2022 POSTSEASON GAME NOTES

HOT TAKES:

- The HEAT entered the 2022 Playoffs with an all-time 138-111 (.554) postseason record, the third-highest in NBA history, behind only the Lakers (.599) and Celtics (.566).
- Miami clinched the #1 seed for the fourth time in team history (2022, 2013, 2005 & 1999).
- Miami recorded +160 points in their 11 playoff victories, averaging a +14.5 scoring margin in their wins.
- The HEAT's defense held teams to under 40 percent from three-point range, including under 50 percent from the field, in 15 of their 18 playoff games, while also holding teams to under 100 points eight times.

LAST TWO: Jimmy Butler finished with a combined 82 points in the final two games of the Eastern Conference Finals after scoring a game-high 47 points in Game Six at BOS on 5/27 and then a game-high 35 points in Game Seven vs. BOS on 5/29. His 82 points tie for the second-most combined points in a Game Six and Game Seven for any series in NBA postseason history. Below are the most in league history.

EASTERN CONFERENCE FINALS: Miami made their ninth Eastern Conference Finals appearance, having done so in 1997, 2005, 2006, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2020 and 2022. The nine appearances are the most in the Eastern Conference and tie for the second-most in the entire NBA since making their first in 1997. Additionally, the HEAT won six-straight Conference Finals appearances from 2006-2020, tying the fourth-longest such streak in NBA history. SPOELSTRA IN THE CONFERENCE FINALS: Head Coach Erik Spoelstra made his sixth Conference Finals appearance, tying for the most in the NBA since he became head coach. Spoelstra is now 5-1 (.833) in Conference Finals series, tying the third-best winning percentage in Conference Finals history (minimum five series). Additionally, he has recorded 23 Conference Finals wins, the fifth-most in NBA history. Below are the highest winning percentages and the most wins by any head coach in Conference Finals history.

AMONG THE BEST: HEAT Head Coach Erik Spoelstra has recorded a 96-65 (.596) career playoff record, the six-highest winning percentage in NBA postseason history. He has recorded the most postseason wins and has the second-most postseason series wins in the NBA since taking over the reigns as Miami's head coach in 2008-09. Below are the highest postseason winning percentages in NBA history (min. 100 games) as well as the most playoff wins and the most playoff series wins in the league since Spoelstra became head coach.

COACH SPO: Erik Spoelstra has recorded 756 career wins (660 regular season & 96 postseason) with the HEAT, the fourth-most by a head coach with a single franchise in NBA history. Next on the list is Red Auerbach (Celtics) with 885, followed by Jerry Sloan (Jazz) and Gregg Popovich (Spurs). Additionally, Spoelstra has coached over 1,000 career regular season games, becoming just the third coach in NBA history to coach 1,000+ games with only one franchise for his entire career, joining Gregg Popovich (Spurs) and Al Attles (Warriors).

ALL-TIME SERIES RECORDS: The HEAT have won 30 playoff series in postseason history, recording a .600 winning percentage (30-20), the fourth-highest winning percentage in NBA history. Below are the top playoff series winning percentages among active franchises in league history.

SELLING OUT: Miami has currently sold out 502-straight overall games, which includes both the regular season and playoffs, the fifth-longest sellout streak in NBA history. Additionally, 280 of those 502 overall sellouts have been at over capacity, where fans have purchased Standing Room Only tickets in the Upper 400 Level platforms. 40 IN POSTSEASON: Jimmy Butler scored 47 points at BOS on 5/27, marking his fourth 40-point playoff game this postseason, becoming the first HEAT player in playoff history to record at least four 40-point games in a single postseason. Additionally, Butler recorded two 40-point, four-steal games against Boston in the East Finals to become just the second player in NBA postseason history to record multiple games of at least 40 points and four steals in a single series, joining only Michael Jordan who accomplished the feat in the 1988 First Round series against Cleveland.

20-POINT LEADS: Miami and Boston alternated 20+ point leads in the first four games of the Eastern Conference Finals after the HEAT led by 20 in Game One, the Celtics lead by 34 in Game Two, Miami led by 26 in Game Three and Boston led by 32 in Game Four. It marks as the first time in the last 25 years (since play-by-plays were recorded in 1997-98) that teams have alternated 20+ point leads in the first four games of a playoff series. Boston also held a 23-point lead in Game Five. Additionally, it has only happened twice before in which teams have each held at least a 20-point lead once in the first four games of a series, in the 1999 Detroit-Atlanta First Round and in the 2014 Oklahoma City-San Antonio Western Conference Finals.

