In my discussions with wolf trappers (using snares), it is common to capture non-target games species and species of concern (eagles being most common). I don't know how it will be possible to preserve many non-game species of concern (i.e. other predators attracted to baits - wolverines, fishers, lynx) while allowing unfettered wolf snaring. these two objective are in no way compatible. (Added later: Let the science guide the decision. The constituent's claims that they are ineffective and reduce target species captures suggest that non-target species are being captured. What are the non-target species and how many are being killed? What would the capture rate be if diverters were not being used? The decision should only be made after careful study of the effectiveness of diverters and the consequences of not using them. Don't let the trappers make the decision, its like letting the foxes guard the henhouse.)

In my experience with snaring. The breakaway devices are not reliable in opening to prevent dispatch of deer and antelope. A deer stop would do more to prevent them from being caught by a leg however. As for using a diverter system for deer or some call a jump stick. Most of the time deer will proceed by going under causing them to go through a snare because during the winter months they avoid using extra energy by jumping over the snare. These are my findings trapping coyotes.

Hello, I have trapped 26 wolves in the Lochsa drainage since the State's first trapping season. I have caught wolves in snares, but generally prefer not to use them, or only use them in extremely limited situations due to wintering deer. My observations and experience with diverters are consistent with what other trappers are seeing - that diverters are ineffective. Their intended use, developed in Alaska to minimize moose capture is not applicable here in Idaho. Deer and elk do not push thru brush, but instead lead with their head. The 9 or 11 gauge wire causes them to duck and stick their head inside the loop. Further, the diverters are counterproductive to the departments goals of reducing wolf numbers thru trapping. Diverters require additional set up time at each location to get properly positioned and need frequent readjustment due to the extra weight of the wire suspended over the target area. The extra time and/or trips to a snare location spreads unwanted scent and disturbance that would be otherwise unnecessary with a simple piece of 9 gauge support wire.

Deer will remain problematic and will continue to be caught unless a great deal of discretion is applied by trappers. Breakaway devices can help minimize mortality of incidentally captured elk. Minimum loop sizes should be designed to allow for leg caught animals to be freed, but still allow enough closure for effective dispatch of captured wolves. Suggest a 4 inch loop or similar as a minimum size, or do not specify a loop size at all. Please ensure that snare regulations do not affect snaring for other species, such as bobcats. Thank you for the opportunity to comment. The IDFG's willingness to reconsider the use of diverters based on actual user experiences is appreciated. --Mike

As an avid outdoorsman, the last thing I want to have to think about while hiking through some of Idaho's most serene and secluded landscapes is having my dog get stuck in one of these deleterious, indiscriminate traps. People shouldn't have to worry about these death traps laying in wait just to appease the special interests groups who benefit from having all native predators exterminated. I don't think snare traps should be allowed period. The risk of killing non-target species is far too high. If these traps are to be allowed to be placed on PUBLIC lands, it is imperative that they come equipped with as many safety features as possible to mitigate the substantial risk they pose to non-target species.

Not to mention these traps are one of the least humane ways to kill a wolf, or more likely any non-target species. An animal can be snared anywhere on its body, depending on the animal's movement and stance when it encounters a snare, and the snare height and diameter (which often changes because of weather and the locks' ability to freely slide, a function dependent on wind, snow, freezing, etc.).

Wolves tend to suffer more than other animals in snares because they have extremely well muscled necks and reinforced trachea. Snared wolves that are very lucky may only live for hours; the unlucky ones take days to die.

Forcing online commenters to answer the above comments is a violation of public participation provisions of the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act--nowhere does this act require certain comments, and certainly should not force the comments above.

The below comments are submitted by Friends of the Clearwater in response to docket number 13-0117-1901, IDFG's notice of intent to amend the rule gear requirements for trapping wolves with ground set snares.

Snares can capture other carnivores, including endangered species such as grizzly bears and lynx. IDFG has proposed an amendment that will increase the non-target species that trapping in Idaho could kill, and for that reason and because you have not adequately complied with the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act, we oppose any amendment to this rule. We appreciate your consideration of our comments.

Negotiated rulemaking is not feasible, and IDFG should either discontinue with this proposed amendment or, minimally, proceed to formal rulemaking correcting the deficiencies of this notice per the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act.

