## INTERNATIONAL COMMODORE'S MESSAGE

Dear IYforian friends,

As I cover and comment the three months of the 112 number of our Newsletter, I can only start by RC Marko Murn' report on the Balkans fleets. It includes the ones in Bulgaria, Slovenia, Croatia and Serbia.

This latter comes with the good news of a new fleet. The country has no sea and all the navigation is done on three rivers: The Danube, the Sava and the Tisa. They offer difficulties: Shallow waters, and change of river beds in some cases. Many in the new fleet sail too in neighboring countries, such as Croatia or Slovenia. Our IVC Bob Burns was there for the chartering.

The bad news is the terrible storm suffered in the north west of Italy, especially in the beautiful town of Portofino. Our PIC Sergio Santi was there and he recounts a description of the event.

He was also in Naples with Paolo Brambilla of the Italian NW. fleet. In his report, this latter tells us about Naples' SW fleet and its 20th year of existence.

FC Raphaela Stricker of Germany's South Fleet sends her report on how they support a sail training center.

Amaury Benedetti, of the Cartagena de Indias Fleet, enriches us with a report of the Colombian Navy School Ship and its 50 years of making friendships along Latin american ports.

RC Miriam Caudullo, of Latin America East, tells us about the Delta Fleet work in their Delta region area of influence, centered particularly on the Chagas sickness.

It is difficult to exagerate the importance of the scouts for the children involved to whom a new window in life is being opened: They learn discipline, without which nothing in life is possible to achieve, they stay out of drugs and out of a nemesis of today's young people who neither work nor study. The project in Ecuador goes even further: It transforms a town through the children. Close attention has been paid to the possibility of the Fellowship being responsible in case of accident and regarding this, we checked that possibility with our legal advisor in the Fellowship. Finally, about Area 3, we have a recount by PIC Jun Avecilla on how the Hong Kong fleet is preparing the next year's General Meeting -A3AGM 2019- for the first week of July.

Last but not least, the latest big news is the Northern Italian Lakes new fleet in Italy, the ninth in that country. It is scheduled for the 8th of next January. Congratulations for PIC Sergio Santi and RC Luigi Norsa!

## REPORT ON AREA 1 MEETING PORTSMOUTH

21-23 September 2018

The Area 1 Annual Meeting this year was held in Portsmouth, England, at the Royal Maritime Club, which was established in 1850. It is just across the road from the Royal Dockyard, which harbours Nelson's Flagship, HMS Victory, and was originally a Sailors' Home, which looked after sailors and marines between ships. It was given Royal Patronage in 1855 and still has the Prince of Wales as the current Patron.

The building was bombed and destroyed in the Second World War but was rebuilt and re-opened in 1952 and is once again currently undergoing refurbishment. It gained charitable status in 1883, which it still has, so all financial surpluses go to charitable activities.

The official IYFR meeting started on the 21st September, but some members arrived early, in order to participate in the sail over to Cowes for the annual lunch of the Rotary Club of Cowes at the Royal Yacht Squadron.

A small ferry was chartered to take us over and we berthed in the private harbour of the yacht club, which was very convenient and a real privilege. It was quite a breezy crossing, with most people taking refuge from the spray in the forward cabin of the boat!

We ate in the Terrace Building at the club, overlooking the Solent and were able to watch the various movements of ships and yachts beyond the terrace, as the sun actually came out. After the meal, a speaker enlightened us on the local 'Cowes Disability' group which enables disabled people to take to the water in sailing boats. All in all, a very enjoyable experience. Just to round it off, a lottery for £100 was one by one of our members!

Friday saw several people take the opportunity to visit the Southampton Boat Show, which is the biggest boat show in the UK. There was plenty on display, both in the form of boats and accessories. I'm afraid for some of us the cash tills were ringing, but at least nobody actually bought a new boat!

During the day our remaining participants arrived and we all met together in the evening for dinner in the hotel, where we were well entertained by the 'Shanty Men', a lively folk group who had us all joining in – a most enjoyable evening.

It was great to see that 9 of the 12 Regions in Area 1 were now represented at our meeting with members from a total of 12 Countries present.

We even had two members from Area 2, who were in Area 1 at the time and who kindly came along to join us.

