App Companion Lesson Plan

Money Adventure

Companion Worksheet for Grades 3–6



Purpose of Activity

This activity familiarizes students with Money Adventure's content. Students can complete this worksheet individually after reviewing the app's content, or use it for a scavenger hunt in the app.

Concepts taught: understanding important events in American history, recognizing American symbols, identifying design features of American paper money.

Recommended Activity Time: 30 minutes to one hour.

Materials Needed

- The Money Adventure app Apple or Android devices
- The Companion Worksheet
- downloaded onto the student's A pen or pencil, if the Companion Worksheet is printed out

Instructions

- To download the app onto your student's device, navigate to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and search for "Money Adventure."
- Download the app for free onto the device. 2 Note: internet connection is only required to download the app, not to use it.
- Open the app on the device. After taking the 3 necessary steps to agree to the Terms of Use, navigate to the "Explore Money" screen by swiping left or right. Select the "Explore Money" option.
- Instruct the student to go through the 4 introductory story, where they will meet Buck the Time-Traveling Dog. Buck serves as a guide for the student.

After the student reads the short story about 5 Buck, the app will ask for permission to use the device's camera. This portion of the app requires the camera to enable the augmented reality functionality.

- To complete the Companion Worksheet, the 6 student must use the right-hand rotating selector to select the \$1, "place" it in front of them, and then tap on the highlighted portions of the bill. Tapping on the bill will open up content relating to that part of the bill. For example, if the student taps on the Great Seal, a box will appear that explains the national seal.
- The student must complete this process for the 7 \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100 notes.



Instructions Continued

8 After interacting with the content on the backs of each of the seven denominations, the student will be prepared to answer the Companion Worksheet's review questions on American history and American symbolism. Once the student completes the Companion Worksheet, check their work with the Answer Key provided below.

Level of Learning

Level One: Complete the Companion Worksheet as a class, allowing students to help each other find the information in a "scavenger hunt" manner.

Level Two: Follow the activity steps as written above.

Level Three: Have students close the app before completing the Companion Worksheet, requiring them to demonstrate full comprehension and retention of the material.

Context Clues Vocabulary

For Grades 3–6



Purpose of Activity

This activity familiarizes students with potentially unfamiliar advanced social studies words in the *Money Adventure* mobile app. By reviewing and defining these words after working with the app, the students will have a better understanding of the content presented.

Students will also learn how to use pictures, text, and audio as context clues to help generate a definition for unfamiliar words. Note: The definitions that students create will only include the information provided in the *Money Adventure* app. You can expand the vocabulary definitions to match your curriculum as needed.

Concepts taught: understanding words, vocabulary, context clues, definitions

Recommended Activity Time: 30 minutes to one hour.

Materials Needed

- Context Clues Vocabulary worksheets
- The *Money Adventure* app downloaded onto the student's Apple or Android devices

Pencil or pen

Instructions

- Print out or provide a copy of the Context Clues Worksheet for each student.
- 2 To download the app onto your student's device, navigate to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and search for "*Money Adventure.*"
- 3 Download the app for free onto the device. Note: internet connection is only required to download the app, not to use it.
- Open the app on the device. After taking the necessary steps to agree to the Terms of Use, navigate to the "Explore Money" screen by swiping left or right. Select the "Explore Money" option.
- 5 Instruct the student to go through the introductory story, where they will meet Buck the Time-Traveling Dog. Buck serves as a guide for the student.
- 6 After the student reads the short story about Buck, the app will ask for permission to use the device's camera. This portion of the app requires the camera to enable the augmented reality functionality.



To complete the Context Clues Vocabulary Worksheet, the student must use the righthand rotating selector to select the \$1, "place" it in front of them, and then tap on the highlighted portions of the bill. Tapping on the bill will open up content relating to that part of the bill. For example, if the student taps on the Great Seal, a box will appear that explains the national seal. Note: The worksheet shows which words are associated with each denomination's content. 8 The student must complete this process for the \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100 notes.

9 As the student interacts with each bill, they will be prepared to form and write down that note's vocabulary definitions on the worksheet.

Once the student completes the worksheet, you can check their work with the Answer Key provided below.

Level of Learning

Level One: The students will receive worksheets with their names already on them. An adult or peer will help them navigate the mobile app and create a definition for each vocabulary word.

Level Two: Follow the activity as written above.

Level Three: Challenge the students to look at the content and find three additional words that can be defined by using the text, pictures, and other context clues provided. Ask them to write down the three new vocabulary words they found along with the definitions they created.

Positional Words Lesson Plan

Where Is It?

For Grades 1-2



Purpose of Activity

This activity reinforces the student's understanding of positional words by using the images on the backs of \$1, \$5, and \$10 bills. Interactive images for these bills are found in the Money Adventure mobile app. Words like inside, outside, above, under, and between are used in the worksheet.

This worksheet is easily expandable with any additional positional words included in your curriculum.

Concepts taught: positional words, basic geometry words, prepositions

Recommended Activity Time: 15 minutes.

Materials Needed

- The Money Adventure app downloaded onto the student's • Pencil or pen Apple or Android devices
- "Where Is It?" worksheets

Instructions

- Provide a copy of the "Where Is It?" Worksheet for each student.
- To download the app onto your student's device, navigate to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and search for "Money Adventure."

 - Open the app on the device. After taking the necessary steps to agree to the Terms of Use, navigate to the "Explore Money" screen by swiping left or right. Select the "Explore Money" option.

- Instruct the student to go through the 5 introductory story, where they will meet Buck the Time-Traveling Dog. Buck serves as a guide for the student.
- After the student reads the short story about 6 Buck, the app will ask for permission to use the device's camera. This portion of the app requires the camera to enable the augmented reality functionality.
- Instruct the students to use the right-hand 7 rotating selector to select the \$1 and "place" it in front of them.
- Instruct the students to complete the 8 worksheet's \$1 bill section questions by looking at the back of the note shown in the *Money* Adventure mobile app.

Level of Learning

Level One: The student will receive a worksheet with their name already on it and an adult or peer will help them navigate the app and read the worksheet aloud.

Level Two: Follow the activity as written above.

Level Three: Challenge the students to look at the \$20 bill in the app. Ask them to make up three sentences that include positional words about the items shown on the back of the \$20 bill.
