From the Lunch Program...

2019-2020 Registration for Lunch Program:

Lunch Program and PASCAL application forms for the 2019/2020 school year will be distributed to students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 later this month or early June. Please be sure to return them by June deadline. It is important to help plan our staffing.

Fees will remain at \$300.00 for next school year. There will be 30 PASCAL positions available in the fall - P.A.S.C.A.L. (<u>Parents Are Supervising Children At Lunch</u>). This program gives parents opportunity to work shifts in lieu of Lunch Program fee payment. Only parents of full time lunch students are eligible. Returning parents are encouraged, however new applicants have priority depending on date received. More details will be available on the application.

Day to Day Reminders ...

- Please send students with their own utensils for eating.
- Hot water and microwaves are available daily, however, it is recommended that the students not use the microwave on days they are attending extra-curricular activities like field trips, rehearsals or student council, due to time restrictions.
- Heat ups need to be in microwavable containers Ziplocs and tin foil are <u>NOT</u> microwavable.
- Weather: Temperature and conditions are changing. Children spend about 30 minutes outside. Please ensure your children have the correct clothing for wet, cold, hot, muddy conditions that means hats, jackets, nylon pants and extra socks are necessary at this time of year!

Children are reminded not to take any food or drink outside during the lunch hour. It attracts bugs (wasps), creates litter and is a choking hazard.

PHYS ED ...

Intramurals: Gr. 3/4 and Gr. 5/6 co-ed Basketball will continue as in April, please see the calendar for dates. Grade 3/4's will be at lunch recess, in the gym. Gr. 5/6's will be at lunch recess outside. If games are unable to be played outside, one group will play at lunch recess for 30 minutes and the other group will play for a 15 minute recess. The next time they cannot play outside, the opposite will happen.

Students Unable to Participate in Phys. Ed. Classes: a note is required from home. If students are at school, they are expected to participate in all classes at school. Very briefly write down if they are sick or hurt, otherwise students may be marked as choosing not to participate. Thank you for your cooperation.

Footwear and Clothing: As the weather gets warmer, we will be outside for Phys. Ed. classes on some days. Students always need to wear runners for Phys. Ed. classes, as per Department of Education Safety Guidelines. Sandals, flip-flops or Crocs are not safe footwear. Students may want to bring a hat as well. Grades 4-6 students can wear the same leg-wear for Phys. Ed. classes as they wore to school (shorts, sweats, etc.) during May and June, as in September. A change of t-shirt and deodorant are always required. Running Club: Continues 3 days a week, please check the calendar for exact dates, usually Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. If there is no school on a Monday, we will run Tuesday. If there is no school on a Friday, we will run Thursday. Running Club is to prepare for 2K races (see below).

Beginning **Friday, May 10**, the Manitoba Marathon 10K runners will meet at 7:30 a.m., before regular Running Club, to prepare for their event. This once a week, long run training, will be only on Fridays (you will receive a separate training schedule for your child's event - for either the Manitoba Marathon 10K or the Super Run). Super Run runners should only have to meet at 7:30 a.m. on Fridays in June. Registration for Manitoba Marathon events will be online only and you will be given information on how to register, if you or your child are interested.

On **Wednesday, May 22** we will not meet at 8:00 a.m. but will be walking to a 2K Mini Fit Run race for only South End Schools (approximately 8-12 schools). It will be from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. On **Thursday, May 30** as well, we will be walking to a second Mini Fit Run at 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Similarly on the morning of **Wednesday, June 5**, we will be going to Assiniboine Park to participate in the WSD Fit Run. Our school will run on the Wednesday with half of the WSD elementary schools (25 approximately). There will be separate permission slips for each of these races and students will run against students in the same grade.