Saturday, unfortunately the weather let us down and we all took a ferry, in mist and rain, for a tour of the harbour before heading over to Cowes for a traditional 'Fish and Chips' meal in the Island Yacht Club. We were able to walk around the narrow streets of Cowes and watch the procession of local organizations during the Isle of Wight Day carnival festivities. We all just felt very sorry for the participants, as they were totally soaked by the unrelenting rain.

Then it was back in time to change for the Business Meeting, which gave rise to some useful discussions and produced some new ideas to be tried out. It is hoped that a trial of IYFR flotilla sailing in the Adriatic can be arranged for next year, for those who do not like racing. I hope we demonstrated that Area 1 is still in good heart and is moving forward.

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### BALKANS FLEETS REPORT

**VARNA, FC Dimo Dimov short report:** The Bulgarians used to meet on their boats during sailings on Black Sea. They usually participated on the traditional Mangalia Regatta, which use to be Rotary charity regatta for last 6 years.

As it has become mostly regatta for sailing championship, there are more and more professional sailors. That is why this year, in between 20.-22. July, Rotary's side boats were just 2– one from IYFR Mangalia Squadron and another from IYFR Varna Fleet.





#### **SLOVENIA, PFC Matjaž Loborec report:**

The fleet has got 25-30 members. It is mostly active from October to May, during non-sailing season, as the

members are spread over the inland Rotary clubs. After the successful organization of practical sailing courses with North Adriatic Sailing School last year, in Spring the fleet came back to meetings with interesting guest speakers. They had two presentations with photos from Slovenian Circumnavigators: Srečko Pust sailed first around the World, when he had lost his first boat.



After then he bought another Sweden Yacht boat at Scandinavia and spent 4 years sailing far North of Norway. At a warm room we enjoyed observing his very nice, colourful photos from those cold seas in polar circle. Our second guests was a couple: Tone and Vesna Kosi.

They left Adriatic with their boat for 6 months and returned home only after 6 years circumnavigating around the World and visiting almost all Pacific archipelagos.

Spring finished in May with the tenth regatta Carniola, which was again fully sold out with 160 International Rotary participants. The regatta became so prestige that several international crews are on a waiting list to enter as future attendants.

In July Boris Ninić, marina manager and IYFR Croatia FC organized the meeting of two neighbors fleets with a delicious seafood dinner at marina Betina.

In September there was a Fleet Commodore change. Matjaž Loborec gave the chair to Johannes Krmc for the next two years. In October the representatives of IYFR Slovenia participated on Rotary regatta Zadar and supporting charter of new fleet IYFR Serbia.



**CROATIA, FC Boris Ninić** report: For time being the fleet downsized to 18 members. The fleet Bridge officers are businessmen in nautical industry, so they are very busy during their touristic season. FC Boris has participate in regattas"Latin Sail" ("Latinsko idro") at Jezera, Betina, Zlarin, Krapanj, Prvić and Murteru.



FS Gordan Borčilo has let within his charter fleet different activities to promote Rotary ideas and Nautic. So on the Nautic Fair at Biograd the IYFR Croatia fleet had their booth to promote our fellowship. They have organized the 21st traditional Rotary regatta Zadar at the end of September, where 9 boats with 50 participants enjoyed very changeable wind situation.

#### **BALKANS FLEETS REPORT**

The overall winners were Rotarians from RC Portorož, Slovenia on Bavaria-42 Match Race. These sailors have participated on all 21 regattas. The second team was ours - IYFR team on Solaris-53. This is the real fellowship crew of 6 sailors from 6 different Rotary clubs, from 3 different IYFR Fleets, from 3 countries Germany, Slovenia and Croatia.





SERBIA, Charter of a new IYFR fleet:

Nevertheless SERBIA is the country without sea, Milan Jovanović, the founding Fleet Commodore, has found 30 friends, Rotarians who love

sailing or cruising. Serbia has big rivers of Danube, Sava and Tisa, so part of the fleet are experienced river mariners. They have river cruisers and every year sail along the Danube down to Djerdap or up along Tisa to Szeged. Rivers are constantly changing riverbeds, strong current, shallow water or other obstacles may be find on their cruise. Quite a different situation than on open sea. The other part of the fleet consist on sailors who sail in Aegean, Ionian or Adriatic sea. What we can say is, that this crew gathered Serbian Rotarians from Rotary clubs spread all over the country, from Kikinda on the North to Leskovac on the South, from Šid on the West to Pirot on the East.



