## Climate

The main factors in Mexico's climate variation is that of its topography and of its position between the Pacific Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico. More than half of the country is mountainous. Mexico has pronounced wet and dry seasons. Most of the country experiences a rainy season from June to mid-October and significantly less rain during the remainder of the year. February and July generally are the driest and wettest months, respectively. The resort area's of the Yucatan Peninsula has a yearly median temperature between 24°C and 28°C. Temperatures here remain high throughout the year, with only a 5°C difference between winter and summer median temperatures.

# OXACA

# **PUEBLA**

In a broad, high valley about 60 miles southeast of Mexico City is a city known by many names over the years: City of Angels, City of Tiles or Heroic City of Zaragoza. Today we know it as simply Puebla. Established by the Spanish in 1531 on the main route between the port of Veracruz (the most important port in Mexico) and Mexico City, Puebla was the principal city of colonial Mexico. Puebla's appearance is the most European of all the colonial cities, because it was planned from the ground up by a Spanish city designer, rather than being built within an existing Indian community.

### Camino Real Puebla

With the magnificent historical centre of this colonial city as its backdrop, Camino Real Puebla is located on the premises of 16th century Convent of La Concepción that belonged to the wealthy order of the Conceptionist Clarists from 1593 till 1861.

# CHICHEN ITZA

### Day 8: Merida - Chichen Itza - Cancun

Today visit one of antiquity's most spectacular ceremonial centers, Chichen-Itzá, which reached the height of its splendor in the early VIIth century; you will admire the Temple of Kukulkan, the Red Jaguar Throne, the Temple of the Tigers, the Observatory and the Ball Game Court. 




