On Saturday, March 23, 2019 we hosted the first #CAP (College Admissions Process) College Readiness Boot camp. There were seven parents, 18 sorors and 12 students in attendance from the greater Toledo area representing local high schools including Toledo Public, Springfield Local, Toledo School for the Arts and Notre Dame Academy.

The purpose of the boot camp was to help students unpack the intricate process of preparing for an applying to college. With so many layers, the college admissions process can be extremely overwhelming for both students and their parents.

Committee members did an outstanding job as they conducted ice breakers and min-workshop sessions, engaging students in thought around preparing, applying, testing and essay writing for college admissions and scholarships. Soror Chelsea Hodge represented the Alpha Lambda chapter, sharing her insights on the college experience and being punctual in document and assignment completion. Students received the official *Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated #CAP Toolkit*, an interactive resource guide that includes monthly calendars, information and checklists for high school juniors and seniors. The Toolkit also included a list of HBCUs by state. Additional handouts were also shared with the students and included in their folders for current and future reference.

Sorors and guests in attendance completed event evaluations citing how they enjoyed the workshop and thought it was very helpful. Evaluation feedback will be used to plan and execute the next #CAP session in April. We are looking forward to working with this great group of students and encourage you to share future session dates so we may continue to *exemplify excellence through sustainable service*, planning meaningful and impactful sessions throughout the program year.

Greetings Sorors,

With the GLRC approaching, the protocol points for April notes Protocol for Members at Regional Events. Sorors are expected to:

- ◆ Wear appropriate Alpha Kappa Alpha business attire (not business casual) unless otherwise noted.
- ◆ Wear comfortable shoes to business meetings; flip flops, house slippers, and sneakers are not appropriate unless medically designated by a physician.
- ◆ Make arrangements for child care and guests when attending business meetings as these meetings are for sorors only.
- ◆ Refrain from walking during introduction of dais guests and program participants, the meditation or while the Supreme Basileus or Regional Director is giving her address to the delegation.
- ◆ Respect designated seating sections. Special seating will be available for Former Directorate Members, Former Executive Directors, Diamond and Golden sorors, physically challenged sorors, musicians, and Very Special Guests (VSG) not seated on the dais and delegates.
- ◆ Silence all electronic communication devices.
- ◆ Wear delegate identification and arrive early for proper seating.
- ◆ Stand when Former Supreme Basilei and the Supreme Basileus enter the room and when they are introduced. Stand for the Regional Director at any event in her region.
- ◆ Speak after being recognized by the presiding officer. Address the presiding officer as “Madam Supreme Basileus,” or “Madam Regional Director.”
- ◆ Address the delegation by clearly stating your name, chapter, chapter location, and whether you are a delegate or non-delegate.
- ◆ Select a table hostess at meal functions who will help keep to a minimum while speakers and performers are at the microphone.
- ◆ Do not hold seats. Seating will be available for all sorors on a first come, first served basis. **Holding seats at any function is unacceptable.** Philacters and hostesses will assist in locating available seating. *Please honor reserved seating.*
- ◆ Do not remove centerpieces or decorations from events.

These points are delineated in The Official Guide to Alpha Kappa Alpha Protocol-2nd Edition under Protocol for Members at Regional & International Events, Section 3, and page 12.

Connections-Ohio AKA Day at the Capitol

On Wednesday, March 20, 2019 Sorors Katina Johnson, Cheryl Phillips, Cheryl Wallace and Pamela Wilson attended the Great Lakes AKA Day at the Capitol (DAC) in Columbus, OH.

This year's theme:

“When Women Lead”. The purpose and goals of AKA DAC is to inspire and empower Sorors to further engage in the political process at all levels. To bring awareness to social and political issues and to collaborate on political action to prepare for the 2020 election.

Program Highlights:

Keynote Speaker Minority Whip for the State House of Representative Emilia S. Sykes, Ohio House District #34. Emilia, who 33 years of age, gave a passionate presentation on what it takes for women to be leaders. During our session she was appointed to the position of Majority Leader.

State Representative Janine R. Boyd Ohio House District #9 presented Aisha's Law. Aisha's Law (Aisha Fraser) is a law that would strength Domestic Violence Laws that would protect victims and their families. The law would guarantee harsher sentences for those convicted of Domestic Violence.

A letter was circulated and signed by the body. The letters will be presented to the Ohio General Assembly for consideration to change these laws. We also received purple ribbons that symbolized Domestic Violence.

An Empowerment Panel addressing Navigating Political Power with integrity.

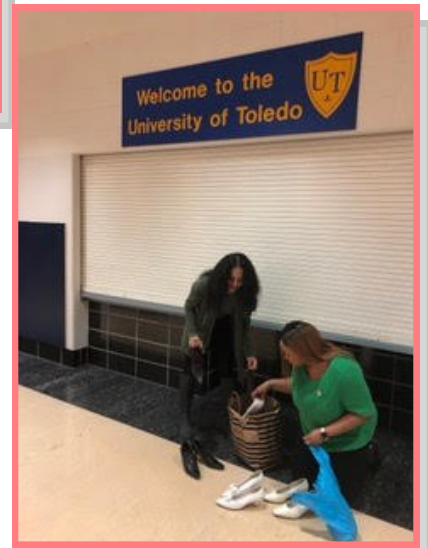

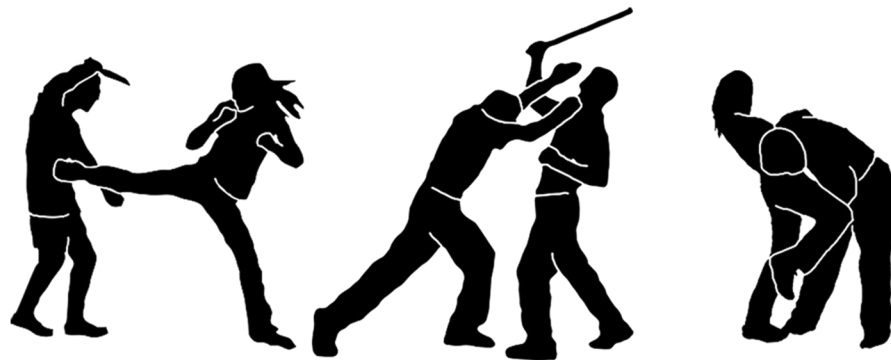