The charter took place at Novi Sad, the capital of Vojvodina region, where many nations have coexisted for centuries. Would you believe that within half a million population of the city you can find 42 nations.



Beside Serbian, which is the official language in the whole country, there are five other regional languages in official use: Hungarian, Romanian, Slovak, Rusyn, and Croatian. This gives us a feeling on how rich in nationalities is Serbia.

The solemn ceremony of the IYFR charter took place at a nice restaurant on the Fishermen Island (Ribarsko ostrvo). The ceremony was opened by Mrs.Ljiljana Lainović, the DGE of Serbia, giving the word to Robert Burns, Area-1 Commodore and Marko Murn, Regional Commodore, who together with Ann Lockhart led the official part of the program.

Beside a hundred of Rotarians from Serbia and Bulgaria we had IYFR guests from neighbor fleets of Slovenia, Hellenic North Aegean and Hellenic Aegean fleets. Unfortunately we missed the Croatian friends, who also announced their arrival, but should cancel it in last hours.



It was a great party with excellent music band Lucky Cash, experts on guitar, cimbal, violin and vocal. Freshly assigned Fleet Commodore, Milan showed his talent of singing with the band, while the Fleet Vice Commodore Dragan with his wife Vesna showed us local dances. Our Serbian friends organized a pleasant and dynamic program for all guests.

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## SCPC INCLUSION SAILING REGATTA AND SUMMER MEETING

When I was starting to think about the summer meeting organization 14 th- 16th September 2018, I wanted to combine it with a charity regatta. I was lucky to come across the Sailing Club Prien at Lake Chiemsee - SCPC in short.

SCPC is the only Paralympic Training Center in Germany which offers sailing courses for people with and without handicap who sail together national and international contests as far as the Paralympic Games. The handicapped sailors have been awarded with national and international prizes. The SCPC has the largest fleet of 2.4 and Sonar for handicapped sailors in Germany and literally live Inclusion Sailing.

Since the Paralympic Committee has suspended sailing sport from their program, the SCPC lacks 50 % of financial support through our government. By the end of this year the Paralympic Committee decides whether they will include the sailing sport again so that the earliest participation would be the Paralympic Games in 2024.





Therefore I have chosen to support this very unique club for the Fleet Germany South 2018 Summer Meeting. 25 Rotarians/Ifyorians took part. 20 of them raced together with handicapped sailors over the Lake Chiemsee in good winds. The first 3 prices went to a crew of handicapped and non-handicapped sailors.

We raised 2000 EUR that day and yesterday my Rotary Club Altötting-Burghausen donated another EUR 1000. Since Rotarians from 8 different Rotary Clubs took part I asked them to transport their experience with the SCPC, its highly engaged members and the unique atmosphere into their homeclubs in order to raise financial support for this training center. Hopefully other Rotary Clubs as well as other IYForian fleets join this great project.

This unique training center with its people truly deserve Rotarians/ IYForians support as they all live according to our Rotarian motto:

SERVICE ABOVE SELF

The Regatta was welcomed by RC Pančevo, host with a large number of Rotarians from about ten clubs, including the guests from Bosnia and Herzegovina and Slovenia

Socialization and dinner was organized in the beer hall"Đorđe Vajfer". An orchestra played during dinner contributing to the pleasant atmosphere.

A rich fish-based lunch, and later the dinner were organized by the hosts: Rot. Zoran Kuzmanovic and his wife Nataša,. At this occasion Zoran was talking about the sights of this city on the Danube.

After collective breakfast, on the third day of the Regatta we were sailing towards Dubovačka Ada (Miloš Gaj –"Raj" Beach). On the way downstream the Danube, the Regatta entered the Velika Morava River to support publicly the construction of the multi-purpose system "Danibe, Morava, Vardar, Aegean Sea".

The day was dedicated to swimming in warm and clean water from the nearby lake that had been formed by exploitation of coal and gravel.

On the fourth day the Regatta continued the trip to Veliko Gradište – Srebrno jezero (Silver Lake), sailing by Kostolac, the Mlava River confluence, Ada Žilovo, Zavojska Ada and Ada Čibuklija – all the way to Ram. – Sailing by Ada Čibuklija is always exciting as there is a danger of sudden wind, because the Danube is running there in the direction of "košava" (a cold, very squally southeastern wind found in Serbia and some nearby countries), and because there is a part of about ten kilometers in the open space, expose to winds without any shelter. We were lucky, there was no wind so that sailing was calm and pleasant.

