

The Whole Southeast Alaska Economy

In 2018, Southeast Alaska gained 380 year-round equivalent jobs and \$17 million in workforce earnings over 2017. Approximately a quarter (26.1%) of regional workers are non-residents.

Mining SWOT Analysis




Feb. 4th & May 13th SWOT analyses







Mining Strengths




Mining Weaknesses




