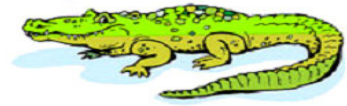

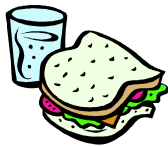

Grades 3-5 had some fun investigating careers based upon their interests. I hope your child shared the sheet on which they wrote down information on these with you, including relevant school subjects! Feel free to explore these Internet sites on your own at home. The Internet address is on the sheet the students completed in class. Fifth graders reviewed test taking strategies and also worked on time management. Did you see the schedule that they created? I have blank copies of this on my web page since schedules change often.

This month students in first grade will continue learning about their feelings. Second grade will explore individual diversity. Third and fourth graders will learn about test taking strategies (and de-stressors). Fifth graders will explore the middle school transition, including practice with combination locks!

I am continuing small counseling groups on various topics. These will run throughout the year in cycles of between four and seven meetings.

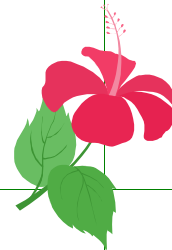