In Ram, we were cordially welcomed by our host, Mr. Živorad Sekulić, a ferryman and owner of the restaurant on the bank of the Danube where we were all served a welcome drink.

It then followed a visit of Karavan saraj and of the Ram fortress, both currently undergoing a detailed reconstruction. The Ram fortress was built in 1483 by order of sultan Bayezid the Second. The reconstruction is financed and carried out by Turkey.

Each stone is manually cleaned from plants and sediments of earth and rinsed with water, and then built into by lime binding material used in the Middle Ages, which is still produced in Turkey only.

Up to now, EUR 1.2 million have been invested in the reconstruction. Construction of a big quay has also been planned. Cruisers will be able to come ashore and tourists will have an opportunity to see these historical monument.

After the visit paid to the fortress, the sailing continued beside the ferry crossing by which Ram on the right bank of the Danube connected with the Danube-Tizsa-Danube channel at Stara Palanka on the left bank and the confluence of the Nera River from which the left bank belongs to Romania and the right one to Serbia.

The next was a"free" day— there was no sailing. Some Regatta participants passed the day walking along the arranged bank of Srebrno jezero where pleasant cafes can be found. Other participants went sightseeing, while the children spent this day in the nearby Aqua park.

On the sixth day, the Regatta sailed to Golubac and Donji Milanovac (The Porečka River). The voyage plan was changed when the Regatta arrived at Golubac where it had been planned to land and take a visit to the local fortress. Unfortunately, it was not possible to land because of a cruiser berthed there when due to safety reason other vessels are not allowed to land. Nevertheless, we enjoyed the width of the Danube and the extraordinary sight of the Fortress down from the river level.

After Golubac, the Regatta entered the Golubac Canyon – entrance to the Djerdap Canyon (Iron Gate).

On the right-hand side the archeological site "Lepenski Vir" appeared, where the Regatta didn't stop, as there is no appropriate dock. The Regatta also passed by Donji Milanovac and in early afternoon hours sailed into the Porečka River where it stayed for two days.

The Porečka River is a small clear river that joins the Danube. However, after the construction of the Djerdap hydropower plant the water level raised so much that at the place where it joins the Danibe a big expanded surface of water was created – almost a lake. The Porečka River is only two kilometers far downstream from Donji Milanovac (taxi takes you there for 200 dinars only), but is fully sheltered so that there is no fear of winds or waves created by big vessels

Collective dinner was organized at the national cuisine restaurant in Donji Milanovac.

The next day was dedicated to swimming, walking and purchasing in D. Milanovac. There were also preparations for the evening entertainment of the Regatta members. Meat, onion, potatoes, stew spices, plus fresh bread, tomatoes and cabbage for salads were bought.

Preparation of the stew started in early afternoon hours in the yard and under the porch of the weekend house of our host. Stew was prepared in a special tank with gas burner enclosed by inox cylinder on which the tank leans heavily so that it is very stable and can't be affected by the wind. Most of the Regatta participants were rotating in stirring the stew as it had not been envisaged to turn around on a tripod like in Pančevo.

On the eighth day we sailed further to the east, through the most attractive part of our navigation – the 35 km long Djerdap Canyon: from the Porečka River to final destination – Tekija. The Regatta passed by Veliko and Malo Golubinje, through Veliki and Mali Kazan, by"Hajdučka vodenica", all the way to Trajan Plaque.

The greatest measured depth in the Canyon was 85 meters, although some say that even 90 meters can be measured!

Arrival to final destination, Tekija, was about 15:00 h as scheduled.

The Regatta members were rather disappointed by what they saw upon coming: unattended, dirty marina covered by grass, which seemed absolutely abandoned. There is a dispute in terms of who owns this facility. This situation happens because of local inhabitants who berth their boats there without any obligation to clean anything. This persons don't care about clean rivers and nautical tourism in Serbia. The poor condition of the marina was decisive for changing the plan and going back to the Porečka River the next day instead of staying in Tekija for three days.

Luckily, our good mood was not spoiled by this disappointment. All credit goes to "Joca Krofna" ("Joca the Doughnut"), our attentive host and his family, who run a pleasant restaurant on the beach.

