

The Morrow County 4-H Leaders Association has awarded Nancy Jepsen and Jan Coe (post-humously) the Morrow County 4-H Lifetime Achievement Award in honor of the generous time and talents given to the youth of Morrow County.

Both Jepsen and Coe were long time leaders and supporters of all things 4-H related for many years and the Association recognizes their efforts and work on behalf of the youth of our county.

Nancy Jepsen served as a cooking and sewing leader for many year in lone teaching youth how to shop for, plan and create masterpieces in the art of clothing and foods. All of her children also participated and excelled in 4-H activities.

Jan Coe was a leader in the Heppner area for equine and consumer arts. She shaped lives and future careers of many youth in our county. Like, Jepsen, her children all participated in 4-H through livestock and expressive arts.

Coe and Jepsen each had a gift for convincing others to go above and beyond as they themselves did to further education and positive youth development. "They are both the face of dedication," says Erin Heideman, Morrow County 4-H Educator. "These ladies are the epitome of the heart and soul of Morrow County 4-H and their service is exemplary."

4-H empowers youth to reach their full potential, working and learning in partnership with caring adults while participating in fun, hands-on learning activities. Financial Literacy Lessons!

"A penny saved is a penny earned" – says pretty much nobody, anymore. And while you may not miss that clichéd saying, it's a fact that, too often, children grow up without access to basic financial literacy education. Across the country, formal financial education in schools is scant to non-existent, which means it's up to parents and other care givers to teach kids the all-important life skills of financial literacy.



4-H is here to help. That's why we've collaborated with the financial services firm <u>TD Ameritrade</u> to create a new series of research-backed financial literacy activities that make it easy and fun for parents to educate their kids on the value of financial literacy, the hidden costs of credit, and other essential money smarts.

These activities are geared toward children from grades 5 to 10 to ensure we're reaching kids when they are old enough to understand money, but before they've likely started earning it and spending it for themselves. The goal? To give the next generation the tools they need to make smart financial decisions throughout their lives. Giving young people those tools will help ensure them develop a healthy relationship with money and finances rooted in practicality, and not in fear or impulse.

National 4-H Conference is an exciting opportunity for our 4-H members (15 – 19 years of age by September 1st, 2020)! 4-H National Conference is the pinnacle experience in 4-H Civic Engagement, providing the opportunity for young people to connect, learn, engage, lead and impact their communities, their nation and their world. Applications are now being accepted for 2021 National 4-H Conference which will be held April 10 – April 15, 2021. *Due to Covid 19 restrictions, the conference will be virtual but still based in the exciting Washington DC area!* This year's planning committee is promising an exciting experience and to preserve as much of the content and experiences of past National Conferences.

Due to the craziness of the committees timeline and planning, the application process and timeline will be a fast turnaround! Application deadline will be January 25, 2021. Delegates are selected based on application process and interest in civic engagement and citizenship.

2021 National 4-H Conference:

2021 National 4-H Conference will be a Virtual Meeting and the cost will be \$325.00 per YOUTH. Selected Oregon delegates will only be asked to pay a \$50 deposit for the conference. The remainder of the registration fee is paid with scholarship dollars. The meeting dates are April 10-15th, 2021. Round Tables of delegates will meet a few times in advance of the full conference opening on the 10th to work on their assigned topics. The Conference will consist of all the primary elements that are normally part of the experience. There will be speakers, workshops, youth voice opportunities, topic briefing development and presentation, interaction with Capitol Hill and USDA officials and fun mixers and recreation, all in a virtual platform that employs the best practices that we have learned thus far about working in this space (No, delegates will not be on ZOOM all day every day for six days!)
