinces according to the list of provinces in tourism pilot areas and see the results of opening in June, if the situation goes well, the government or CCSA can extend the permission to open entertainment venues in the remaining provinces for the second phase.
- ❖ This move will generate an additional turnover income of not less than 300-400 billion baht
- Puttipong Prasarthong-Osoth Executive Director, Bangkok Airways Plc (BA), said that in the Q1 2022, the company had total revenue of 1.7 billion baht, an increase of 25.1% compared to the previous year.
 - ❖ This was mainly due to a 208.8% increase in airline ticket revenue and a 206.9% increase in airport business after adding flights on major routes such as Samui, Phuket, Chiang Mai, Lampang, Phnom Penh, resulting in 0.4 million passengers in the quarter.
 - ❖ The average ticket price was 2,469.6 baht, an increase of 31.3%.
 - ❖ However, the company had a loss of 826.6 million baht, a loss increased by 9.2% YoY from a 22.3% increase in total expenses such as fuel costs. aircraft maintenance cost.

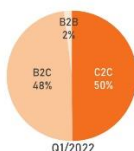

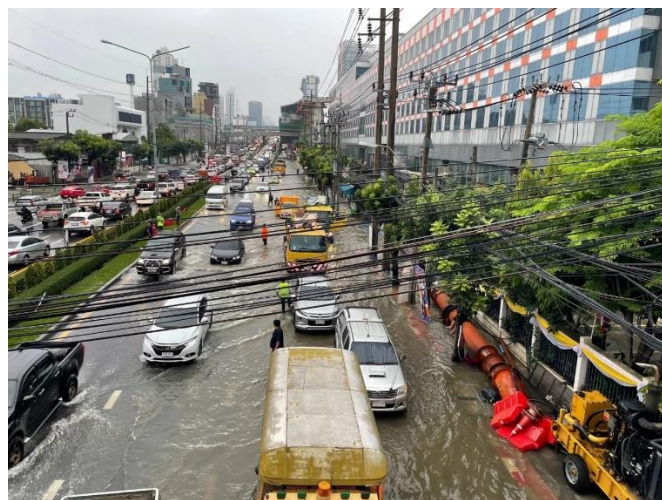
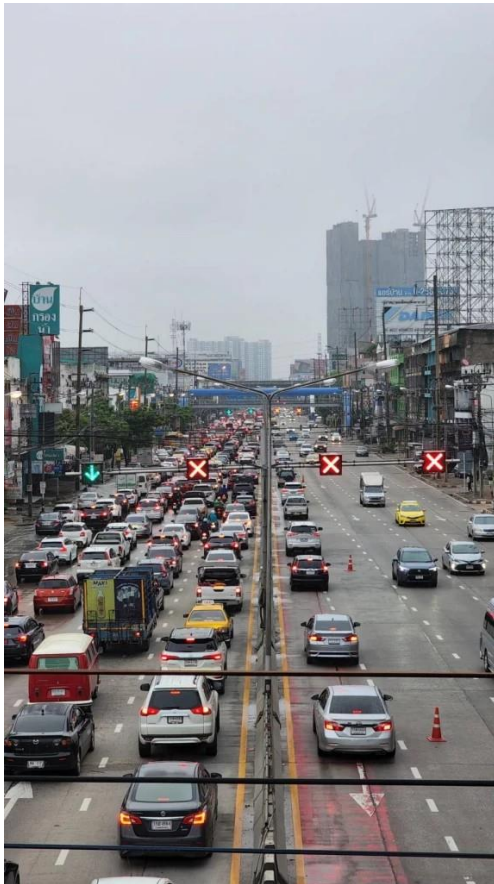