Participants of the two Regattas spent the evening together with the "Kod kapetana" tavern. Among about thirty members of the Regatta we met also Kole, captain of the 15 meters long boat "Milanani", which had also participated earlier for several years in our Regatta. ## HAVOC IN THE GULF RAPALLO OCTOBER 29 2018

Old people here say never in the last 70-80 years something like thishappened. In 2000, avery strong gale from South East caused the lost of a few yachts in the whole Tigullio, waves flooding the harbors after having overtaken the breakwaters. And that, I remember, seemed something very extraordinary; until Sunday night.

On October 29,we were in RED ALERT for heavy rain and a strong gale but nobody could think of such a raging intensity of the elements. In the afternoon the wind started blowing around 40 – 50 KTS, quite unusual in the beautiful Gulf where people cometo spend their winters attract by the particularly mild weather conditions. Until five days before it had been an exceptional Autumn, with late summer temperatures, calm seas and clear skies. Then, at the end, the real Autumn arrived with heavy rain and some strong raffles. Nothing though when compared with the rest of Italy that had to experience extended flooding and destroying gale force winds.

Two nights before Laura had prepared a wonderful risotto for our IYFORIAN friends Luigi Norsa, Nicola Manes and their wives Anna Rita and Gabriella, the dinner had been most pleasant and they had left our house by 01:30 AM. In spite of the weather alert, preparations were underway for the next long holydays. There was no sign of what would happen in less than 48 hours.

The weather started deteriorating in the afternoon, from my bridge I could see the waves building up in height but the breakwaters were still holding the impact. My old barometers showed a terribly severe low pressure that suggested nothing good could be expected. The wind kept blowing at 40 – 50 KTS and the seas rising.

Early in the night, both the wind and the waves reached the force and height of a severe gale. In the nearby Capo Noli the weather registered a height of 10 meters and the wind station 98 KTS. Unknown conditions in Italy.By 23:00, the havoc was completed: the waves, probably 8-9 meters high, hammered away 80% of the concrete walls of the breakwaters, poured into the harbor and 211 yachts out of 335





moored at that moment in the Carlo Riva Port, were torn off their moorings, crashed one into the other and sunk in the harbor. Some, lifted by the force of the seas, were crashed on top of the piers. The disaster was total: collisions, masts entangled, bumps against the docks caused the first sinkings of the yachts now whirl pooling in the basin.

Others were pushed out of the harbor only to sink outside in the gulf or to become beached wrecks over the famous Rapallo palm promenade. We could also find some jammed into the mouth of a small river near the sixteenth century Castle. The bridge of the Castle itself was blown away by the force of the waves. The bigger and mega yachts moored closer to the entrance, forced outside by the waves, went immediately aground or were beached over hills of rubble, debris, chunk of eradicated trees, plastic wrecks, life jackets, empty plastic bottles and crushed hulls. Needless to say tragady was total.

A real apocalypse was reported by the 20 Mariners and Captains trapped on the eastern pier after the collapse of the breakwater. They survived the elements rage after evacuating



their out of control yachts, because they tied themselves with ropes to the light poles of the pier. They were saved one by one, in severe hypothermia conditions, by the brave Crews of the local Coast Guard who, on their rubber dinghies, succeeded in doing this sort of miracle. If it weren't because of these young Officers and Sailors, we could now be counting casualties.



Ten days after the havoc the wrecks are in process of being removed; the sunk ones will be lift and remove. The harbor will be reconstruct but ... like rebuilding the picturesque road to Portofino, blown away the same night, it will take a long time. And winter is approaching.

IYFR ITALY is investigating, with the Coast Guard help, on how to support best those fishermen in need that have lost their only means of sustenance.









## GOOD NEWS FOR OUR FELLOWSHIP SEA SCOUTS



The Sea Scout Program that began four years ago, with the Chilean fleet Puerto Varas, has given many fruits. Today there are three Brigades: "Brigada Piloto Pardo" in Chile, "Brigade Almirante Germán Yepez" in Ecuador "Punta del Este Brigade "in Uruguay.