FROM DOWN 2-3: After dropping Game Seven of the Eastern Conference Finals, Miami's record when attempting to come back from a 2-3 series deficit fell to 4-6 (.400), which is still the highest winning percentage in NBA postseason history when facing a 2-3 series deficit. BAM BAM: Bam Adebayo posted a 31-point, 10-rebound double-double in Game Three of the Eastern Conference Finals at BOS on 5/21, while also recording six assists, four steals and a block to become the only center in NBA postseason history to record at least those minimums in each category (since steals and blocks were recorded in 1973-74). Additionally, he is just the fourth starting center in playoff history to lead his team in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks, joining Hakeem Olajuwon (three times), Dikembe Mutombo (1994) and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1977).

POSTSEASON RANKINGS: Jimmy Butler scored 47 points at BOS on 5/27. He has now recorded six 40-point playoff games as a member of the HEAT, the second-most in franchise history, while also posting 12 30-point playoff games, the third-most in team history. Additionally, Butler has posted three postseason triple-doubles with Miami, joining only LeBron James to do so in HEAT history. THIEVES IN THE NIGHT: The HEAT recorded a postseason franchise-best 19 steals at BOS on 5/21 in Game Three of the Eastern Conference Finals. The 19 steals also tie for the fifth-most in NBA postseason history as only four teams have recorded more, including 22 by GS on 4/14/75, 20 by MIL on 4/25/15, 20 by PHI on 5/13/99 and 20 by GS on 5/2/76. BLOCKS AND STEALS: Miami blocked a postseason franchise-tying 12 shots and recorded 10 steals vs. BOS in Game One of the Eastern Conference Finals on 5/17. It marks as just the second time in HEAT postseason history Miami has posted double figures in both blocks and steals in a playoff game, with the only other occurrence in an overtime contest on 5/24/11 vs. CHI. Additionally, Bam Adebayo rejected a playoff career-high four shots, while Gabe Vincent and Jimmy Butler each registered postseason career highs with three blocks apiece.

JIMMY FACING ELIMINATION: Jimmy Butler scored a playoff career-high 47 points in Game Six of the Eastern Conference Finals in Boston on 5/27, tying for the eighth-most points in an elimination game in NBA postseason history. His 47 points were the third-highest total in a playoff win in Boston, behind only Elgin Baylor's 61 and Wilt Chamberlain's 50. The 47 also tied the fourth-most in a road elimination game (including Jamal Murray's road game in the Disney bubble). In addition to his 47 points, Butler also recorded nine rebounds, eight assists and four steals, becoming the only player in NBA history to post at least each of those minimums in an elimination game. THIRD QUARTER: Miami outscored the Celtics by +25 points (39-14) in the third quarter of Game One of the Eastern Conference Finals on 5/17, tying for the second-largest scoring margin in a quarter in HEAT postseason history, as Jimmy Butler outscored Boston by himself, 17-to-14, in the quarter. Miami has currently posted an NBA postseason-best +93 scoring margin in the third quarter this postseason. Below are the highest quarter scoring margins in HEAT playoff history.

JIMMY BEING JIMMY: Jimmy Butler recorded 41 points, nine rebounds, five assists, four steals and three blocks vs. BOS in Game One of the Eastern Conference Finals on 5/17, becoming the first player in NBA postseason history to post at least those minimums (since steals and blocks became a stat in 1974). Additionally, he is now just the fifth player in NBA postseason history to record a 40-point game in the first three rounds of the playoffs, joining only Michael Jordan, LeBron James, Allen Iverson and James Harden.

JIMMY BUCKETS: Jimmy Butler scored 45 points vs. ATL on 4/19, without committing a single turnover, becoming just the fifth player in NBA postseason history to score at least 45 points without recording a turnover, joining Jamal Murray (8/23/20), Kevin Durant (5/4/19), Paul Pierce (5/3/02) and Dominique Wilkins (5/22/88). Additionally, Butler added five rebounds and five assists while not committing a foul to become the only player in NBA postseason history to record at least 45 points, five rebounds and five assists while not committing a single turnover or foul.

JIMMY DOING IT ALL: Jimmy Butler posted 36 points, 10 rebounds, four assists, four steals and a block without committing a single turnover in Game Four at ATL on 4/24, becoming the first player in NBA postseason history to record at least those totals without a turnover (since turnovers were recorded in 1977-78). Additionally, only one other player has accomplished that feat when including the regular season as well, Clyde Drexler on 2/24/85 after posting 37 points, 10 rebounds, nine assists, four steals and four blocks with no turnovers.

DOUBLE FIGURES: Seven Miami players scored in double-figures in Game Five vs. PHI on 5/10, including Jimmy Butler (23), Max Strus (19), Gabe Vincent (15), Victor Oladipo (13), Bam Adebayo (12), Tyler Herro (10) and P.J. Tucker (10), marking just the second time in HEAT postseason history at least seven players each scored in double digits. The only other occurrence came on 9/2/20 at MIL (Goran Dragić-23, Tyler Herro-17, Jae Crowder-16, Bam Adebayo-15, Jimmy Butler-13, Duncan Robinson-13 and Kelly Olynyk-11).

