I love the Easter Season. 





Sharing Catholic Social Teaching Listen to those in need, Pope Francis says in World Day of Poor 2018 message

"We are so entrapped in a culture which forces us to look in the mirror" and unduly "pamper ourselves," he said. Such people come to believe their act of altruism is enough without having to feel any empathy or the need to sacrifice or "endanger" themselves directly.

Nobody seeks poverty or its many forms, which include marginalization, persecution and injustice, the pope said.

Poverty "is caused by selfishness, pride, greed & injustice. These are evils as old as humanity, but also sins in which the innocents are caught up, leading to consequences on the social level, which are dramatic," he said.

"God's answer to the poor is always an intervention of salvation in order to heal the wounds of body and soul, restore justice and assist in beginning anew to live life with dignity. God's answer is also an appeal in order that those who believe in him can do the same," he added.



If you or a family member is ever in the hospital and you would like a visit from a priest or a pastoral associate from the parish, please know that you can call the parish directly to let us know. Often times we are unaware of parishioners who are in the hospital and a call to the Quad Parish office would help us in knowing this. Changes in regulations protecting patient confidentiality are in effect at all hospitals. Even when the hospital asks if they may notify us of your admission and you answer "yes", it is still helpful if you or a family member notifies us directly, especially if someone needs to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Due to HIPPA regulations the hospitals are not able to notify us of a patient's condition, which is why your help in letting us know directly would be very helpful. You can also call the Pastoral Care Department at any hospital to notify us on your behalf.

Visiting hospitalized parishioners is an important part of our ministry. Help us to find you and/or your family members when hospitalized - a "YES" answer to "Notify parish?" will usually put you on our parish lists, but it is always a good idea to notify the Parish Office directly to make sure we are notified and also so that we know the patient's condition since the hospital does not release this information to us unless you specifically ask them to. Your help in this matter will help us to be of better service to you.



Visiting Priest at the Quad-Parishes June 1/2

A letter from Fr. Celestine Byekwaso WATER IS LIFE!

I am a priest of Kasana-Luweero Diocese in Uganda. I will be coming to your parishes to share with you some of the challenges that the Catholic Church faces in Uganda. One of these challenges is the lack of water. There are many people in Uganda who do not have access to running water, and more still who do not even have access to CLEAN WATER. There are people who literally have to walk miles in search of clean water. Many schools have no water on their premises. In such cases the students interrupt their lessons to go and fetch water in order to prepare meals. This affects the students' learning. We have some parishes today which do not have running water.

The bishop of my diocese is having a campaign to drill wells in the area which can provide water for a number of families. Drilling a well costs almost ten thousand shillings. The good news is that we have plenty of clean underground water, but we lack the money to drill. I will be coming to your parishes on the weekend of June 1st & 2nd to appeal for your assistance.

Prescriptions & Health Aids: Due to unforeseen circumstances the Green Bay Medical Sewing Mission can no longer accept any medications. Individuals can work with the Green Bay Police Dept. regarding proper disposal. We can still accept diabetic insulin/supplies, crutches, wheelchairs, commodes, braces, slings, empty pill bottles, hearing aids and glasses. They can be dropped off at the Quad-Parish Office.

ATTN: SCRIP CARD USERS

When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need? We often get walk-ins requesting money to purchase gas, food, or prescriptions. The small balances left on your gift cards could add up to be enough to help someone have their next meal, pick-up a prescription, or purchase gas to get to a doctor appt, an out-of-town funeral, or to work the next day. Cards can be dropped in the collection baskets, or at the Quad-Parish or Faith Formation Office. It would be helpful if you would indicate the balance left on the card for us.

Do you have a special need for prayer? If you or someone you know needs a few extra prayers said for them, you can call the Quad-Parish Office at 496-2160.

It is not necessary to give names or specific details. Request examples: "Please pray for Sue (or 'a lady') that is going to Marshfield for testing" or "Please pray for my new grandson who was born two months premature."