Since its creation, they have been present as exhibitors at three Rotary World Conventions: Sao Paulo Brazil 2015, Korea Seoul 2016, and Atlanta 2017. They have also had an outstanding participation, in the AGM of Punta del Este 2017, and the Chile Patagonia 2018 AGM. On top of this, they have been awarded with scholarships to participate in three Tall Ships International Regattas, first in the "Regatta Ireland Norway Denmark 2015", as crew aboard the great Tall ship "Alexander Von Humboldt" in Germany, and in 2016, they embarked the "Christian Radich" Norwegian School Ship, to participate in the Belgium-Cádiz Regatta, and the Canada 2017 Regatta on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the founding of Canada, again on board of the "Alexander Von Humboldt".

In March 2018, the first international cruise of Scout Brigades in Chilean Patagonia was carried out aboard two vessels, the sailboat Punta Sur a Beneteau 53.7 feet , and in the Long Range Motor Yacht "Terranova" of 65 feet. In that opportunity, the scouts performed all the tasks on board: sailor watch, helmsmen, radio operators, navigators and captain, beside the basic tasks of cooking and cleaning on board.





#### GOOD NEWS OUR FELLOWSHIP SEA SCOUTS

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In Ecuador the first Marine Scout Brigades International Camp was held in july 2018 at San Francisco del Cabo, with the assistance of scouts from Chile and Ecuador, where the first Inclusive South America Sailing School was created, working with Optimist sailboats, for teaching the sailing discipline to vulnerable children.

The Sea Scout program has been part of a larger project in Ecuador, where the whole community, parents, and authorities work together to develop an important program: "Transform a Town through children ", project that has begun with the aim of transforming San Francisco del Cabo town completely. A town which was totally fotgotten ans far away from civilization.

During these 4 years of existence, the Sea Scouts have gained the affection of our fellowship members, especially the authorities of the International Bridge. One of the concerns they were worried about was the use of our Fellowshiplogo in Scouts uniforms, as a sponsoring institution, a situation that was resolved and authorized by the Rotary International authorities, specifically by the International Fellowships Coordinator.

The nautical activity, like any other sport or outdoor activity, is not exempt from possible accidents that may occur. A document was drawn up that conceives safeguards to avoid undue responsibilities, in case of the occurrence of these.

The legal advisor of our Fellowship in England, thanks to the valuable management of our International Commodore Guillermo Arteta, has reviewed this document, and has endorsed it, preparing a report which recognizes as valid and adequate.

So it should not be surprising that in the short term, the Sea Scout program is officially recognized as the service program of our fellowship. On top all this, we add the enthusiasm of our Past International Commodore Jun Avecilla, who is working in the Philippines to create the first Sea Scout Brigade in the country, and the Fleet of Catania, squadron Sicily - Malta, which has begun to form a new brigade, in addition to the work they are already doing for the same purposes in the Haifa Israel Fleet.

These places were visited by Walter Eaglehurst from the Sea Scouts of Chile, and Marcelo Arteaga from the Sea Scouts of Ecuador, to promote the beautiful program that seeks to

train healthy children and young people, with the high values of Rotary spirit service, through the teaching of sailing.

Delta Fleet, beginning the year 2018/2019, has carried out three service projects for the community.

**CHAGAS-MAZA.** Carried out together with San Fernando's Rotary Club; a blood donation campaign took place with Sarmiento Hematological Foundation support. Approximately 40 blood donors volunteers participated in one morning. The task carried out by the Delta Fleet during this event consisted on distributing brochures with Chagas Maza disease information. This activity has been carried out together with Rio de la Plata Fleet since 2017/2018.

**REGATTA "FRAGATA LIBERTAD" PRIZE.** The second project, which started during the previous period, was the the first place award. The prize was given to the winners in general classification at Regatta "Fragata Libertad". This project was supported by the Las Barrancas Yacht and Fishing Club.

**FIRST AID AND CPR IN ISLANDS.** Also concreted during the previous period, this third project was carried out together with instructors of the Argentine Red Cross, San Fernando branch, and consisted on a first aid course in Kindergarten 912 and Secondary School Number 25 located in the Arroyo Durazno and Canal La Serna, Second Section of islands of the

Paraná Delta, San Fernando. The course was aimed for parents, teachers, staff, and crew of passenger boats which transport students ,school staff, and students in the last year of high school. It was a day of intense training where participants could learn basic first aid regarding situations such as injuries, burns and, fundamentally, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) maneuvers. While the course was being develop, the children of Kindergarten 912 painted our Fellowship pennant.





The shipment to Subic Bay of the FF15s was funded by an IYFR grant given to the Subic Bay and Cubao West Fleets.
