

The format of the June 2018 exam was a 2-paper exam of 100 questions each.


Equal proportions of candidates were sitting in UK and international centres; there were more male than female candidates and more BAME than White candidates. Less than half of total candidates are UK trainees.




Candidate performance

Candidate numbers and pass rates for all groups are in line with the historical data.


The pass rate is higher in UK centres than in international centres. Female candidates are passing in a higher percent than male candidates, higher proportion of White candidates is passing than BAME candidates and UK trainees have a higher pass rate than those not training in the UK.



The mean of equated scores is highest for White candidates and lowest for BAME candidates.





Candidate scores distribution shows a large number of candidates scoring between 400 and 550 (mean=475.2, stdev=121.7, median=469, mode=475). The pass mark is established at **454**. In this examination the number of correct answers for a pass is **116** out of 199 scored questions.



Topic performance

Candidates overall and those training in the UK have the highest mean percent correct in Neurology and the lowest topic for all candidates was Psychiatry followed by Gastroenterology while for UK trainees the lowest topic was Nephrology followed by Gastroenterology.