Your website misleads the public by what day the comments are due. While the official notice states June 27, 2019, the website, which is the first deadline that anybody commenting will see (and the only deadline if relying upon the website) states that comments are due today, the 26th. This misleads the public into thinking that there is one day less to comment, which is important because Idaho administrative comment procedures are already fairly short.

Your notice does not comply with the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act. These are the requirements for notice under the Idaho APA, Idaho Code section 67-5220(1):

The notice shall contain a brief, nontechnical statement of the subject matter to be addressed in the proposed rulemaking, and shall include the purpose of the rule, the statutory authority for the rulemaking, citation to a specific federal statute or regulation if that is the basis of authority or requirement for the rulemaking, and the principal issues involved. The notice shall also state that interested persons have the opportunity to participate with the agency in negotiated rulemaking as provided in this section and shall identify an individual to whom comments on the proposal may be sent.

This statutory provision provides a list of what an agency must include. While your notice independently lists the statutory authority for rulemaking, that interested persons have an opportunity to participate, and identifies how interested individuals may participate, the notice inadequately discusses the purpose for the rule and the principal issues involved. IDFG sparsely states, "Negotiated rulemaking will address modifying the combination of gear requirements (diverters, break-away devices, and cable stops) for trapping wolves with ground set snares, balancing effective wolf capture with prevention of non-target animal capture." Docket No. 13-0117-1901. There is nothing in the statutory provision above that allows the agency to so briefly disclose the purpose for the rule and the principal issues as to roll it into the one sentence used for the nontechnical statement. While there is a better description on your website, that is not the official notice. The purpose of the proposed rule seems to be in response to a petition for rulemaking. The principal issues seem to be that these diverters and break-away devices were put in place to prevent species, such as deer, elk, and moose from becoming inadvertently caught. Also, the notice does not disclose to the public if the snare doesn't have a stop device, which is that the snare will kill the animal if around the neck or trap the animal if it catches the limbs or antlers, which can result in animal mortality. For these reasons, the public notice provided is deficient under the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act. On the website, the agency seems to ask for a yes or no vote with almost no information about why these devices were initially put into place or why this proposed rule came about (i.e., the purpose for the rule). The agency asks for this vote with almost no information on the principal issues and without describing what happens when these devices are not in place. Minimally, IDFG should redo this notice and comment period if the agency thinks it worthwhile to continue with negotiated rulemaking.

Snaring wolves without diverters, stops, or breakaway devices for trapping wolves is contrary to the Idaho Code and contrary IDFG's reasons for having these currently in place. These devices are intended to prevent non-target species from being captured or killed, including elk, moose, and deer. If, as the petitioners have anecdotally claimed, these don't work, and the agency plans to reverse itself on the



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reasoning for requiring these in the first place, the agency needs to review and consider scientific evidence, including any testing that has already been conducted with these devices. If these devices don't work, then it stands to reason snaring should not be allowed, as it is already a danger to humans recreating on public lands as well as pets, such as dogs, both of which do venture off established trails.

Pursuant to Idaho Code section 36-103, Idaho has a wildlife policy to protect, preserve, and perpetuate wildlife. Under Idaho Code section 36-103(b), while the Commission may administer policy, it may not change that policy. By removing diverters, stops, or breakaway devices, the agency will be further endangering nontarget animals such as deer, elk, moose, and mountain lions as well as endangered species such as grizzly bears or lynx.

We appreciate the agency's consideration of our comments and look forward to notice of meetings for this rule and our other rights pursuant to 67-5220(3). We also request all information considered by IDFG in connection with this amendment under 67-5220(3), which we will expect at the upcoming meetings, should IDFG proceed with this rulemaking.

If diverters are a reasonable way to prevent bycatch of moose and still support reasonable amount of wolf harvest that we've seen to date, we should keep them, as well as the break away device and minimum stop. If part of the reason is to reduce the wolf population to address moose, elk, deer, it doesn't make sense to do something that kills more of the animals you want to protect.

If there's a change, at least keep the flexibility to restore the diverterrequirements if the snaring of moose and other big game increases without them, and require faster reporting of moose take--don't wait until the year-end trapper reports to find it out.

And the #3 question didn't let you skip it (I don't support removing the diverter requirement, so I should have had to answer it). So you might want to review those answers based on the answer #2.
