#### Rationale

- JJ-system data for 15-year olds (criminogenic similarity)
- 2.4 average complaints per juvenile
- Intake ratios, 6-hour intakes, 1800 caseload hours per counselor/yr
- % diverted by class, days on diversion supervision, 40 juveniles/Court Counselor diversion caseload, 19% diverted prior to court
- SPAC conviction information; Adult Community Supervision charges per youth; Level 1, 2, and 3 JJ disposition rates; 24 juveniles/Court Counselor supervision caseload

# Legislation Changes related to CP

- JCPC Membership:
  - Chief of Police designee
  - Correcting area mental health authority language with LME/MCO or designee
  - Changing the age of the two (2) youth participants from "up to 18 years of age" to "up to 21 years of age" and also allowing JCPC the opportunity to appoint a family advocate in one of the youth positions
- Allowing for blended funding through joint JCPC program development "between counties and judicial" districts.
- Allow for 2-year funding cycle for JCPC funded programs and JCPC -Endorsed Level II Disposition/ Alternative to Commitment (Intensive Intervention Services" Programs
- Merge Alternatives to Commitment funding and Level II funding under "Intensive Intervention Services" and remove funding caps



# **Detention Costs**

- 300 juvenile detention beds
- \$122 \* 300 beds = \$36,600/day
- = \$13,359,000 annual
- \$6 million repair & renovation

# Other Agency Needs



North Carolina Department of Public Safety

#### Office of Juvenile Defender (\$122,000 in FY 19-20)

These funds are recommended because the Office of Juvenile Defender is anticipating increased work in juvenile court with implementation of the Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act, and is requesting one additional assistant juvenile defender.



# **Administrative Office of the Courts**

- 5 district court judgeships, one each in districts:
- > 29A (McDowell and Rutherford counties)
- > 22A (Alexander and Iredell counties)
- 4 (Duplin, Jones, Onslow, and Sampson counties)
- 19A (Cabarrus county)
- 23 (Alleghany, Ashe, Wilkes, and Yadkin counties)

These districts are the five worst off from a workload to judge ratio. They currently have 73% - 86% of needed judgeships **before** the increased workload from raising the age.



#### **Administrative Office of the Courts**

- 8 assistant district attorneys, one each in districts:
- 11A (Harnett and Lee counties)
- 13 (Bladen, Brunswick, and Columbus counties)
- 9 (Franklin, Granville, Vance, and Warren counties)
- 18 (Guilford county)
- 25 (Burke, Caldwell, and Catawba counties)
- 11B (Johnston county)
- 7 (Edgecombe, Nash, and Wilson counties)
- 27A (Gaston county)

These districts are the eight worsts off from a workload to prosecutor ratio. They currently have 73% - 89% of needed prosecutors **before** the increased workload from raising the age.



# **Administrative Office of the Courts**

- 7 district attorney legal assistants and 6 deputy clerks
- The annualized total recurring cost for these positions is \$2,735,833; with a non-recurring cost of \$122,841.