JIMMY SCORING AVERAGE: Jimmy Butler averaged a team-high 30.5 points against the Hawks in the First Round. His 30.5 scoring average was the fifth-highest during a single series in HEAT postseason history. Below are the highest such scoring averages.

25+ OFF THE BENCH: Tyler Herro scored a team-high 25 points, all off the bench, in Game One vs. PHI on 5/2 while also dishing out seven assists without committing a single turnover or foul to become the first player in NBA postseason history to record at least those numbers without a turnover or foul (since turnovers were a stat in 1977-78). Additionally, it marked his second 25+ point game off the bench during the postseason, becoming just the second player in team history to have multiple 25+ point games off the HEAT bench in the playoffs, joining only Dwyane Wade (also twice).

20-POINT WINS: The HEAT won three games by double-figures, including two 20-point wins, in their First Round series against Atlanta. First a 24-point, 115-91, win on 4/17, a 10-point, 115-105, win on 4/19 and another 24-point, 110-86, win on 4/24. The two 20+ point victories mark as just the fourth time in HEAT postseason history Miami has recorded two 20-point wins in the same series after also doing so against Atlanta in the 2009 First Round, against Chicago in the 2013 Semifinals, and against Charlotte in the 2016 First Round.

GAME ONE VS ATL: The HEAT recorded a, 115-91, win against the Hawks in Game One on 4/17. The 24-point win marks as the fourth-largest margin in a Game One in team history. The HEAT held the Hawks to just 91 points in the contest, marking the lowest opponent points against Miami in a Game One since they also held Charlotte to 91 points in Game One of their 2016 First Round series. Atlanta only made 11 field goals in the first half, tying the lowest by any HEAT opponent in postseason history. Additionally, on the offensive side, Miami dished out a franchise playoff record 35 assists, including a record 18 in the first half, while hitting 18 three-point field goals, tying the second-most in HEAT postseason history.

MAKING RUNS: Miami used a 21-0 run in the third quarter of Game Three against the Hawks to go from down five points (68-63) at the 7:53 mark to take a 16-point (84-68) lead with 2:48 remaining in the quarter, registering their longest run over the last 25 years. Additionally, in Game Five against Atlanta, Miami recorded a 17-0 run, marking their third-longest run. Below are the HEAT's longest such postseason scoring runs.

CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE: The HEAT were the only team this season whose roster had at least one player representing each of the past three consecutive NBA championships. P.J. Tucker won the title with the Milwaukee Bucks in 2021, Markieff Morris won the title with the Los Angeles Lakers in 2020 and Kyle Lowry won the title with the Toronto Raptors in 2019.

THE UNDRAFTED: Miami's postseason roster featured eight undrafted players, including Dedmon, Haslem, Highsmith, Martin, Robinson, Strus, Vincent and Yurtseven. The eight undrafted players were the most for any team entering the 2022 Playoffs and, with seven of them playing in a game this postseason (only Haslem did not), it tied as the most undrafted players to make an appearance for a team during a single postseason in the Modern Draft Era (since 1966).

POSTSEASON: The HEAT clinched their 23rd playoff berth in franchise history. It also marked their 11th in 14 seasons under Head Coach Erik Spoelstra, tying for the second-most in the NBA over that span (Boston-13, Portland-11 & San Antonio-11). Additionally, Miami has not missed the postseason in consecutive seasons under Head Coach Erik Spoelstra, the longest such active streak in the NBA, having last missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons back in 2001-02 & 2002-03.

ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland)

Regular Season Coaching Record: 660-453, completed 14th Regular Season

Postseason Coaching Record: 96-65, currently in 11th postseason appearance

Erik Spoelstra completed his 14th season as head coach of the HEAT and his 27th as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering 10 postseason appearances, seven division titles, five conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013.



In his previous 13 seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has already made his mark on the HEAT record book as the winningest coach in franchise history. Entering this season, he holds team records in wins, winning percentage and games coached. He has also been honored as the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month a franchise-record eight times. His 10 postseason appearances in his previous 13 seasons are the third-most over that span in the NBA as Spoelstra has never missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons since becoming head coach.

When Spoelstra first took over the head coaching duties in 2008, he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. He then recorded 43 wins in his first season, the most by a first year HEAT coach in team history, while on his way to a postseason berth. Miami became just the second team in NBA history to make the playoffs after winning 15-or-fewer games the previous season. The only other team to do so was the 1968-69 San Diego Rockets, in which HEAT President Pat Riley was a member of.

From 2010-14, Spoelstra took one of the most scrutinized teams and guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley. Spoelstra also joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting, a title he held during Miami's 2006 NBA Championship, before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. He and his wife, Nikki, who were married in the summer of 2016, reside in Coral Gables, with their sons Santiago and Dante.
